

Terrible Maritime Catastrophe on Lake Ontario.
STEAMER "BAYRIAN" BURNED.
FOURTEEN LIVES LOST.

Onawa, Nov. 6.—The steamer Bayrian took fire last night about eight o'clock, when she was in the middle of the lake, about 10 miles from the shore. She was a mass of flames in an instant, and only two boats were saved. Each of these boats contained twenty-two persons altogether. There were four hundred and thirty on board. The captain, Captain J. G. McKeown, the chief engineer, Wm. Finlayson, the steward, Wm. Spence, the cook, and three other passengers, Mr. S. H. Hill and daughter, of Brockville, and Miss Ireland, of Kingston, and Mr. Hilliard West, of Chatham.

LATER.
Onawa, Nov. 6.—When the steamer Bayrian was nearly opposite Onawa, she was seen to be on fire. The first intimation the passengers and crew had of the disaster was the sound of a gun. The steamer was enveloped in flames in an instant. There were four hundred and thirty on board. The flames were seen to be in the engine room. The only persons who were saved were the two boats mentioned above. The rest of the crew were seen to be struggling in the water. The Bayrian was a fine vessel, and was well equipped for service. The loss of her is a great calamity.

THE PURSHER'S STATEMENT.
The purser, Mr. L. A. McKeown, arrived here yesterday morning's express from the coast and gave the following account of the disaster:
"I was in the Bayrian on the 5th inst. at 10 o'clock, and about 10 miles from the shore. The vessel was on a regular run, and was well equipped for service. The crew consisted of 400 men, women and children. The vessel was a fine one, and was well equipped for service. The loss of her is a great calamity."
