





the Russian military organization make the expression of dissatisfaction equal to mutiny, but were it possible for the views of the men in the ranks to find expression, as they would in the British army, the glamour which encircles the Russian commanders who are responsible for the existing situation would soon be of leaden hue.

It is suggested by the existing situation that Kuropatkin who boasted before leaving St. Petersburg for the seat of war, that he would dictate terms of peace at Tokio, may, just now, be chiefly concerned over the problem as to how he may safely retreat to a position north of Liaoyang and as to whether in the event of his accomplishing that, his further retreat to Mukden can be successfully accomplished.

Russian reports were first to the effect that the Japanese lost 20,000 men in an attack on Port Arthur and, next, 17,000 men, while the defenders had only a few hundred casualties. These reports are evidently untrue, for if they were otherwise they would ere this have been authenticated from other sources. It is noticeable that while very wild stories of severe casualties on the enemy's side often emanate from Russian sources, the Japanese reports are singularly free from exaggeration.
