Look at the two extremes-Old man Buncome getting millions from the business for doing nothing and Old man Harris getting six dollars a week for trotting around all day long at everybody's beek and call. Gosh, it's fierce!"

"Say, George, I guess you've been listening to some Socialist soap These here Socialists say the whole system, is wrong. They everybody is entitled to all he earns."

'No. I haven't paid any attention to any Socialist, although I have minutes now and then. I've been thinking! Thinking of I heard McSurly tell Malone that he could get any man tened for a few m ber of men to fill his place for 25 conts a day less than Dinny was get ting. Dinny had asked McSurly for a raise of 25 cents a day. Well, by days I could not get it out of my mind. I kept thinking that if McSurly could get a man to do my work for less money he would not hay me \$30 a week, and by and by it struck me that McSurly, with his \$150 a week had no more interest in me or any other man in the shop than he could get out of us."

Sure, that's right. I was listening to a soapbox lecturer last night and he pointed out that very thing. Said everything was governed by eco-nomic determinism; all the conditions we read of in history, the acts of Governments, Churche es and peoples had all been determined economic factor. Said the first thing asked in any new venture was-Wil it pay? Is there any profit in it? So I guess that if your boss could cheapen production he would do it, and to knock of five or ten dollars a from each man's wages would certainly reduce the pay roll quite a. But you can't blame McSurly. That's what he's there for. He's get eapen production to hold his job."

"No, you're right there, Frank. I don't blame McSurly; I don't blame Buncome & Serapp. I blame the system. It's a damnable system. It's against all justice, for it allows one man to reap what another has sown. It's a shameless robbery of the worker. There are 120 men work ing at Buncome & Scrapp's, and we 120 are making enough to pay the lavish expenditure of the Boncome and the Scrapp families, with annual trips to Europe and their extravagant display of wealth all the year round. I hear Scrapp writes to his friends of the high jinks he is having down south. Well, we worke s are paying for it all.' You're a Socialist all right, C orge.

"Well, Frank, if that's Socialism I'm it. The workers are robbed. They are only paid a very small portion of what they earn. The bosses take the bulk. However did such a cobber system happen?

You've got me there, George. I suppose, like To "Well then, it's time it was turned down. Come to look at it much better off is the average worker now than were the black slave down south before the war? True they were chattel slaves and wer old like cattle; but th y always had a master, always a good master; that is, he looked after their health and saw to it that they were well fed. You see, they cost money. There was the economic determinism again. By keeping their slaves in good health they were protecting their pocketbooks. But who cares whether the workers live or die now? It is no concern of the bosses. To live now a man has to get a job, and to get a job he has to hunt up a master; and if he can't find a master willing to employ him he can starve.'

That's true, George, but I don't see how it affects you." "It affects every worker. I'm pretty well fixed today, but who knows what may happen in a few years, or even in a few months? Look at Old man Harris. Less than five years ago he was head booker for Buncome getting a hundred dollars a month. Itell you, Frank, under this system no one can be assured of a comfortable old age; not even the millionaire. Riches have a habit of taking wings and flying away."

"Sure. Don't I know that ? Didn't I lose every cent I had when the first National Bank bust up last year? Don't you Nell had to give up our house and go to live in that pokey little flat on Dexter St? I know all about money taking wings, my son. Dollar bills ean beat a wild turkey in the flying stunt, and, like Jim Jeffries, they don't come back.'

"Yes, I remember that affair. It was by a close shave that I missed being one of the victims myself. But my turn may come someday, perhaps when I am too old to get on my feet again, like Old man Harris. I can see clearly enough that if ever this system is to be changed for a better one, where all may have equal opportunities and where no man shall be compelled to find a master before he can obtain food or clothing, it will have to be done by the workers themselves. They must get control of the Government. The master class will certainly not help them in that, but will oppose it tooth and nail."
