CITY SCHOOL MATTERS.

The Trustees and the York Street School Trustees held this day, the following record passed at the last regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees of this city, and at the last regular meeting of the City Council, will be of interest to our readers:

BOARD SCHOOL TRUSTEES.

At the regular meeting of the Board of School Trustees held this day, the following record was adopted, a copy of which was ordered to be sent to the City Council.

In considering a resolution adopted at the regular meeting of the City Council on 1st May instant, in which disapproval is expressed respecting the Board's action in the admission of pupils into some of the city schools, we can only assume that the members of the City Council labor under a misapprehension of the circumstances, or such a resolution would not have been adopted.

In view of the careful deliberation of the Board in looking after the health, comfort and convenience of the children attending the public schools of Fredericton, it is a matter of some surprise to us to be told that our arrangements of the respective schools provided by direct action in every part of the city, for the convenience of the inhabitants of the various sections thereof, are useless for the purpose intended, etc., etc.

As the board's system of placing pupils in the several schools, in the resolution, is claimed to be "very inconvenient," we feel his Worship the Mayor and aldermen have not made their own investigation of the board's method of assigning pupils to different schools, and for their information we beg to give the following particulars.

By arrangement with the Board of Education accommodation was placed at our disposal for about 200 pupils in the Model schools located in the Normal school building.

As this building is situated very near to the center of the city, and in consideration of its superior equipment and accommodation, we made it accessible to all classes of our citizens residing within the city limits, under certain necessary restrictions, to wit:

Parents wishing admission for their children into the Model school are required to make application at the office of the secretary, whose names are recorded in a book kept for that purpose. After the grading, and when new classes are formed at the beginning of the year, the vacancies are filled according to the order of application.

It is to be noted that the Model school is not a boarding school, but a day school, and the children are required to reside in the city.

The Brunswick street school and the Regent street school are also open to children of the city, but the children are required to reside in the city.

For several years we have felt much responsibility for the health and comfort of the teachers and children attending the York street school, owing to the defective ventilation and badly arranged class-rooms, etc.
