This extraordinary offer may suggest old stock, or reprints from old plates. But, no, this is a new revised edition, printed from entirely new electrotype plates, on excellent paper, and neatly and strongly bound in cloth boards.

HE author of this remarkable book was a clergyman, who, educated in the Jewish faith, was subsequently converted to Christianity. He has written a history of our Lord which so presents the laws, customs, habits, topography of places, and situation of temples and other historic buildings synchronous with His life on earth, that the reader is transported into that time, and feels that the Gospel presents a real historical scene. Accordingly, the reader will find in this work all of that learned and careful study and grouping of particulars which makes a rationalistic life of Jesus so interesting, and in some respects instructive, combined with that larger, loftier, and nobler comprehension of Jesus Christ which harmonizes, not only with that class of representations in the Gospels which are arbitrarily explained away and got rid of by the rationalist, but also with the effects in the world that have been produced by him.

FREDERIC ERNEST FLETCHER, B.A.

Frederic Ernest Fletcher was born at Brockville, Ont., October 17th, His mother was a devoted Christian, and sought to train her little family of three boys in the fear and love of God. At the age of thirteen Frederic Ernest entered upon a definite experience of personal salvation, and became a member of the Methodist Church. When twenty-six years of age he was received as a probationer for the ministry in our Church, and was ordained in June, 1893.

As a probationer, he labored in Muskoka, Cooksville and Maple, Ont., and, after ordination, at Fort Rouge and Virden, Manitoba. His life was characterized by great earnestness and devotedness as a Christian; his supreme aim in preaching was the leading of men and women to Christ, and his successful pastorate was crowned by his great care and sympathy for the poor, the sick and the children.

In May, 1896, he was married to Miss Emma Browne, daughter of

Rev. George Browne, Toronto.

On September 20th, 1896, Mr. Fletcher preached his last sermon at Virden, from the text "We all do fade as a leaf." The changing autumn may have suggested the text, yet it seemed prophetic of his own speedy decline.

He had been ill for over a year, though still at work when his Official Board, convinced that a rest was greatly needed, granted him two months' leave of absence. He was advised by his physician in Toronto not to resume work for a year. From this time he gradually sank, and passed away, February 27th, 1897. About an hour before his death he said to his wife, "I think I will go up now," and passed quietly to his heavenly home.

His remains were interred in the cemetery at Toronto.

REPORTS OF COMMITTEES AND STATEMENTS OF TREASURERS.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Report of the Board of the Superannuation Fund for the Year ending July 31st, 1896.

A reduction of 6 per cent. on all claims has been found necessary in view of the prospective deficiency growing out of the largely increased number of ministerial claimants.

Notwithstanding this, the balance against the Annual Fund at the beginning of the year has been increased from \$7,221.62 to \$11,930.

The receipts from Circuits are \$9,326.16 less, and from ministers \$10,979.35 more than last year.

Unforeseen expenditure over the estimates on claims, refunds, interest on last year's balance, and over-drafts of \$2,146, and shortage in estimated receipts of \$2,208, together amount to \$4,354.

The contributions to capital account this year amount to \$5,180.

W. S. GRIFFIN, Treasurer.

The Board regrets that notwithstanding an increase of \$2,535 in the annual income, and a discount of 6 per cent. in the payment of annuities, there is for the current year a deficit of \$4,709. This is partially accounted for by the large number of ministers and probationers (mostly probationers) who, on the 31st of July, had failed to pay their annual subscriptions. The Board looks to the Chairmen of Districts and to the Conference Treasurers to correct this growing neglect of Discipline.

The most serious feature in the Report is the abnormal increase in the number of ministerial claimants. In two years past the annuity claims have increased by \$10,000, and for the current year over \$4,000, rendering necessary a painful reduction of 10 per cent. in the payment of annuities.

The Board is helpless to control the number of ministers placed on the Fund, and appeals to the Annual Conferences to check the ruinous policy of receiving more probationers than are needed to fill vacancies by death and superannuation and the actual growth of our work, which policy inevitably throws many older men prematurely on the Fund.

The receipts from Districts during the year just closed are \$378.70; balance from last year, \$154.00; making a total of \$532.70. disbursed, \$351.70; leaving a balance in hand of \$181.00.

Last year's returns give the sum of \$79,075.90 as the amount assessable, thus requiring an assessment of four and a half mills on the dollar to secure the required amount of \$350.00 for the coming year.

Your Committee recommend that the collections for this fund be taken during the month of July, and paid to the Financial Secretaries at the Financial District Meetings, and by them forwarded promptly to the Conference Treasurer.

We recommend further that the Rev. Thos. Argue be reappointed Conference Treasurer for the Fund.

DR. WITHROW'S REPORT.

Dear Brethren,—As I cannot have the pleasure of personally visiting your Conference, I beg permission to write a few words concerning the Sunday School periodicals and Methodist Magazine and Review, which are committed to my care.

It is ground for congratulation, amid the keen competitions of foreign Sunday School periodicals and cheap magazines, that the year has been one of marked prosperity. The periodicals under my charge have reached during the year ending 31st of March, 1897, the very large circulation of 257,759, an increase for the year of 10,271. Our new primary paper has been a great success, and has evidently met a felt want. We hope to supply for next year a senior quarterly for the school and Home Department, which will complete our graded series of Sunday School periodicals.

The income of the Sunday School periodicals and *Magazine*, not counting advertisements, has reached the amount of \$66,326 during the year ending 31st of March, 1897, or an average of \$1,275 for every week in the year.

This success has been largely due to the patriotic character of these periodicals. To such sentiments the people of Canada warmly respond, and never more warmly than during this Jubilee year of her Majesty's reign. Our own periodicals, which are thoroughly instinct with loyalty to the doctrines of Methodism and institutions of our country, have largely superseded those foreign periodicals which are often opposed to both, and which have well been described as "the most powerful and insidious propaganda of anti-Canadian sentiment which could be conceived."

Although the Methodist Magazine and Review reports a decrease in circulation of 244, yet it had the previous year an increase of considerably over a hundred, so that its net decrease in two years is little over one hundred—a ground for congratulation in view of the stringency of the times and the keen competition with ten-cent monthlies. The Methodist Magazine and Review is now entering on its forty-sixth volume with a stronger programme and a larger and abler staff of writers of our own Church and country than it ever had before.

These figures mark the total of each issue, and when we sum up all the issues, weekly, fortnightly and monthly, the total of these papers issued from our presses amounts to 9,319,782 papers, an increase of 302,362.

First, take the first paper on the list, the Christian Guardian, the one really most important to be thought of and dealt with in our Conference thought and action. You will notice the decrease of 493. The fact is, that since the first year the paper was published at \$1.00, there has been a falling-off of 2,780, that is, 2,780 from the large number subscribed the first year of the dollar subscription price. Now, it is evident, very evident, that more aggressive measures must by taken by us to get our old and established Connexional Organ into the homes of our people. We have just touched the point when profit would come in (the profit this year is \$176.01). I mean that we have gone to the cost of type-setting, making the forms ready, etc., and we have just the number necessary

to cover the cost of production, and we are in a position to make additional copies a paying business. On an average, $7\frac{1}{4}$ additional subscriptions from each circuit would run us up to the figures that was promised, namely, 30,000. Our circuits number 1.177.

We have been blessed with prosperity in every other department of our building, more sales in books and stationery, more circulation in the total of our Sunday-school papers, more turn-over in our manufactory.

Our total turn-over for the year is over \$420,000.00. The net profit this year on our capital, after \$13,423.00 have been taken off for wear and tear of machinery, bad debts and depreciation of stock—I say, after this amount has been taken off, the net profit for the year is \$23,532.83, an increase over the past year of \$731.07.

This year we gave \$9,000 to the Superannuation Fund—an increase of \$1.500 over last year.

Our second series of debentures, amounting to over \$50,000, mature in a year from this time. We took \$8,000 from our profits this year, to add to the amount already invested to meet these debentures on maturity, and the \$8,000 added to the \$9,000 to the Superannuation Fund, leaves only \$6,000 as the balance of our profit this year for the getting (which will be needed) new machinery, and, it may be, for the extension of our press-room. We had to do it in one part last year, and may have to do it in another this year; and I am sure no business mind in this Conference will say that, considering these circumstances. we have been illiberal in giving \$9,000 to the Superannuation Fund of the Church. Only lift up the Guardian to the promised number of 30,000, and if the prosperity attending the other departments continues, next year's grant to the Superannuation Fund will be still larger.

Certainly it is very encouraging to know that, despite the hard times, the profits have been sufficient to ensure the largest grant ever made to the Superannuation Fund. We assure Dr. Briggs that this Conference is intensely loyal to the Book Room, and will heartily support our own literature and encourage our own work in preference to the production of any other agency.

most rank of educational buildings in this country. The dormitories for the use of the students have been fully occupied, and the convenience thereby afforded thoroughly appreciated.

The report of the Bursar, hereto appended, shows in the hearty support given the College by the Methodist people of the North-West their appreciation of its work. Both in the preparing of young men for the ministry and for graduation in Arts in the University of Manitoba, the College has continued to earn its appreciation and support. In this it has been encouraged by the fact that the funds necessary for its maintenance have been fully supplied by the Methodist people from year to year, so that it has never yet been necessary to carry forward a deficit. The Board is resolved, if possible, to adhere to this plan, by the strictest regard for economy, combined with the necessary efficiency, to keep it abreast of its sister colleges.

The report of the Faculty, also appended, is a gratifying record of the work done during the year. The number of students taking the different courses of study was the largest in the history of the College. Their record at the University examination is conclusive evidence of the zeal and ability of the College staff. The students of Wesley College at the late examinations carried off the Governor-General's silver and bronze medals, this being the first time in the history of the University that a like honor was gained by any college. In the distribution of other medals and scholarships, the students of Wesley took high standing, reflecting honor upon their own industry and the soundness of their teaching.

It is expected that, not later than next year, the Government of the Province will establish a department for the teaching of the natural sciences, thus relieving the colleges of the necessity of each keeping up this department of work. This course will be hailed as a movement in the right direction, and it may be anticipated that the University building proposed to be erected will ultimately give accommodation for instruction in other branches of the University course, common to all the colleges, and thus relieve them of a part of the burden of maintaining higher education, in which elsewhere the other Provincial Governments all share. When this arrangement is consummated, the federation of the colleges into the University of Manitoba will be upon a similar basis to that which has been found to work so successfully in the case of the University of Toronto.

REPORT OF THE FACULTY.

To the Board of Directors of Wesley College.

Gentlemen,—The ninth annual report of your Faculty hereby presented begs leave to call your attention to the close of a most prosperous and encouraging college year.

The attendance for the session has been the largest in the history of the College, even although no less a number than forty-four of those who

were with us last year did not return this year. These students, numbering 131 in all, were distributed as follows:

Three of our students taking the B.D. work are already graduates in Arts, while the remaining three have entered upon the course in accordance with the terms of the resolution governing the B.D. course, lately passed by your Board.

Of the students in Arts, seventy-eight presented themselves at the recent University examinations, some of the junior students, however, greatly against the wish of the members of the Faculty. In other respects, however, the results of the examinations were highly gratifying.

Mr. S. T. Robson succeeded in obtaining the bronze medal in the classical department; Miss Laura E. Sparling, the Governor-General's silver medal in the department of Modern Languages; Mr. A. A. Thompson, the bronze medal in the General Course; and Mr. L. J. Carter, the most highly prized medal in the gift of the University, viz., the Governor-General's bronze medal for the Latin, the Mathematics and the Chemistry of the previous year—subjects in which every student of the previous year comes into active competition.

In the list of scholarships the College has been even more successful. In the Junior B.A. year Mr. C. W. St. John obtained a scholarship of \$80 for Mathematics; Mr. E. H. Bennett, one of \$120 in the General Course; Miss K. J. Crawford, one of \$80, also in the General Course. In the Previous year, Mr. L. J. Carter standing first, receives a scholarship of \$90. Messrs. B. B. Halladay and W. A. Sipprell, who are tied for fourth place, receive each a scholarship of \$60. Mr. L. J. Carter obtains honorable mention, and Miss Minnabel A. Dowler, a scholarship of \$40 in English and History. Miss Helena Penner, a scholarship of \$40 in French and German. In the Preliminary year we have again been successful in obtaining first place, Mr. T. D. Brown receiving the scholarship of \$80 for the Latin and Mathematics of this year, as well as honorable mention in English and History. Both in the number of scholarships won and in the amount of money secured, "Wesley" leads all the colleges this year.

Thirteen from the Senior year proceeded to the degree of B.A., thus making up a handsome total of sixty-two graduates from our College—a showing which cannot but be highly satisfactory to the Methodist people of Manitoba, who have so nobly stood by this youngest of the colleges affiliated to the University.

RESOLUTION RE COMMITTEE OF CONFERENCE TO CONFER WITH WESLEY COLLEGE BOARD.

Moved by Rev. O. Darwin, seconded by Rev. J. W. Saunby, and Resolved,—That in the opinion of this Conference it would greatly assist in maintaining the interest of Wesley College amongst our people and raising the amounts necessary for its efficient maintenance, to have a committee appointed consisting of an equal number of members of Conference and members of Wesley College Board, for the purpose of considering all items of expenditure connected with the College and making estimates necessary to carry on the work of the College each year. Following committee were appointed by the Nominating Committee: College Board—Rev. Thomas Argue, Prof. Stewart, A. Monkman, Dr. Sparling, W. A. Prest; Conference—W. Bridgman, F. B. Stacey, B.A., O. Darwin, J. J. Ring, Geo. H. Rogers; and reported as follows:

1. Your Committee would recommend that the item of light, as read by Dr. Sparling in his report, be paid out of the rent received from rooms.

2. Your Committee would also recommend that, whereas there is a deficit of \$500 in the amount required to meet the total expenditure in connection with Wesley College, and whereas, Dr. Sparling has consented to become responsible for \$250 from Winnipeg District, providing the Conference will raise the remaining amount of \$250; therefore we would urge the Conference to suggest some means to raise this amount.

3. We would recommend that in the opinion of this Committee the salary of Prof. Stewart be raised to \$1,700 per annum, and that the College Board be requested to place said amount in the estimates of this year.

4. We would further recommend that the estimates, as read by Dr. Sparling, with the addition of \$300 for salaries, be the estimates of the year.

All of which is respectfully submitted.

The ordinary Conference schedules giving these results in detail have been filled up by your Committee.

Your Committee further recommend:

- 1. That Secretaries be instructed by the chairmen to see that last year's report of membership be adhered to in every case.
- 2. That care be taken in all rearrangements of circuit, mission, and district boundaries to apportion all members reported the previous year; and that the chairmen and financial secretaries of the districts concerned be responsible for having this done not later than the financial district meeting.
- 3. That wherever a circuit or mission has been divided between neighboring circuits or missions, the district secretaries be instructed to retain its name on their schedules at the close of the year so as to show where the members have gone to.
- 4. That wherever a field has been filled by supplies during the year, the amount paid by the field for such supplies must be deducted from the total amount received on the district for ministerial support before the average is struck for salaries of ministers and probationers.
- 5. That in the opinion of this Committee considerable difficulty has arisen from the work of inexperienced district secretaries, and your Committee think that it would be well if some plan were devised whereby capable secretaries should be continued in office.
- 6. Your Committee recommend that entries of cents be omitted in Schedule D, except in the grand total column; that fifty cents and upwards be entered as one dollar, less than fifty cents rejected.

The Annual Conference of last year recommended a Conference organization representing the Epworth League work, and appointed a committee to effect such an organization. The following is the report submitted by that committee:

To the Manitoba and North-West Methodist Conference.

Your Committee beg to report that a meeting was called, at which it was decided to form an organization known as the "Epworth League Union of the Manitoba and North-West Methodist Conference," and nomination papers were accordingly sent to the different Leagues throughout the Conference, which resulted in the election of the following officers: President, Rev. J. H. Riddell; 1st Vice President, S. E. Clement, Brandon; 2nd Vice-President, Alex. Mills, Winnipeg; 3rd Vice-President, W. P. Argue, Portage la Prairie; 4th Vice-President, Mrs. Lane, Winnipeg; Secretary, H. J. Hardie, Winnipeg; Treasurer, W. T. Shipley, Stonewall.

Your Committee are making every effort to get all the Leagues and Methodist young people's societies in the Conference interested in the Union. Taking advantage of the large numbers of Methodist young people that would be present at the provincial convention of the Christian Endeavor movement, our Executive issued a circular for a meeting in Winnipeg during the time of the Christian Endeavor gathering. The session was convened in the parlors on the upper flat of Grace Church, Rev. Prof. Riddell, President, in the chair, and there was a good attendance, representative of all parts of the province. The first question discussed was the sending of a delegate to the International Convention of Epworth Leagues, to be held in Toronto on July 15-18, and it was decided to be represented, Rev. Prof. Riddell being selected as the delegate from Manitoba.

The matter of sending out and supporting a missionary in some foreign field was earnestly discussed, and the speeches indicated the interest of all in the missionary work of the Methodist Church. In the circular issued, Leagues were requested that if delegates would not be in attendance, to reply by letter as to what amount they would be willing to contribute annually, for seven years, to the support of such missionary. Recognizing the necessity of thoroughly training our children in scriptural truth and Christian work, we strongly urge the organization of junior Leagues in connection with all our senior societies.

1. We notice a decrease in the number of those learning catechism of 161, and also that there was a decrease last year of 22 in this column. This decrease is largely to be accounted for in the fact that many schools are waiting for the new edition of the catechism. As this edition is expected to be issued in the near future, your Committee would urge strongly that the use of it be enforced as far as possible in the schools.

2. As the schedules only show 471 members in catechumen classes—a decrease of 265-your Committee regret the apparent neglect by the brethren in general of the disciplinary requirement. (Paragraph 78.) We believe our children and our Church have suffered a great loss thereby, and we most strongly recommend that more attention be paid to this

important work.

3. Whereas there is a want of uniformity in the admittance of baptized children into our church membership, your Committee would recommend that, as soon as the pastor of the circuit is convinced that the solemn admonition of Paragraph 75 of Discipline has been complied with, the names of such children be placed upon the roll of membership, but not included in the column headed "Total membership of the Church," until they express a "desire to flee from the wrath to come and be saved from their sins."

4. Inasmuch as in many services there is but little that is of special interest to the children, we would recommend that in addition to the usual quarterly service, when practicable, a five-minute object sermon be

5. The attention of your Committee having been drawn to the fact that many of our schools are not working along temperance lines, we would strongly urge that the temperance lesson provided each quarter be taken up, and also that special efforts be made to induce every scholar to sign the pledge-roll.

6. That in view of the fact that impure literature frequently creeps into the hands of our scholars, and that the reading of such is detrimental to the moral and religious life of the readers, therefore we strongly recommend that teachers and parents exercise unceasing vigilance in the supervision of the reading matter of those under their influence.

7. We recommend that this report be read in our schools.

(b) The examinations shall be conducted in each district where there are candidates, under the supervision of the Chairman of the District, and shall be held on April 20th, 21st and 22nd.

(c) Time shall be considered an element in the examinations, and in all cases shall be strictly adhered to. Each examiner shall specify the time allowed for writing the paper set by him. Each paper shall be valued at

one hundred marks.

(d) A time-table shall be prepared and the examination conducted according thereto, and each probationer must complete the course of any one year before presenting himself for examination upon the subjects of the following year.

(e) Subjects which are set for one year and which are reviewed on a subsequent year's course, cannot, under any circumstances, be taken at

one year's examination.

 (\check{f}) Certificates issued by any Board of Examiners of the Methodist

Church subsequent to 1894 will be accepted by this Board.

3. Candidates who purpose writing upon the preliminary course shall notify the Chairman of the District upon which they reside not later than February 15th, and shall specify the subjects upon which they desire an examination, and this information shall be immediately forwarded to the Secretary of the Board.

4. Supplemental Examinations:

(a) Supplemental examinations will be held on the first and second days of October, in Wesley College, and at such other places as may be deemed necessary by the Chairmen of Districts concerned.

(b) Applications for supplemental examinations must be accompanied by a fee of fifty cents for each paper required, and such application must be made to the Secretary of the Board not later than August 20th.

Note.—Every subject upon which a man has failed to pass in its own specified year shall be considered a supplemental paper.

REPORT OF TEMPERANCE COMMITTEE.

Your Committee beg to report as follows:

1. That we desire to reiterate and emphasize the position already affirmed by the General Conference, that "the traffic in intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes cannot be licensed without sin," and we earnestly point out to all of our members and adherents the logical conclusion from the above premise, "No man can sign a petition for license without sin"; and as no government has the right to legalize sin, the legal status of the liquor traffic should be at once withdrawn, i.e., it should be forthwith prohibited.

[1897]

2. We reaffirm the recommendation of last year, that this Conference urge upon the local government, and that of the North-West Territory, the importance of stopping to the full limit of their constitutional powers the sale of intoxicating liquors for beverage purposes.

3. Communications having been placed in our hands from several

Districts, re the taking of a Dominion plebiscite, we recommend:

That inasmuch as the addition of any question or questions to the simple one of "Prohibition" is necessarily confusing to the mind of the electorate and will tend to prevent the free expression of public opinion; and inasmuch as it is the duty of the House of Commons to settle the details of ways and means for providing the necessary revenue for the country; and

Whereas, Premier Laurier did pledge himself to the London Methodist Conference, held at Stratford, Ontario, June, 1896, that the question would be submitted to the electorate of Canada entirely apart from all

other questions,

This Conference respectfully demands that the Government fulfil its pledges to submit the simple question to the electorate, apart from every other question or issue, and that it be submitted at the earliest possible moment.

4. That again we call attention to the simple and well-known law of political and constitutional procedure, that before political reforms can be secured candidates for parliamentary honors do, and in the nature of things must, publicly put themselves on record as for or against the proposed reform, and thus give the electorate an opportunity to hear and discuss the question and vote intelligently. We believe that Prohibition can be secured only in accord with this law; therefore electors should

(1) Wherever possible select as candidates for parliamentary honors

only known prohibitionists;

(2) Exact public pledges on this question from all candidates for

office, and vote for conscience rather than for party.

5. We commend the very aggressive work done in behalf of Temperance by the various organizations, especially that done by the Women's Christian Temperance Union, and would reaffirm the principle that women should have the right of franchise granted them on the same terms as men.

6. Your Committee further recommend most heartily the strong ground taken by our own church paper, the *Christian Guardian*, on the above question, and would earnestly advocate the extensive spread of reliable literature and information in support of the cause of Prohibition.

7. In view of the great need of speedily banishing this evil, we would urge that wherever possible our ministers see to it that Juvenile bands be established for the study of scientific temperance as an educative factor in our land.

8. That the Chairman and Financial Secretary of each District are hereby appointed as a Temperance Committee for their district, with power to add to their number in each district, and we request them to carry into effect the recommendations of this Conference with regard to the Temperance Reform in their district, and report to the next Annual Conference concerning the temperance work done in their district.

The attention of your Committee having been directed to the increased use of the bicycle and the many temptations associated therewith, would respectfully urge upon all our brethren, both ministerial and lay, the necessity of prudence in themselves in use of it, and to discourage as far

as possible bicycle riding for pleasure on Sabbath Day.

Your Committee would strongly advise that superintendents who engage evangelists should insist upon a reasonable stipend to be paid for such services-making the evangelist sure of his pay, and, at the same time, protecting the circuit from an overdraft on the circuit financesthus jeopardizing the connexional funds and minister's salary.

2. That, whereas the following resolution was passed by the Manitoba and North-West Conference of 1883, and since then treated as a standing resolution of this Conference:

That, whereas the Conference may be appointed to meet in some place where there may not be sufficient accommodation easily secured, we hereby direct that the members of Conference, resident in the place where the Conference may be held, be the Billeting Committee, be empowered to make the best possible arrangements with the hotels and boarding-houses to accommodate all who cannot otherwise be provided for; and to meet the necessary expense each member of Conference in attendance shall pay an equal share; that this resolution be considered a standing resolution of Conference, and be available for application forthwith.

Resolved,—That this resolution be reaffirmed with the understanding that the clause, "All who cannot otherwise be provided for," be interpreted to mean those who have not been provided for in homes where entertainment has been volunteered, after a full representation of the situation by the pastor or pastors of the circuits in the town or city

selected for the Conference to be held.

3. Your Committee would also recommend that the Quarterly Boards be requested to place a certain amount in the estimates as travelling expenses to cover the expenses of the ministerial and lay delegates to Conference.

4. In reference to the Memorial from the Calgary District, respecting the reception of members into church fellowship, your Committee realizes the importance of the subject referred to in the Memorial. Believing, however, that full provision is made in the Discipline of the Church covering the entire ground, the Committee would recommend that all concerned in the administration of discipline along these lines make a most careful study of the Discipline, and fully and conscientiously carry out its provisions.

5. In relation to the resolution from the Crystal City District, re the relation of baptized children to the Church, your Committee, believing that inasmuch as the subject appears to be covered by the Discipline of our Church, on pages 35 and 36, are of opinion that no action is necessary.

6. In regard to the resolution from the same district, urging the publication of a ritual to be used in the celebration of the Lord's Supper, your Committee is of the opinion that no obligation is imposed on the people to follow the minister in audibly repeating certain portions of the ritual in the administration of the Lord's Supper; and whereas the subject was considered at the last General Conference and no action taken; therefore we consider that further action on the part of this Conference is undesirable.

In reference to the resolution from the Portage la Prairie District, regarding Quarterly Board estimates, that whereas the duties of Stewards are clearly specified in the Discipline pur Committee deem it inexpedient to suggest plans in detail, various circumstances requiring a variety of treatment. At the same time your Committee would urge the importance of superintendents of circuits giving attention to thorough organization, and to seeing that the principles expressed or implied in the Discipline be faithfully applied as circumstances and conditions may require.

8. Resolution from Moosomin District, re election of alternate delegates. Your Committee recognize the importance of the change suggested, but, inasmuch as it would require General Conference action to produce effect; and whereas it is probable that similar memorials will be presented next year, requiring the same ground to be travelled; therefore

Resolved,—That this memorial be referred back to the Moosomin District, with the hope that it may be presented at the next annual

Conference for fuller consideration.

In reference to the communication from the Provincial Branch of the Woman's Foreign Missionary Society, your Committee desire to place on record their high appreciation of the work being done by the consecrated workers who are laboring in this branch of the vineyard, and would recommend our pastors and people to acquaint themselves fully with this and every other phase of our missionary work, and give an intelligent support to this the grandest of Christian enterprises; but in the matter of an annual collection in behalf of the Fund of the society, your Committee recognize the fact that this Conference possesses no power, as the matter of finance, when the General Conference has not otherwise ordered, is wholly in the hands of the Quarterly Official and Trustee Boards.

Resolved,—That this Committee suggests that the Conference recommend the following course of action:

1. That the Trustee Boards of Zion, McDougall, Wesley and Bethel churches each appoint a committee of two persons, by whose decision they will agree to abide, to consider the advisability of moving Bethel Church to a more desirable site, and that upon the favorable report of the said committee the Quarterly Official Board of Bethel Church be requested to appoint a Board of Trustees for the new site agreed upon by the Committee.

2. That this Conference give permission to sell the present church property, the proceeds to be handed over to the newly elected Trustee Board, to be applied in the purchase of the new site and cost of removal of the building.

3. That in the absence of any specific direction of the Discipline to meet the peculiarities of this case, the Chairman of the Winnipeg District be requested to take charge of the case in harmony with the spirit of the Discipline, page 127, par. 252.

Re Franklin Church Property.

Your Committee recommend that the Conference give permission to the Trustees of Franklin Church to sell a portion of their church property, described as follows:

All that portion of the south-east quarter of Section six, in Township fifteen, in Range sixteen, west of the principal meridian in Manitoba, described as follows: Commencing at a point on the west limit of said quarter section, 324 feet southerly from the north-west corner thereof; thence easterly parallel to the northern limit thereof, 132 feet; thence southerly parallel to the western limit thereof, sixty-nine feet; thence westerly parallel to the northern limit thereof, 132 feet, more or less, to the western limit thereof; thence northerly on the said western limit, sixty-nine feet, more or less, to the place of beginning

And apply the proceeds toward the purchase of new property.

Re Amendments to Methodist Church Act.

Your Committee recommend that the amendments to the Methodist Church Act in Manitoba, as it affects our church property in relation to "The Real Property Act," or such portions thereof as may be necessary to convey specific directions in reference to the registration of our connexional property in the Province of Manitoba, be printed in the minutes of Conference, and that A. Monkman, Esq., of the city of Winnipeg, be requested to prepare for insertion a suitable document containing not only the above information, but such other helpful suggestions to trustees as Mr. Monkman may deem advisable to incorporate in his paper.

INFORMATION RE CHURCH PROPERTY.

Memorandum by A. Monkman, Barrister, Winnipeg, relating to Church Property, prepared by request of Conference:

The Statutes of Manitoba affecting the property of Methodist Churches are as follows:

- 1. Chapter 38, 43 Victoria (1880), relating to the property of the Methodist Church of Canada. This is now practically repealed, and only affects titles acquired under it.
- 2. Chapter 65, 47 Victoria, known as "The Methodist Church Act, 1884," providing for union and for dealing with the properties of the united Churches.
- 3. Chapter 62, 50 Victoria (1887), amending "The Methodist Church Act, 1884," and providing for property acquired under the Union.
- 4. Chapter 38, 60 Victoria (1897), further amending "The Methodist Church Act, 1884," to provide for lands of the Church being dealt with under "The Real Property Act of Manitoba."

DOMINION ACT.

The Dominion Act, Chapter 106, 47 Victoria (1884), incorporating "The Methodist Church," containing form of Schedule B, or Model Deed, which is the same as Schedule A in the Manitoba Act of 1884, will be found in Appendix IV. of our Discipline.

SUMMARY.

The following summary from the Manitoba Statutes contains the main provisions affecting Church property:

THE METHODIST CHURCH ACT, 1884.

After reciting that the four denominations forming the Union had petitioned the Dominion Parliament for an Act of Incorporation,

It is provided by Section 2 that all the property, real and personal, within Manitoba held in trust for or to the use of the said denominations, or any of them, or belonging to or held in trust for or to the use of any corporation under the government, or control of any of the said four denominations, should henceforth be held, used and administered for the benefit of the Methodist Church upon the trusts and for the ends and

purposes declared in the Act of incorporation.

By Section 3, it is provided that all the property thus belonging to any of the said denominations should henceforth be held, used and administered for the benefit of the Methodist Church, upon the trusts set out in the schedule to said Act (see schedule in Discipline), and that the trustees acting on said trusts for any of said congregations, notwithstanding any irregularity in their appointment, and notwithstanding that their number shall not correspond with the deed of conveyance of said property, be deemed to be the trustees of the property named in the deed; provided that if the number be less than five the same shall be increased to at least five as soon as convenient after the coming into force of the Act.

AMENDMENT OF 1887.

Provides that the following be added to Section 3 of the Act of 1884:

(a) All property, real or personal, within the Province of Manitoba, acquired by or on behalf of any congregation of the said Church after the said Act of Incorporation shall have come into force incorporating the said denominations under the name of The Methodist Church, shall from the acquiring of such property, real and personal, be vested in and held, used and administered for the benefit of the said The Methodist Church upon trusts and for the end and purposes declared in the said Act of incorporation, and upon the trusts set out in Schedule A to this Act; and trustees acting on the said trusts for any congregation shall, notwith-standing any irregularity in their appointment, and notwithstanding their number shall not correspond with the number named in the deed of conveyance of said property, be deemed to be and shall be the trustees of the said property named in the said deed, subject to any rights which other parties may have against the trustees in respect of such property.

And that the above section is to be read and be construed as if it had been passed at the time of and formed part of the Act amended.

AMENDMENTS OF 1897.

This Act provides that the following additional clauses be added to Section 3 of the 1884 Act, viz.:

"3a. In all cases where the District Registrar of any Land Titles District in Manitoba is satisfied that any real estate standing in the names of any individuals actually belongs to the trustees of any congregation upon the trusts mentioned in Section 3 hereof as amended, he may cancel the certificate of title standing in the name of such individuals, and may issue a certificate of title for said real estate in the name of the trustees of the congregation entitled thereto."

"3b. All deeds, transfers or mortgages heretofore or hereinafter executed and purported to be signed by the trustees of any congregation therein mentioned, or a majority of them, shall be in all courts in this Province and in the Land Titles Offices of the said Province deemed sufficiently executed to pass, or grant, or mortgage, as the case may be, the estate or interest thereby purported to be passed, granted or mortgaged, provided that the minister in charge of such congregation shall certify that the persons executing such instrument were at the date thereof trustees of such congregation, and in the absence or want of appointment, or inability to act of any minister, such certificate may with like effect be granted by the chairman of the district; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to dispense with the consent of the Annual Conference to any sale of lands by such trustees."

"3c. In the case of lands under "The Real Property Act" standing in the names of any trustees for any congregations, such trustees shall hold said lands upon the trusts mentioned in the Schedule to this Act, but it shall not be necessary to refer to said trusts either in the transfer or the certificate of title in respect thereof."

The certificate of the minister or chairman under the above Section 3b may be endorsed on the deed, transfer or mortgage, and should, in order to give necessary information to the District Registrar, and others, dealing with the land, go further than seems to be contemplated by the Statute.

The number of trustees must not be less than five or more than twenty-one.

The consent of the Annual Conference to a sale is still required, excepting in the case mentioned in Clause 17 of the Model Deed.

Under the above provisions lands belonging to trustees of any congregation, or hereafter acquired by them, may be brought under the Real Property Act and a certificate of title obtained therefor.

If the land belonging to any congregation has been conveyed to trustees under the Model Deed, or to individuals under any other form of conveyance, such persons may, by application to the District Registrar of the Land Titles District wherein the land is situated, obtain a certificate of

If the title is under the old system and is not now in the name of duly appointed trustees, a conveyance to the appointed trustees should be obtained, or an application should be made by the present holders of the title to bring the land under the Real Property Act and a direction inserted in the application that the certificate of title issue to the duly appointed trustees, giving their names in full, residences and occupations, and describing them as the trustees for the congregation of the Methodist Church at , in Manitoba.

Land hereafter acquired may, if under the old system, be conveyed to the trustees by the Model Deed, or if a certificate of title under the new system is desired the owner should apply to bring the land under the Real Property Act and insert a direction that the certificate of title issue to the trustees, describing them as mentioned in the last clause.

If the title is already under the new system, a transfer under the Act to the trustees, describing them as above, is all that is necessary.

But if the title is under the new system, and is now vested in individuals who are actually trustees for the Church, though not so described in the certificate of title, such persons may, by surrendering the certificate

cribed ificate and satisfying the District Registrar that they are actually trustees for a congregation upon the trusts mentioned in Schedule A as amended, referred to in Section 3 of the 1884 Act, have the old certificate cancelled and a new one issued, describing them as the trustees of the congregation.

FORM OF APPLICATIONS, ETC.

The form of application for certificate of title ordinarily used to bring lands under the Real Property Act may be used where the land does not stand in the name of the trustees, and the ordinary form may, with slight amendments, be used in all cases.

If made by persons who are actually trustees under the Model Form, or any other kind of conveyance, whether described as trustees or not in such conveyance, make the following changes in ordinary form:

1. In paragraph 2, after the word "possession," insert "as trustees for the congregation of the Methodist Church at in

2. If the certificate is desired to be issued to others in addition to the applicants, insert a direction as follows:

"And we direct the Certificate of Title to be issued in the names of (give names in full, residences and occupations), as the trustees for the congregation of the Methodist Church at in Manitoba."

The affidavit verifying the application endorsed thereon may be made by any one of the applicants.

If lands are being acquired which are under the old system, the title may be transferred or vested in the trustees without any formal deed or transfer by having the owner apply to bring the lands under the Real Property Act, and by inserting a direction therein in the following form:

"I (or we) direct the Certificate of Title to be issued in the names of (here insert names in full, residences and occupations), as the trustees for the congregation of the Methodist Church at in Manitoba."

Forms of applications, transfers, etc., may be obtained from any law stationer.

SPECIAL MISSIONARY COMMITTEE'S REPORT.

In reference to the memorial from the Saskatchewan District, your Committee recommend that, inasmuch as the memorial contemplates General Conference legislation and appointment, no action be taken by this Annual Conference on the former part of the memorial.

We also recommend that the matter be referred to the Stationing Committee to ascertain if any readjustment of the Indian work can be effected whereby provision may be made for more efficient supervision.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON STATE OF THE WORK.

Your Committee having examined the various departments of church work are able to report general and gratifying progress.

The year has been one of steady and healthful growth in spiritual life. Most of the fields have enjoyed gracious revivals of religion, some of these of far-reaching influence. These have been almost universally conducted by the pastors in charge. We are pleased, too, to note the increasing number of conversions in the regular services of the Church These ingatherings, in some instances, though great are not apparent, owing to the severe but healthful pruning which has taken place in the old membership.

We have received on trial, 1,340, and by letter, 1,121; but owing to the fact that this pruning has resulted in the dropping of 577, and to the further fact that 1,002 letters of removal have been given, we show an increase of only 532.

We regret that so few catechumens are reported, and would emphasize the importance of gathering our children and young people into catechumen classes and Epworth Leagues for preparatory training in Church work.

We regret to note again so large a deficiency in the stipends received by our ministers and probationers, yet would call attention to the fact that for this purpose we show an increase in contributions of \$2,911.00.

We think there is marked improvement in both spirit and method of ministerial maintenance on many of the Circuits and Missions, yet it is very desirable that efforts should be made to materially raise the standard.

The Missionary Fund shows an increase of \$653.47, which is not what we might expect when many of the fields have doubled, and in some cases even trebled, the contributions of last year.

It is a most hopeful sign that the children and young people on various fields are being taught and trained in systematic missionary work.

Our Indian work presents some encouraging aspects. The educational institutions are doing good work, and the people are growing in intelligence and progressing in the arts of civilization.

It is pleasing to mark the growing prosperity and enlarging sphere of usefulness of Wesley College, also the loyalty with which its claims are recognized by our people. Our students have acquitted themselves with honor to the classes and to the staff. The Governor-General's silver and bronze medals, the latter of which was the highest gift of the kind in the power of the University, were received by students of Wesley College. We would urge the vital importance of increased loyalty to this institution.

We regret there is so small an increase, viz., 74, in the number of *Christian Guardians* taken. Recognizing the cheapness of this organ of our Church, and its value to every department of our work, we would urge that greater efforts be made to put it into every home and into the hands of all our young people.

MISCELLANEOUS BUSINESS.

RULING OF THE PRESIDENT.

The Chair was asked for an interpretation of the phrase, "until the ensuing Conference," Discipline, page 90, paragraph 162, a difference of opinion existing among members of Conference as to whether Professor Stewart, who has been regularly elected by the District to succeed Rev. G. R. Turk, who had been transferred to the Toronto Conference, should hold office until a successor should be elected at the close of Conference, or that his term of office should cease with the organization of Conference, leaving the chairmanship vacant, and thus necessitating an election at this stage of the proceedings.

The Chair ruled that there was no vacancy in the chairmanship of Winnipeg District, the intent of the Discipline being that the recently elected Chairman of Winnipeg District should hold office through the sessions of Conference until his successor should be elected, after the final reading of the stations.

Rev. O. Darwin gave notice of appeal against the ruling of the President of Conference in reference to the chairmanship of Winnipeg District.

In the matter of the appeal against the finding of the Winnipeg District, taken by Rev. A. Andrews: Having carefully considered the matter, it would appear to me that in Section 201, page 111, of Discipline, such a case would require as presiding officer the Chairman of the District; and inasmuch as Rev. P. McHaffie was not a chairman, was not of equal status with the officer whose duty it would have been in the first place to preside, therefore I would decide that the action of the Winnipeg District was in harmony with the Discipline, and this appeal is hereby set aside.

Buchanan, and Resolved,—That, whereas the income of our Superannuation Fund has again proved inadequate to enable the Board to pay the claimants in full, and the attention of the Conference having been called to the fact that, in some cases, the payments of Probationers to this fund have not been duly met, the attention of Chairmen of Districts be called to the importance of carrying out fully the provisions of Discipline, re payment on page 199, section 383, and inquiring into the matter at the Annual District Meeting.

CONFERENCE EXAMINATIONS.

Moved by Rev. F. B. Stacey, seconded by Rev. J. W. Saunby, and Resolved,—That in future no Probationer be recommended to attend college until he has completed the Conference course of study, with the exception of Greek.

PASTORAL ADDRESS.

TO THE MEMBERS AND ADHERENTS OF THE METHODIST CHURCH, MANITOBA AND NORTH-WEST CONFERENCE.

Dearly Beloved Brethren,-With gratitude to God for the abundant mercies which have graciously fallen upon us during the past year, we greet you as citizens enjoying peace and prosperity in this western land beyond the lakes; and as fellow-laborers in the Lord assembled under different conditions in the widely scattered districts of our Conference, we give you our sympathy and counsel, praying that grace, mercy and peace may every abide with you. The beneficent wisdom of Almighty God has brought us to share the blessings of civil and religious liberty which are not less to be prized because we are living in the last years of the century, and we cannot fail to recognize the victories of peace which are as great as war in the settlement of the country by people of different rationalities, the abundant harvest and the various products of the thought and labor of the men and women who belong to us. We are living in a Christian land, won from its primitive condition of waste and disorder by devoted men and women who laid the foundation of morality, began our public institutions, formulated our laws, and moulded society, until far and wide over the prairies schools and churches have been established, conferring privileges and blessings on all classes of people.

We cannot overlook the work performed by our denomination in laying the foundations of Christian civilization in Manitoba and the Territories by caring for the temporal, intellectual and spiritual welfare of the aborigines. Not a question affecting public education, the social condition of the settlers, and the general development of town and city has been touched upon, but the ministers and laymen of western Methodism have been deeply interested in it, and have exerted their influence in moulding public opinion toward righteousness.

The Church of our fathers having placed upon us responsible burdens which we are delighted to bear, has commissioned us to assure you that we are enjoying in large measure tokens of Divine favor, and in every department of our work there has been advancement. The health of the ministers and laity has been good, for which we are profoundly thankful to God. Our doctrines were never more faithfully taught according to the standards of the Church. A wave of evangelistic fervor has passed over us, and the old story of redeeming love has been told with the pathos of former days, until in the beautiful edifices of our towns and cities and the humble log buildings on lonely missions the songs of exultant joy have fallen from the lips of souls born into the kingdom of God.

In this Jubilee year of our beloved Queen the hearts of tens of thousands of our people unite with us in expressions of loyalty which is too deep for utterance, and we pray that in the wise providence of God the august upon whic

the august lady of the realm may long be spared to rule over an Empire upon which the sun never sets.

Vital religion has ever been the glory of our fathers, and emphasis was always placed upon the great work of winning souls for God; and it is our joy to know that the same zeal which characterized the preachers who laid the foundations of all that was purest and best in our civilization and organized our Church with a view to the salvation of souls, is possessed not only by our ministers, but our people are anxious to hear of conversions, and there is nothing which brings so much joy to their hearts as a gracious revival.

Whilst rejoicing in the growth of membership in our Church, we would call attention to the importance of living in deep and abiding communion with God, that in our social and public means of grace we may always exhibit the refinement of the Gospel, which will attract the sinner and show the stranger that the religion of the Christ recognizes the bond of the Infinite in the love that thinketh no evil. The kind word to the new settler and the recognition of the stranger is a means of grace, and brings its own sweet benison that never dies. We desire above all things purity of heart and life in those who meet with us in the fellowship of the saints, and hope that none shall find their way amongst us but those who are truly born from above, and none shall remove from one place to another without obtaining letters of removal.

Agencies for the spiritual education of our young people have been more thoroughly organized, and with the supreme object in view, the glory of God in their salvation. The spiritual forces in the Sunday School have been multiplied and strengthened. A deeper study of the Bible, a fuller knowledge of child-nature and a more intense sympathy with its needs, and a keener realization of our responsibility as educators of the men and women of the future and moulders of the eternal faculties of immortal beings, whom having once touched with the fingers of our intellect pass from us changed in imagination and memory, until we meet on the other side of life with the impressions of other years, cannot fail to make each of us a Christ to bless the child in our midst.

As doctrinal training is one of the necessary factors of strength and efficiency as a denomination, and an important element in moulding individual character, producing a robust faith, religious loyalty and soulculture harmonious in its growth and beautiful, we would urge upon all engaged in caring for the young the necessity of thorough instruction in our catechisms, in the home as well as in the Sunday School. Good habits formed in early life are the foundation of virtue, and the members of our schools cannot be too deeply impressed with the blessings hidden in the total abstinence pledge taken in youth.

The Epworth League is exerting power for good among the young people of an intellectual, social and religious character, and there lie in the organization elements which with proper guidance will make it a great soul-saving agency. May we not hope to hear that the members of our young people's societies are concentrating their energies upon bringing all the young people within their reach into the possession of a definite, blessed, and triumphant religious experience, assisting the class-leaders in augmenting and maintaining the attendance and helping to infuse spiritual power into the classes by their presence and through a legitimate use of literature for this purpose. By social work, attendance at the prayer

and class-meetings, throwing themselves heartily into all forms of work in the Church, social, literary, financial and spiritual, the members of our young people's societies may increase the power of the Church in all its

departments and glorify the God we serve.

Wesley College has maintained the honorable place among the educational institutions in the land it secured from its very inception. Under the administration of a wise and skilful Board of Directors, the College has been placed in a position which in a few years will secure permanent security. The Faculty has been more than faithful in training the students, which has been shown by the honors won by the undergraduates in competition with those of similar institutions, and by the graduates who have entered professional life; and the Principal, with genial spirit and consecrated energy, has brought financial help to the College, helped to maintain its dignified place, and given to all interested in its progress a guarantee of safety which is a prophecy of success.

In the cause of social reform, temperance is one of the greatest agencies, as it is one of the grandest movements of the century. By a sanctified use of the ballot we hope to see the abolition of the liquor traffic, which ensures the straying feet of youth, and pours its wretchedness upon the world. It becomes the obligation of every Christian to be solemnly devoted to the destruction of the traffic which brings irreparable evils

upon the human race.

For the sake of our children we cannot afford to look with any complacency upon the desecration of the Sabbath Day in any form. Methodism must ever upheld with vigilance the sacred rights of the people

in keeping holy the Lord's Day.

While rejoicing in the generous support given to all our church enterprise, yet we feel constrained to seek the liberal aid of all our people—the scholars in the Sunday School, the members of the Young People's Society, and the members and adherents of our churches—in the matter of ministerial support and connexional funds. As a missionary church, our hearts are gladdened with the good news of salvation among the heathen. Men and women are deeply interested in the great missionary movement of to-day, and as we lift our voices in praise for the victories of the Cross among the heathen, let us not forget that to us is committed a great trust in the native tribes living in this western land, and in the people of different nationalities who are seeking homes amongst us.

Let us be true to ourselves in spreading our own literature among the people. Sustain the class-meeting. Give diligence to live out the Christ-life among men, that which is beautiful, strong and joyous. Study the Bible. Give attention to private prayer. Be faithful to all the public means of grace. Go to church, and take the children with you, for in the family pew there are sacred associations, and the traditions of character and grace sustain the hope of the salvation of the young through faith in

Christ, enforced by the godly example of parents.

"And now, unto him who is able to keep you from falling, and to present you faultless before the presence of his glory with exceeding joy, to the only wise God, our Saviour, be glory and honor, dominion and power, both now and ever. Amen."
