

**ASTRONOMICAL NOTICES FOR THE YEAR 1886.**

Ladies GOLD and SILVER WATCHES, a great variety at WELLNER'S.

Seaside, Rose & Franklin Square Libraries at the DIAMOND BOOKSTORE.

On the left hand page of each month are given the data required for Solar observations for Time and Latitude, namely:—The Equation of Time (Sun fast or slow of clock) which is given for the instant of apparent Noon and the Sun's Declination at Mean Noon, both Greenwich Time. Also the Sun's apparent Semi-diameter to the nearest tenth of a second for every day throughout the year with these exceptions, all the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute Local Mean Time, Charlottetown Latitude 46° 13' 55 N. Longitude 63° 7. 23 W.

The Sun's Declination at Greenwich Apparent Noon if required can be obtained from the data here given by multiplying the hourly variation of Declination by the Equation of Time for the same day, reduced to the decimal of an hour and applying the result according to the conditions as given below :

From the Sun's Semi-diameter may be found the Sun's horizontal Parallax (which equals the earth's apparent Diameter as seen from the distance of the Sun) by dividing by the constant quantity 107.44, which is the proportion that the Sun's actual diameter bear to that of the earth, taken as unity. Thus for July 1st, when the Sun is in its furthest from the earth we have the Apparent Semi-diameter 15'46" which give  $\frac{15'46".1}{107.44} = \frac{94'.6}{107.44} = 8".805$  the Sun's Horizontal Parallax at that tide. In like manner on the 31st December when the Sun is in perigee we find the Horizontal Parallax to be 9.106.

The Parallax in altitude may be obtained from the Horizontal Parallax thus found by the natural cosine of the observed altitude.

On the Right Page of each month are the changes of the Moon its Rising, Southing and Setting, and the time of High Water at Charlottetown. The bearing of the Moon at the time of change, the Perigee and Apogee, the time of its crossing the Equinoctial and of reaching its greatest North and South Declination.

It being generally found that the Lunar Equinoctials are marked by atmospheric disturbances, the greater the more nearly their times agree with those of the Moon's changes on Perigee. x x or x x x added where two or three of these influences concur within the space of 48 hours.

#### ECLIPSES.

During the year 1886 there will be two Eclipses, both of the Sun, but neither of them visible at Charlottetown.

I. An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, Greenwich Mean Time of conjunction, March 5th, 10h. 8m. 57.2 sec., the centre of the Moon's Shadow passing from near the eastern extremity of New Guinea across the Pacific Ocean and Mexico to near Yucatar.

II. A total Eclipse of the Sun August 28-29, Greenwich Mean time of conjunction in Right Ascension August 29th 0h. 52m. 34.8 sec., the centre of the Shadow passing from the coast of Venezuela across the Atlantic, South Africa and South Madagascar.

## PLANETS.

**MERCURY.**—Mercury will be at his greatest angular distance west of the Sun as a morning star, and to the east as an evening star at the following dates: January 8th  $23^{\circ} 21'$  West, March 21st,  $18^{\circ} 31'$  East, May 6th,  $26^{\circ} 16'$  West, July 18th,  $26^{\circ} 52'$  East, September 1st,  $18^{\circ} 5'$  West, November 13th,  $22^{\circ} 29'$  East, and December 22nd,  $21^{\circ} 52'$  West, between these dates his motion will be retrograde and direct alternately passing the Sun in conjunction inferior or superior according as the planets motion is retrograde or direct.

**VENUS.**—Venus at the beginning of the year an Evening Star, with direct apparent motion (that is from west to east) till January 26th, then retrograde till March 7th, and direct to the end of the year coming to inferior conjunction with the Sun February 18th, in superior conjunction December 2nd.

**MARS.**—His motion will be retrograde till April 17th, afterwards direct. He will be in opposition to the Sun March 6th, coming to the meridian at midnight at his greatest brightness and least distance from the earth.

**JUPITER.**—Jupiter begins the year with direct motion till 20th January, retrograde till 23rd May, after which direct to the end of the year. He comes in conjunction with the Sun October, re-appearing as a Morning Star at the end of the month.

**SATURN.**—Having just passed his opposition to the Sun (Dec. 25), commences the year with retrograde motion, so continuing till March 2nd, after which direct to the end of the year, he will be in conjunction with the Sun July 3rd, reappearing as a Morning Star about the end of the month.

**URANUS.**—Uranus commences the year with retrograde motion till January 13th, till he retrograde till June 10th, then direct to the end of the year. This minute planet may be looked for during the first half of the year a little to the eastward of Jupiter and Mars and may be recognized at the times of his conjunction with those planets on July 9th,  $34'$  due north of Mars, and August 16th,  $31'$  (=the Moon's diameter) due south of Jupiter.

NEPTUNE.—Retrograde till February 1st, direct till August, 31' and retrograde to the end of the year, in conjunction with the Sun May 15th.

To estimate the distance given in the above table, 31' may be taken as equal to the Mean Apparent diameter of the Moon. At their conjunction on August 8th, Venus and Saturn being but 1' apart, would appear to the eye as one star, and they may be so seen in the East just before sunrise that morning. An interesting grouping of Jupiter, Mars and Uranus will be seen in the early part of July.

#### OCCULTATIONS.

There will be eighteen occultations of Planets by the Moon, one of Mercury, May 1st; two of Venus, January 7th, April 30th; one of Mars, June 9th; of Jupiter, eight, January 25th, February 20th, March 20th, April 16th, May 13th, June 5th, July 7th, August 3rd; and six of Uranus occurring a few hours after the first six of Jupiter. The actual occurrence will not be observable here, happening either in broad daylight or when the Moon is below the horizon.

In the course of each month there are many occultations of fixed stars by the Moon (more than 1500 during the year) but of stars less than the third magnitude they cannot be observed without the aid of the telescope, out of forty-eight above that magnitude the following eight may be seen, namely four of Aldetaran 1st magnitude in Taurus in January 16th, 6h. 12m. p. m.; February 12th, 55m. past midnight; October 16th, 7h. 13m. p. m., and November 13th, 2h. 33m. a. m.

One of Regulus 1st magnitude in sea October 22nd, 4h. p. m., (a near approach) one each of Beta, Eta and Gamma, 3rd magnitude of Virgo April 16th, 3h. 10m. a. m., April 17th, 1h. 37m. a. m., and May 15th, 11h. 10m. p. m. The time here given being when the star is centrally behind the Moon.







The rate of Postage on a letter posted within the Dominion of Canada, for transmission by Mail to any place in Canada, is three cents per half ounce weight ; but the Statute provides that this rate must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the time of posting the letter.

Any such letter posted wholly *unpaid* (or prepaid less than one full rate of *three cents*) cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—" *postage not prepaid.*"

On letters posted at an office to be delivered from it, commonly known as "*drop letters,*" the rate is one cent per  $\frac{1}{2}$  oz. ; to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamp affixed to such letters when posted.

The charge for the Registration of a letter is 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

#### CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

Letters for Newfoundland are charged at the rate of *five* cents per half ounce, and must in all cases be *prepaid.*

Post Cards 2 cents.

The Registration fee to Newfoundland is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by Registration stamp.

#### CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of postage upon letters passing by mail between Canada and the United States is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp, one rate, viz : 3 cents.

The Registration fee to the United States is 5 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

periodicals published less frequently than once a month, the postage rate is one cent per 4 ounces which must be prepaid by postage stamp.

Newspapers and periodicals weighing less than one ounce, may be posted singly; if prepaid by postage stamp, one-half cent each.

Newspapers and other periodicals published in the United Kingdom, and re-posted by News Agents to regular subscribers, are not liable to any additional postage.

#### PARCEL POST.

To any part of the Dominion, for each parcel weighing  
Not more than 4 ounces, 6 cents,  
Exceeding 4 ozs., and not exceeding 8 ozs., 12 cents,  
Each additional 4 ozs., or fraction, 6 cents.

Parcels should not exceed 5 lbs. in weight, or 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth, and should be marked "by *Parcel Post*." Parcels may be registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the postage.

#### MISCELLANEOUS POSTAL MATTER,

VIZ: BOOKS AND PAMPHLETS, PRINTED CIRCULARS, PRICES CURRENT, HANDBILLS, ENGRAVERS' BLOCKS, ETC., ETC.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada, and not exceeding 5 lbs. in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth, or depth, must be prepaid by Postage Stamp at the rate of 1 cent per 4 ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc, must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions.

Legal and Commercial papers generally are liable to letter rate of Postage.

The rate of postage on Seeds, Cuttings, Bulls and Roots is 1 cent per 4 ounces, the weight of a package not to exceed 24 ounces.

In sending money by mail it is always best to transmit by

Money Order if possible. If sent by letter, it should always be registered, and a receipt obtained.

Money Orders on the United Kingdom, Newfoundland, the United States, British India, Italy, Germany, Switzerland, Jamaica, New South Wales, Victoria and Tasmania, are drawn in Canada Currency, and may be had for any sum not in excess of \$50; but Postmasters are at liberty to issue several orders of \$50 each, if required by the remitter.

### PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

#### CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of *One Cent* per 4 ounces weight, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection.

#### UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandise, posted for places in the United States, are subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ounces in weight.




FIG. NO. I.—This signal indicates “*moderate gale is expected probably at first from an easterly direction.*”

The *Drum* will always be hoisted when the velocity of the wind is expected to exceed 40 miles an hour.

The night signal, corresponding to Nos. 1 and 3, is two white lanterns hanging *perpendicularly*.

Night signal corresponding to Nos. 2 and 4, is two white lanterns hanging *horizontally*.

This Court and the Exchequer Court were organized under the provisions of 38 Vic. Cap. 11.

The Supreme Court has both original and appellate jurisdiction—*Original*, as to (1) habeas corpus in criminal and extradition cases; (2) judicial opinions to the Crown; (3) private bills and petitions therefor referred by the Senate or House of Commons; and (4) civil suits in which the validity of a Dominion or Provincial Act is questioned. *Appellate* in appeals (1) from the Exchequer Court; (2) from the Provincial Courts; (3) in habeas Corpus cases; and (4) in election cases.

The Supreme Court, for the purpose of hearing and determining Appeals, holds annually, at the City of Ottawa, three Sessions, commencing third Tuesday in February, first Tuesday in May, and fourth Tuesday in October.

### THE EXCHEQUER COURT OF CANADA.

(Sits every Monday at 12 noon, except vacation.)

The Exchequer Court has original jurisdiction (1) in revenue cases; (2) in civil suits when the Crown for the Dominion is plaintiff; (3) controversies between the Dominion and the Provinces, or between two Provinces.
