

MINUTES.

PRESTON, Saturday Sept. 24th, 1870. The Third Session of the African Baptist Association, met at Preston, on Saturday, September the 24th. At 7 o'clock—Preaching by the Rev. Henry Frances, from the 14th Chapter of Revelation.

Sunday, September 25th.

Met at half-past 10 o'clock, P. M., Preaching by the Rev. Henry Frances, from Revelation xxii. 2; followed by the Rev. George R. Neale, F. Randolph, Rev. D. Shaw, Rev. Benson Smithers, and E. Dickson.

At 3 o'clock, P. M.—Preaching by the Rev. D. Shaw, from Isaiah xxvi.; followed by F. Randolph.

At 7 o'clock, P. M.—Preaching by Bro. Randolph, from Romans viii. 35, followed by the Rev. Henry Frances, H. Baley, G. Carvery, P. Hawkins, Revds. B. Smithers, and G. R. Neale.

Monday, September 26th.

Met at 6 o'clock, P. M.—Rev. George R. Neale read the 11th Chapter of Isaiah. Prayer by Rev. G. R. Neale.

Voted, That Rev. Benson Smithers be Chairman.

That Rev. George R. Neale be Moderator.

That Rev. G. R. Neale be Clerk—that Brother P. Hawkins be Assistant Clerk.

Voted, That Rev. G. R. Neale receive the right-hand of fellowship in behalf of the First Church in Preston; which have came out boldly from the Rev. James Thomas. Voted, That Brother George Thomas be Secretary and Treasurer of the Association.

At 11 o'clock, P. M.—The Rev. Henry Frances preached the Introductory Sermon, from Jonah ii. 2, followed by Brother F. Randolph, Rev. G. R. Neale, H. Bailey, P. Hawkins.

At 3 o'clock, P. M.—Preaching by the Rev. D. Shaw from St. John iv. 29, followed by Brother Randolph.

At 7 o'clock, P. M.—Preaching by the Rev. G. R. Neale, from Psalm xxiii. 19, followed by the Rev. H. Francis, F. Randolph, and a great many more of the brethren.

Tuesday, September 27th.

Met at 9 o'clock, P. M.—Prayer by Rev. George R. Neale.

Voted, That all the Officers stand as they were last year.

Voted, That the superintendent of the Minutes have power to correct any mistakes.

It was voted that Brother James Smith be Collector of the Home Mission money for the Weymouth Church.

It was voted that the Rev. Benson Smithers and the Rev. George R. Neale superintend the printing of the Minutes.

It was voted that Brother C. Pomp be Collector for Granville Mountain Church.

Adjourned to meet at 3 o'clock.

Met at 3 o'clock, P. M.—Prayer by the Rev. H. Francis.

It was voted that the Rev. George R. Neale be received into our African Association, Pastor of the First Church, Preston.

Voted, That Rev. G. R. Neale write the Circular Letter.

Voted, That the Letters be read.

Voted, That the Association be held with the Weymouth Church next year, on the last Saturday in September, 1871.

Voted, That Rev. George R. Neale preach the Introductory Sermon, and that Rev. Benson Smithers be his alternate.

Voted, That Brothers James Downing and Thomas Croley take a seat in Council with us.

We then closed our Session by joining hands, and singing the Doxology.

TUESDAY, Sept. 27th, 7 o'clock, P. M.—The Revds. H. Francis, and F. Randolph, preached at the First Preston Church, from St. John x. 3, followed by a great many of the Brethren. Truly we could say the time of refreshing was come from the Lord

WEDNESDAY 28th, 7 o'clock, P. M.—The Revds. H. Francis and F. Randolph, preached at the 3rd. Church at Preston, Newroad Settlement.

THURSDAY 29th, 7 o'clock, P. M.—The Revds. H. Francis and F. Randolph, preached in the Dartmouth Church.

FRIDAY 30th, 7 o'clock, P. M.—Preaching in the South Church, Preston.

SUNDAY, October 2nd.—Preached three times in the Dartmouth Church. Then the Revds. H. Francis and F. Randolph, closed their labour of love. May the blessing of the Lord go with them.
