Shields, who had been found guilty of various heinous offences and sentenced to twenty years' confinement in the penitentiary. This disposition of the case was not at all consonant with the views of the citizens, and accordingly when the Sheriff under-took to convey the prisoner from the court-room to the jail there was great excitement. The prisoner, mounted on a horse, started off between two mount-ed guards, but they had gone only a short distance when they found themselves pursued by a band of thirty mein, all mounted and armed with shot guns. The citizens soon overtook the prisoner and after considerable skirmishing Shields and his guards were separated, and in a twinkling the body of the prisoner was suspended by the neck from a cross-beam in the nearest bridge. Hardly less excit-ing was the scene witnessed in the Hawes-ville, Ky., court room last week. On the docket stood the case of Laura Moorman vs. Eldred Bruner, an action for slander, damages laid at \$20,000. Eighty witnes-ses were summoued, among whom was one Terrell, who, upon being called upon to testify to the truth of the defendant's allegations, was promptly faced by the two brothers of the slandered maid, one of whom undertook to shoot the defend-ant, while the other brother popped point blank at the witness with his fists. A general scrimmage followed, and although forty shots were fired and the court-room enveloped in a cloud of dust, nobody was hurt and the case was continued. 




