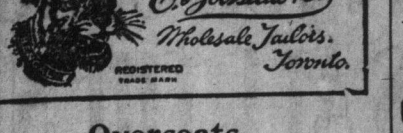

Customs receipts were over \$200,000,000, and those from internal revenue \$744,000,000. For the same period the expenditures were \$700,000,000, leaving a deficit of a little over \$50,000,000. The Secretary of the Treasury estimates that the receipts for the current fiscal year will aggregate nearly \$941,000,000, and the expenditures \$891,000,000.
