PORT ARTHUR WILL PROBABLY WIT-NESS THE LAST FIGHT.

NEARING A DECISIVE BATTLE

ONE CENT.

The Chinese Army, Out-Fought and Out-Generaled, Is Retreating to the Mountains, With the Japs in Hot Pursuit-Port Arthur Will Not Make a Determined Resistance.

Shanghai, Nov. 9 .- The Chinese army of the north has retreated to the mountains. where the soldiers are reported to be starving, and suffering severely from cold and exposure. The Japanese army is reported to be encamped at Feng-Whang-Cheng. Japanese are pursuing about 15,000 Chinese, mostly raw recruits.

Port Arthur is not expected to make a determined stand against the Japanese. Admiral Sir E. R. Fremantle, in command of the British fleet, considers that Port Arthur will probably be the scene of the last engagement of any between the Chinese and Japanese.

New the Navies Fought.

New York, Nov. 9.—A special from San Francisco to The Tribune says: "An American naval officer, writing from Tokyo to San Francisco, gives the following new facts in regard to the recent naval battles in the Orient! I was at Nagasaki when the two Japanese war vessels that had been given the worst of the Chinese fire in the Yalu battle arrived. They were the Akagi-Kan and the Hiyea-Kan. They were badly used up vessels above the decks. Their rigging and stacks were cut up, but it was noticeable their hulls were practically intact. From a Japanese officer, I learned the cause. The Chinese, he said, approached them for battle in two columns, with all of their sights set for 4000 metres. This was right for that range, but when the Japanese closed in the Chinese committed the serious error of neglecting to lower their sight bars, so the majority of their shots went high when at short range, and did damage to the rigging only. The Japanese cruisers found themselves more than equal to the two big-Chinese ships.

From this same officer I learned that the great fault with the Japanese tactics and the real reason why they have not by this time reduced China to submission is their indisposition to follow, up the advantages they have obtained. They are too discreet. They seem to overlook the fact that, although crippled themselves, the Chinese are worse off than they, and could not afford to continue the battle. SIDNEY LOBB ON TRIAL. Charged With Having Shot and Killed His

Charged With Having that and Killed His Wife.

New Westminster, Nov 9.—The Fall Assizes opened here on Thursday, when Sidney W. Lobb of Nanaimo was arraigned on a charge of shooting and killing his wife. The prisoner pleads not guity and asserts that his wife committed suicide on account of his drinking habits. Mr. E. P. Davis of Vancouver appears for the defence, and W. Leamy, Q.C. is prosecuting attorney, Judge Bale is the presiding judge.

The trial is now in progress.

In his opening address the Crown counsel explained that Mr. Lobb was in the employ of the New Vancouver Coal Co. as accountant, and that he ran across to a neighbor's house on a night in June last and told him that his wife had shot herself. The Crown called 7 witnesses, the neighbors and servants of the prisoner. They gave evidence of what they saw and heard on the fatal night after Lobb rushed into a neighbor's house and said, "My wife has shot herself!"

"The worst storms," said the captain "The worst storms," said the captain of a tramp steamship the other day, "are the typhoons of the Chinese seas. They cover a large area, are uncertain in their movements and follow each other quickly. The typhoon season is on just now. And I see that one reason the Japanese and Chinese war fleets are anxious to stay at home is because they are afraid of the big storms.

"The first signs of the storm are light, cirrus clouds coming from the east, with hot, dry weather, light winds and a slight rise in the barometer. This fine weather lasts for several days.

"There are usually halos to be seen round the sun by day and around the moon by night, while the phosphoresence of the sea becomes suddenly increased; the sunsets and sunrises be-

creased; the sunsets and sunrises become gloriously colored with crimson, gold and amber, and the twilight rays are beautiful beyond description.

"Then at a distance of about 500
