TWENTY-FIRST ANNUAL SESSION

OF THE

SYNOD OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

FIRST DAY.

The Twenty-first Annual Meeting of the Synod of Montreal was held on Tuesday, the 15th day of June, 1880.

Divine Service was held in the Cathedral, with Sermon and Holy Communion, at half-past ten o'clock. The Sermon was preached by Canon Ellegood.

The clerical roll was called by the Clerical Secretary; and in the absence of the Lay Secretary, the lay roll also was called by the Clerical Secretary.

Moved by Rev. J. C. DAVIDSON, seconded by Canon NORMAN:

That Rev. J. Empson be re-elected Clerical Secretary.—*Carried.*

Moved by Mr. MACRAE, Q.C., seconded by Mr. HUTTON:

That Dr. Alexander Johnson be Lay Secretary.—*Carried.*

Moved by Mr. HUTTON, and seconded by Mr. RALPH STEVENSON:

That Mr. C. J. Brydges be re-elected Treasurer.—*Carried.*

Moved by Canon NORMAN, seconded by Mr. F. W. THOMAS:

That Messrs. T. Simpson and N. S. Whitney be Auditors.—*Carried.*

The minutes of the last Session were considered as read, and confirmed as printed in the Twentieth Journal.

The BISHOP named Mr. E. Carter, Q.C., as Church Advocate.

He then appointed the Standing Committees of Synod. (See pages 124-6.)

The BISHOP then read his Address to the Synod as follows:

DEAR BRETHREN OF THE CLERGY AND LAITY,—

Since I last addressed you from this place I have had a full year's experience of work in the Diocese.

I shall endeavor now as your servant for Christ's sake, to recount to you the things which I have been able to accomplish within that period; to tell you of much which has of necessity been left undone; and also to set before you some of the difficulties which, for their removal, require your attention now, and your co-operation in due time and place.

Let me then briefly refer to the past. First, allow me humbly and heartily to acknowledge "the good hand of my God upon me." In all my journeyings I have known no discomfort either of health or circumstance. The kind reception everywhere accorded me has filled my heart with gratitude to God, and love to you my Brethren in Christ. I may own to you that your kindness and confidence have heavily increased the sense of all I owe both to Him and to you. I am more anxious than ever to be equal to the requirements of my office; but I am also humbled and weighted with a consciousness of insufficiency.

ORDINATIONS AND CONFIRMATIONS.

Since the meeting of Synod in June, 1879, I have visited ninety-seven missions and stations, in the country parts of the diocese. I have visited also the Churches of the city, and have confirmed in the country 535 persons, and in the city 171—252 men and 454 women—a total of 706. I have ordained to the ministry of the Church six deacons and four priests, and have admitted to Church work in the diocese, by license, seven clergymen and four laymen. Four churches and one chancel, viz., Arundel, Potton, Longueuil, Clarendon and Sutton, have been consecrated, and the foundation stones of three churches laid, viz., East Farnham, St. Stephen's of Montreal, and Frelighsburg. In addition to these regular duties, sundry meetings—missionary and conference—have brought me into contact with our brethren in the remote parts of the diocese, as well as here, in our centre, to our mutual edification, as I truly believe.

HOME MISSIONS.

I have the very great pleasure of informing you that we have paid our debts to the clergy. I cannot express my thankfulness that this stain on the honor of the diocese is at last removed, and I trust I shall not live to see the repetition of so grievous a trouble. I desire to make

public acknowledgment of the patience with which the body of our missionary clergy have borne their privations, and also of the help which kind-hearted individuals have rendered by increasing their gifts to the Mission Fund. I wish we could originate a method for the more prompt and regular payment of the stipends promised to our country clergy; and until something better can be devised, I would willingly see what is known as the "Quebec plan" in operation amongst us.

While on the subject of missions it is my duty to remind you that every day brings us nearer to the time when the Venerable Society for the Propagation of the Gospel will withdraw the assistance so long and so liberally accorded. The Diocesan Sustentation Fund to which chiefly we must look in the future for the means to extend our work, over the very large tracts of country which still remain to be possessed, does not receive that attention which in my judgment it deserves. Much has been said and written in the past about the necessity for local endowments, especially in those places now served by S. P. G. missionaries; and all that has been said and written on the subject I would be understood heartily to endorse. Still in most of these particular missions a very long time must elapse before a sufficient capital sum can be raised to render them independent. When they lose the services of the present incumbents either the churches must be closed, or a grant be made from the Mission Fund. It is most advisable, therefore, that these, at least, should make an annual collection on behalf of the Sustentation Fund upon which they will, so soon, have to lean for support.

FOREIGN MISSIONS.

You will naturally question the wisdom of additional appeals and collections while we have already so many. But it occurs to me that our sermon appointments might possibly be improved by revision. All our work on behalf of missions outside the limits of our own Diocese, might be brought forward during the week specially appointed for intercessory prayer and alms-giving, and this under the direction of a board of "Foreign Missions," to be appointed by the Synod. Some such organization would, I believe, bring new workers into the field, extend our usefulness and stimulate liberal action, and at the same time leave us space and opportunity to make just and honorable provision for our own needs, and those of our people.

DIOCESAN THEOLOGICAL COLLEGE.

As an institution which has given me great satisfaction and afforded me active assistance in the mission field, I am bound to make grateful mention of the Diocesan Theological College. It is now incorporated

by Act of the Provincial Parliament, and duly affiliated to McGill College. In plan and intention it is perfect in all its parts, and only needs the active sympathy and support of the diocese to make it the Bishop's right hand. It is capable of expansion and extension, and I earnestly desire for it the confidence of the Synod, that it may grow and prosper. There is a succession of young men, about as many as we can employ, who will thankfully follow our Theological course, when it can be done without separation from the Arts course of McGill. The instruction of these is a natural object of interest to the Bishop and Clergy, and an advantage to the whole Church. During the past year lectures, excellent in quality, and in kind precisely adapted to our needs, have been delivered. Archdeacon Leach, Canon Baldwin, Dr. Sullivan, the Revs. J. P. Dumoulin and J. Empson, have given their time and talents, without fee or recompense, to the great enriching of our course of study. I wish all our capable and experienced clergy would take part in this work in turn. They would find it to be its own reward; they would rejoice in their labors, as they felt the life and marked the intelligence of the generation which is to follow them. The college, moreover, enjoys the undivided attention of the Principal, the Rev. Canon Henderson, who, to the eminent qualification of a Trinity College Dublin degree possesses that which is invaluable in his present position, a practical and varied experience of mission work. Were he not present, I should be disposed to lay stress upon his personal virtues, his self-forgetfulness and general nobility of character, but I forbear, for reasons apparent. We have had twelve students on the college roll in the past year, all of whom, with one exception, belong to this country and diocese; of these gentlemen, four have graduated this year, one of them with honors, at McGill; and I have just admitted four to deacons' orders, and sent them to minister in different parts of the Diocese, in full confidence that they will justify the high expectations we have formed of them from our knowledge of their college life.

CLERICAL CONFERENCE.

I must now refer to some things which I hoped to have accomplished, but have of necessity left undone. Way has not been made for a general conference of the clergy. There are many things in our sacred profession which we ought to discuss together, in order to profit the Church at large. I refer of course to those duties especially appertaining to the pastoral office; these, by our Synodal constitution, are purposely excluded from the deliberations of the Assembly. They require and should have separate attention. I shall, however, venture to obtrude one of these duties upon you now, because it seems to me urgent.

Sunday Schools are not doing the work they can, and ought to do. In this, the centennial year of Sunday Schools, the subject must not be overlooked, and I have remitted the matter to a committee for action. We ought at least to institute enquiry into our own proficiency or neglect. Pending discussion, let me recommend that where schools cannot be organized, and teachers cannot be obtained, the pastors of the several congregations carefully instruct the children of their flock at stated times in public. Let them see that at least (using the language of the Prayer Book) "The Creed, the Lord's Prayer and the Ten Commandments, and all other things which a Christian ought to know and believe to his soul's health," are taught them while they are young, that their moral and religious education may be one in accordance with scripture, and the doctrine of our own Church. Those who can go beyond this (and I know that some have) and open classes for regular Bible instruction, should do so. I know there are difficulties in the country with which those in the city are unacquainted, and I believe mutual assistance and information would be gained by thoughtful conference, could opportunity be made for this purpose, as I hope it will before long. This is not the time to discuss "preaching," "parochial visiting," and such like duties, and yet I feel a general interchange of thought would, just now, be invaluable to both me and the clergy.

SELF-SUPPORT.

Although our matters financial are on a better footing than last year in some respects, they cannot be considered altogether satisfactory. Several of our missions are vacant because a suitable stipend cannot be raised, and many of our clergy are suffering, silently and cheerfully, but still suffering, from a galling and hopeless poverty. By degrees \$600 has come to be thought the maximum, instead of the minimum, sum per annum to be provided. In this it is high time that we devised more liberal things. An attempt has been made to classify missions. In one particular we remain, I am sorry to say, where we were last year, only two of the missions, so far as I know, have made any progress towards self-support, viz., Lacolle and Berthier. If blame there be, I cannot tell to whom it attaches, but I own to a feeling of disappointment. In his primary address to Synod in 1870, Bishop Oxenden states the number of the country missions to have been fifty-one, of which twenty-six received aid from the Mission Fund. Now, in 1880, the missions are forty-nine in number, thirty-eight receiving grants from the Mission Fund, and of these twenty-two belong to the original twenty-six; four, Sutton, Cowansville, Lacolle and Berthier having raised themselves to the dignity and privileges of Rectories. Besides,

of the original 51, five, viz., Knowlton, Waterloo, Bedford, Granby, Phillipsburg, have also become Rectories. These were served by stipendiaries of the S. P. G. I do not find, however, that they have in all cases complied with the terms laid down in our constitution for the formation of a Rectory. But of this I will speak presently. The present system of Deanery Reports, while it appears to afford valuable statistics for the general information of the Church, does not give me exactly what I want to help in this matter of enquiry into self support. The grant from the Synod to the Mission precedes the statement from the Mission as to what it can promise in the future. As no uniform habit of report has been obtained, no comparison of Mission with Mission can be instituted. I am unwilling, of course, to interfere with any part of existing routine which is of value for general purposes, but I am tempted to ask for an additional report to be furnished to myself, by every church or mission receiving aid from the Mission Fund. What I want to know is the amount of money raised in the mission, actually raised, not promised or subscribed only, between Easter and Easter of each year, and what proportion of that amount was paid to the Missionary in charge. If I could have this information within a fortnight of each succeeding Easter Monday, I should know what to recommend as a suitable grant to be made at the meeting of the Synod in June, and I should like it further to be understood that any mission failing to make such report within the given time, will be at a disadvantage in the allotment of grants from the Mission Fund. Allow me also to call your attention to the state of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund. It is not receiving the regular support which is its due. Few of our clergy can do more than provide for the needs of the day. It is therefore incumbent upon us carefully to maintain this particular fund, in order that our widows and orphans may not be neglected in the day of their necessity.

RECTORIES.

The Parish of Trinity Church in this city has been unable to overcome its financial difficulties. In fact the beautiful edifice in St. Denis Street has ceased to be the property of the Church. I am much indebted to the Rev. Canon Henderson, who, at my request, sustained the services there for many months without remuneration of any kind. I hoped continually that a way would be found out of our embarrassment, but though many schemes for the payment of the debt have been set on foot, nothing has come to a satisfactory issue. It is not impossible that the question may be judicially dealt with before the next meeting of Synod, a seizure having already been made on the Episcopal endowment fund. While on the subject of Rectories I am bound to say that

the Bishop too often finds himself called upon to assume responsibility in matters over which he has no control, until trouble or scandal draws him in. Nowhere, perhaps, in the diocese has he so little voice and so much anxiety, as in the conduct of a Synod Rectory. In the exercise of its rights a congregation requiring a Rector takes every one into its confidence except the Bishop. It asks the Bishop—almost requires him—to induct a clergyman, of whom little is known by the people amongst whom he is to minister. After an intimate but short acquaintance there is sometimes,—too often,—disappointment; then application is made to the Bishop and his influence sought in order to break the tie so hastily made. Nor is this the worst, a clergyman for whom the Bishop has no suitable employment is adrift upon the diocese. It ought to be understood that when a parish calls a rector without the express approval of the Bishop—when the Bishop concurs only because by the letter of the law he cannot help himself—that parish, must keep its rector and maintain him properly until he chooses to leave of his own free will, unless under our canons he shall become disqualified. I wish we could arrive at some more satisfactory system for the protection and improvement of Church property than any which at present exists. Perhaps centralization might be a gain. Records of insurance, sales, and such like might be deposited in the Synod office, and no changes effected without notice to the Secretary, who in his turn might notify the Bishop or other responsible authority, when any change affecting property is in contemplation. And in this connection I should like also to have united action in regard to the building of new churches and parsonages. It is desirable that all such edifices not erected without external aid should, as to size, value, design and locality, be subjected in some degree to the control of Synod. Mistakes are too frequently made by zealous but inexperienced persons whereby good money is injudiciously expended, and opportunities for the acquisition of valuable property lost.

I will not detain you longer, from the business which is before you, than to remind you how much depends upon the practical wisdom and disinterested legislation of this body. Every year should find us advanced in knowledge and power, in all things which touch the order and extension of the Church in this diocese. The Church, the living Church, must grow and prosper both in external and internal graces and virtues. These make up the strength and beauty of the Bride of Christ, and prepare her to meet her Lord. I pray that the Spirit of God may rest upon you and upon me, and inspire our deliberations. To that end let us suitably prepare our hearts for His reception. I affectionately counsel you now to bear in mind the dignity and high calling of the Church we represent. Let us put away from

among us all self-seeking, unholy rivalry and unseemly disputation, and unite in Christian energy on behalf of the common welfare. Then may we, with assurance, plead the promise of the Saviour to send the Holy Ghost the Comforter to guide us into all truth.

The address was warmly applauded during its delivery and at the close.

The Bishop presented a communication from the Bishop of Rupert's Land :—

To the Right Reverend the Lord Bishop of Montreal, the Reverend the Clergy, and the Lay Representatives of the Diocese of Montreal.

I address you, as I also address the other Synods of the Province of Canada, in consequence of circumstances of the greatest gravity for our Church as a body, and for members of our Church as individuals.

It is unnecessary for me to speak to Canadian gentlemen of the fertility of the land here, of its vast extent, and of the emigration that is coming to us at an ever-increasing rate. Still, I would place before you a few very impressive facts.

1. The land disposed of by Government from the establishment of a land office in 1872, up to October 31, 1877, was 1,400,000 acres; in the single year ending October 31, 1878, was 700,100 acres; in the single year ending October 31, 1879, 1,000,000 acres. Besides this large amount, mainly taken in homesteads and pre-emptions, nearly 2,000,000 of acres have been granted to meet claims by half-breeds and old residents. The large tract of land owned by the Hudson Bay Company is also now in the market. Emigrants are entering by purchase on land from both these sources. I have no doubt the record of land taken this year will show again a large further advance.

2. In 1870, there were 16 Protestant common schools; in 1877, 38; in 1878, 100. The number is continually increasing, showing the formation of new settlements of sufficient population for a school.

3. In 1870, there were 16 post-offices established; in 1878, 58 post-offices existing; in 1879, 120. Quite a number have been established since. I need not enlarge on the significance of these facts.

The Province of Manitoba and a considerable section of country in my diocese, west of the Province, are being covered with a sparse population. The difficulty of ministering to this population is almost inconceivable to outsiders.

The different settlers hold so much land. So many are single individuals. In too many cases, a proportion of the land is from one cause or other unoccupied. It is, therefore, very difficult to get together the first year or two of a new settlement a congregation of any size or power.

Then the population, such as it is, is composed of adherents of different bodies, one having a predominance in one district and another in another.

The practical outcome of the situation I have described is an impossibility of immediate self-support, or of anything approaching it in any new settlement.

The consequence of this is that any Church that cannot obtain at the present time practical help from outside, must lose any chance of establishing or extending itself through the rural settlements in the great country that is rising up here. This is becoming more and more our position.

Members of our Church from your diocese and the other dioceses of the Province of Canada, are to be found scattered in all directions over the face of the country. In many large districts, there is no minister of our Church to afford them the means of grace.

The Presbyterian Church of Canada guarantees \$700 to unmarried ministers and \$900 to married ministers. It supplies the main proportion of salary for over twenty ministers in this country, and the general interest shown by that body is very great. I believe the students of Knox College alone support a missionary here.

The Wesleyan body of Canada is mainly supporting over twenty ministers here.

We are not receiving from the whole Church of Canada help sufficient to maintain a single missionary.

We received on one occasion about \$290 from your diocese. I would earnestly ask of you at least \$500 yearly for a special missionary, and \$300 yearly to our Mission Fund for a few years.

We get no new grant from England exceeding \$486 a year, and we have now only one grant in the Province of Manitoba exceeding that sum. One or two clergymen have allowances for the past. This throws a great deal on the small mission fund we raise ourselves, and puts us at a great disadvantage with other bodies who are able to work new districts with missionaries having a salary fully guaranteed from outside.

Then we are in a very peculiar position as a colony. Most colonies have grown so slowly that before they are of any size there has been some city of importance that could help. Here there has sprung up within, I may say, two years, an enormous area covered with a sparse population, while every parish and settlement in the diocese has only temporary buildings, with one exception, from which, however, we cannot, on account of its general poverty, look for help. Winnipeg lies in four parishes. Every one of them has only what I may call a temporary church. There is not a single parish that is not burdened with its own needs.

I feel words cannot add to the force of those simple facts. I will only say that there is rising up here a country that will well repay any effort.

The inaction of the Church of Canada threatens, if continued, to lead to such disastrous results to our Church that, I am sure, the day is not distant when the Church of Canada itself will wonder at its want of foresight.

I believe that, notwithstanding your own mission calls, if a committee were appointed by the Synod, there might be a special effort that would not interfere with your own schemes. May I further ask the Synod to pass a resolution requesting its representatives to see that this question receive the attention of the Provincial Synod. I do not hesitate to say it is one that concerns seriously the duty and honour of the Church of Canada. I have been assured on all hands of a very kind welcome if I were to plead our cause in Canada. But neither my clergy nor myself can conveniently leave this. We are often at our wits' end to supply even regular stations. But I do not think that that would be the right position for either you or us. The other bodies think the development of this country worthy of their most anxious deliberations at their yearly councils. Nothing less than this can, on your part, meet the exceeding gravity of the case.

Asking you to bear with the earnestness of this appeal, and commending the matter to your prayerful and conscientious consideration,

CANON.

It shall be the duty of every rector or other incumbent in this diocese to furnish to the Executive Committee, on or before the first day of November in each and every year, a true, faithful and exact statement in detail, signed by such rector or incumbent, of any and all endowments and trusts held in favor of the parish or mission of such rector or incumbent, or in favor of any particular church or chapel or for the general purposes of the Church of England and Ireland, within such parish or mission, and of the mode in which each such endowment is invested, and of its exact condition at the time such statement is furnished.—*Carried.*

The Rev. Mr. MORATKHAN then addressed the Synod on the object of his visit to this country, namely, to raise funds for the erection of a school in Kurdistan.

The BISHOP read letters from the Archbishop of Canterbury and others in favour of the object in which the reve-

end gentleman is interested. A subscription list was opened and placed on the table, that members of Synod might have an opportunity of helping as desired.

Rev. J. W. GARLAND moved, seconded by Rev. H. W. NYE:

That instead of each parish or mission being responsible through the churchwardens to the clergyman for a certain sum to be paid to the clergyman yearly, the wardens and the clergyman, being a legal corporate body, shall be made responsible to the Lord Bishop of the diocese for such sum of money, and that the clergyman be paid his full salary out of the Diocesan Treasury.

This motion was referred to a committee to be appointed on the subject of the part of the Bishop's charge referring to the Quebec system.

Rev. Dr. SULLIVAN moved, seconded by Archdeacon LONSDALL:

That no clergyman shall be at liberty to solicit contributions for any object in any parish of this diocese, other than his own, without the consent of the Bishop of the diocese and of the clergyman of such parish.

It was moved in amendment by Rev. J. ROLLIT, seconded by Canon EVANS:

That the following words be added to the resolution, "Without the written consent of the Bishop of the Diocese."

Both motion and amendment were by consent of the House withdrawn.

Rev. Canon HENDERSON moved, seconded by Mr. GARTH:

That a committee be appointed to suggest limitations to the erection of churches and parsonages in this Diocese.

This resolution, being covered by the report of the Committee on Canons, was allowed to remain over for the present.

By permission of the House, a motion on the subject of Lay representation, by Mr. T. P. Butler, was withdrawn.

In the absence of Archdeacon Leach, Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON moved, seconded by Mr. GARTH.

That the report of the Committee on Canons together with Rev. Canon Henderson's motion, be adopted, excepting the canon as to the

erection of churches, which is permitted to stand over till next session.—*Carried.*

On motion by Canon NORMAN, seconded by Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON, the report of the Committee on Education was adopted.

On motion by Canon NORMAN, the report of Bishop's College, Lennoxville, which is in print, was *received.*

The Bishop pronounced the Benediction, and the meeting adjourned.

Rev. S. C. ROBINSON read a report of the Rural Deanery of St. Andrews.

Notices of motion were given by Mr. F. W. Thomas, Rev. G. C. Robinson, Mr. L. H. Davidson, Mr. Thomas, Rev. T. W. Mussen, Rev. G. C. Robinson.

Rev. Canon NORMAN moved, seconded by Mr. W. B. SIMPSON:

That any clergyman ministering in this diocese, and who is a regular subscriber to the Widows and Orphans Fund of the diocese, shall, on emigrating to the diocese of Algoma, and being employed by the then Bishop of that diocese, retain his claim on the Widows and Orphans

Fund of this diocese, provided always that—1st, he complies with the condition of regular subscription to the above-named fund, and takes up and remits to the Treasurer an annual collection on behalf of said fund; and, 2nd, that he does not remove to any other diocese than that of Algoma; it being expressly stipulated that the number of those clergy to whom this privilege is accorded, should never exceed three at any one time.

Moved in amendment by Mr. WHITE, seconded by Mr. WHITNEY:

That the resolution proposed by Canon Norman, appearing to be opposed to the existing Constitution, it be referred to the Widows and Orphans Committee for consideration and report.—*Amendment carried.*

Rev. Canon NORMAN moved, seconded by Archdeacon LINDSAY:

That, in accordance with the recommendation offered by his Lordship the Bishop in his charge recently delivered, "a Board of Foreign Missions" be appointed by this Synod at its present session. The functions of the aforesaid Board should be—1st, the dissemination of literature concerning mission work outside this diocese; 2nd, the collection of funds for such objects, with the special purpose of providing for the needs of the diocese of Algoma, and that to this Board should be committed the consideration of the resolution of the Provincial Synod at its last meeting, and the recent report of the Bishop of Algoma.—*Carried.*

Moved by Canon NORMAN, seconded by Rev. A. A. ALLEN:

That the Provincial Synod be respectfully requested at its next meeting, to consider the best method whereby the necessary funds for carrying on the work of the Missionary Diocese of Algoma may be raised, and that thereby the present bishop may be relieved of much harassing and anxious labour, which alike occupies his time, and lessens the energy which should be devoted to his directly spiritual duties. It is in this connection respectfully suggested that this end would be best attained through the appointment by the Provincial Synod of a central mission board.—*Carried.*

Moved by Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON, seconded by Rev. J. EMPSON:

That that portion of the report of the Committee on Vestries in Free Churches, advising a change in the Temporalities Act, section 23, be adopted, and that the Chancellor be authorized to take the necessary steps for making application to the Provincial Parliament and effecting said change.

Amendment carried.

The Synod adjourned till half-past two o'clock.

AFTERNOON SESSION.

The BISHOP having called the House to order,

Mr. BRYDGES moved, seconded by Archdeacon LINDSAY, the adoption of the report of the Committee on Superannuation, which recommended as follows:—

That the Clergy be notified that unless they comply with the following regulations, their names cannot be placed upon the list of those eligible for superannuation.

1. Each clergyman shall pay an annual fee of \$5, and also take up an annual collection in aid of the fund in each church and station within his charge.

2. Any clergyman may, for the time he has been in the Diocese, pay up all arrears at the rate of \$5 a year from 1870, when the fund was established, and such payment of arrears shall be treated as part of the payments required under the next clause.

3. No clergyman shall be eligible for superannuation until after ten years active service in the diocese, and until he has paid his annual subscription for ten consecutive years, and also taken up a collection in aid of the fund every year after the passing of this canon.

4. Each clergyman having complied with the above, upon being superannuated, shall receive a grant of \$300 per annum and \$10 per annum for each and every year of active service in the diocese above ten years; but in no case shall the allowance exceed in the aggregate \$600 per annum.

5. Until the fund shall have an income of \$1,200 a year, it shall be allowed to accumulate untouched.

6. That for the current year the sum of \$600 be appropriated out of the surplus of last year's income, to be applied by the Executive Committee to such cases of superannuation as may be decided upon, and that the same principle be adopted in future years as far as the funds will permit.

7. That the Resolution passed at the 17th Session of Synod (p. 808) be rescinded, as also all previous canons on the superannuation fund which conflict with these rules.

8. That the Resolution of the Synod to the effect that on the falling in of the present charges on the Clergy Trust Fund, the amount be transferred to the Superannuation Fund, be rescinded.

Mr. L. H. Davidson objected to the last three resolutions.

"Any clergyman satisfying the Executive Committee that he is incapable of, or being reported by the Lord Bishop of the Diocese as unfit for full duty in the Diocese, shall be entitled to superannuation, and to payment of a yearly allowance as hereinbefore provided."—
Carried.

It was moved by Mr. MACRAE, seconded by Mr. L. H. DAVIDSON :

That clause 4 of the report of the Committee on Superannuation be amended by adding after the words "\$300 per annum and," on the second line, the words following, namely, "in addition thereto the sum of:"—

The eleven receiving the highest number of votes shall be the delegates, and the next six highest following in order shall be substitutes to take, in the order of their election, the places of any delegates absent through sickness or any other cause. The delegates and substitutes elected shall remain in office till their successors are chosen.

REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE TO THE SYNOD
OF THE DIOCESE OF MONTREAL.

Adopted, see page 143.

The Executive Committee of the Synod of the Diocese of Montreal beg to submit to the Synod, at its twenty-first annual meeting in 1880, the following report of their proceedings during the past year.

MEETINGS.

The stated quarterly meetings were held in August, November and May; there were special meetings on 19th June and 18th February, and an adjourned meeting on the 9th instant.

At the meeting held after the close of last Synod, the Bishop named the several sub-committees, as printed in the Journal of the Twentieth Synod.

GRANTS.

Potton.—The sum of \$50 was added to the grant to this mission.

New Glasgow.—The sum of \$50 was added to the grant to this mission.

Lacolle.—A grant of \$100 for one year only, was made to this Parish.

Bristol.—A special grant of \$100 was made to Rev. W. H. Naylor for services in this mission.

Upton.—The sum of \$50 was granted for one year to this mission.

Glen Sutton.—The sum of \$100 was granted to Rev. J Ker.

Mr. W. M. R. Seaborn was voted a grant at the rate of \$50 per annum to be taken out of the Rawdon grant, for services as lay-reader in that mission.

Mr. A. J. Greer for services as lay-reader in Thorne, was voted remuneration at the rate of \$40 a quarter to be taken out of the grant to the mission.

The Committee has great pleasure in reporting that the balance in hand at the close of the financial year, has enabled the Treasurer to pay to the several missionaries the balance of the reductions which had to be made in their grants at the Synod of 1878. Of the reductions then made, one quarter was made good to the missionaries by means of a fund raised for the purpose by Mrs. G. W. Simpson.

The Treasurer's statements show the amounts received, and the disbursements made on account of this fund. It will be seen that it commenced with a balance in hand of \$99.44 and closed with \$2,033.47 to its credit. This result is to a considerable extent owing to the fact that several missions have been vacant for the past year, and the grants provided for them, were not needed.

The Treasurer reports a serious reduction in the rate of interest which he can obtain on safe investments. The Mission Fund will be injuriously affected in the item of interest received from the Sustentation Fund and the Clergy Trust Fund.

Notice has been received from the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel in Foreign Parts, that their grant to this Diocese, for the year 1880 would be £1200 Stg., being £200 less than the grant for 1879. Of the £1350 Stg. equal to \$6,498.76 received since last Synod, \$4,797.07 has been paid to the Clergy on the privileged list, leaving \$1,701.69 which was paid to Missionaries, forming part of the grants from the Mission Fund. The Bishop named the following Committee to consider the grants which the Committee should recommend to Synod for the present year 1880-1. Archdeacons Lindsay and Lonsdell, Canon Baldwin, Rev. G. C. "That the Executive Committee be requested to appropriate the sum of \$500, for the purpose of paying a Travelling Missionary, to be employed in the unoccupied districts of the Deanery of St. Andrews, and in such other places as the Bishop shall direct.

This will make the total appropriation for the year \$12,565.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

This fund now amounts to \$55,419.28. The Revenue from it last year was \$3,830.38; from which \$250.00 charged as proportion of expenses, was deducted, and the balance \$3,580.38 has been credited to the Mission Fund.

The Committee considered the resolution which was adopted at the last Synod, on the subject of local endowments, viz.: "That the following suggestion be referred to the Executive Committee: That all Parishes or Missions receiving aid from the Mission Fund shall, on the first Sunday of each month, take up an offertory collection for the formation or increase of a Parochial Endowment, and shall continue to do so until such Endowment shall produce annually the sum of \$400; and that the same mode of raising an Endowment Fund be recommended to all Cures which have no Endowment, or where Endowment is insufficient for the requirements, individually, of such Cures," and the Bishop was requested to bring the subject before the several Parishes and Missions in the Diocese.

CLERGY TRUST FUND.

The Revenue from this fund for the year was \$3,966.37 of which \$2,092.68 was paid to the clergymen who have a claim on the fund, \$250 charged as proportion of expenses, and the balance \$1,623.69 has been credited to the Mission Fund.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

This fund now amounts to \$4,190.96 an addition of \$841.37 being subscriptions and collections from the several parishes, and interest on the capital invested, less \$77.27 proportion of expenses.

WIDOWS AND ORPHANS FUND.

The revenue for last year amounted to \$4,261.58 of which \$1,890.00 has been paid to annuitants; \$250.00 proportion of expenses, and the balance \$2,120.58 added to the capital account. This fund now amounts to \$53,489.72.

The Committee on the Widows and Orphans Fund made the following report on matters referred to them by the Executive Committee. The report was adopted.

Rev H. W. Nye's application.—That on payment of the arrears of subscriptions \$57.50, Mr. Nye's name be placed upon the list of the Clergymen who have a claim upon the Fund, and that in accordance with his request he be allowed to pay in three annual instalments.

Annuity of the late Mrs. Bancroft.—That the Committee are of opinion that the annuity ceased at the death of Mrs. Bancroft; but in the absence of any precedent, they leave the decision in the hands of the Executive Committee.

The Committee also recommend that the Rev. A. A. Allen, who has made the annual collections in his parish on behalf of this fund, be permitted to pay the arrears of his subscription (\$30) in three annual instalments.

It shall be the duty of every rector or other incumbent in this diocese to furnish to the Executive Committee, on or before the first day of November in each and every year, a true, faithful and exact statement in detail, signed by such rector or incumbent, of any and all endowments and trusts held in favor of the parish or mission of such rector or incumbent, or in favor of any particular church or chapel or for the general purposes of the Church of England and Ireland, within such parish or mission, and of the mode in which each such endowment is invested, and of its exact condition at the time such statement is furnished.

CLASSIFICATION OF MISSIONS.

The following resolution adopted at last Synod, was referred to a sub-committee, appointed by the Bishop to consider and report upon it, viz :—

That the attention of the Executive Committee be called to that portion of the address of the Right Rev. the Lord Bishop of this Diocese at the present Synod in regard to—(1) The classification of Missions and readjustment of grants for and contributions to the Mission Fund. (2) The classification of Funds. (3) The advisability and necessity of reconsideration of the position of each Mission in case of a vacancy, to the end that the said Committee may take such steps as may be necessary to give effect to the recommendations of the Bishop.

The following report was adopted.

To the Executive Committee of the Diocese of Montreal :

The sub-committee to whom was referred the resolution of Mr. L. H.

Davidson, seconded by Mr. Garth, printed at page 31 of the 20th Synod Report of Synod, beg to report.

That your committee have held two meetings and have taken into careful consideration the matters referred to them; and respectfully recommend

That it is desirable that the parishes and missions of the Church in this Diocese should be divided into three classes to wit, New or Tentative, Progressive and Permanent missions to the intent that the funds at the disposal of the Executive Committee may be the better distributed, and that increased effort towards self-sustentation should be developed in missions and parishes capable thereof, or to which grants may have been made for many years.

That to this end the Executive Committee shall once in every two years, as also on the occasion of any vacancy occurring in any parish or mission, or at any time at the request of the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, review the circumstances of each mission or parish in the Diocese; and thereafter, and on conference with the local authorities, if they see fit, said Executive Committee shall fix the amount which, in their opinion, may reasonably be expected from each parish or mission during each year for Church purposes and specially for the mission fund, and (2) determine the amount of the grant from the mission fund to each parish or mission and whether the same shall remain as it had been, or be decreased or increased; that in the case of missions or parishes classified as "Progressive" a constant reduction in the grant from the mission fund should be aimed at, and such reduction, at such rates as may hereafter be fixed by the Committee, be carried into effect every two years, unless for special and substantial reasons, clearly established before the Executive Committee, such reduction be suspended in any year; that in the case of missions or parishes classified as "Permanent" as also in the case of progressive missions whilst remaining such, the contribution to the mission fund be fixed annually, and payment thereof be required as the condition upon which the grant made to any such mission will be paid; that in the case of new or tentative missions the result of each year's work be carefully examined and at the end of a fixed term the same should be either closed or placed on one of other of the lists firstly named, and be treated accordingly.

That no aid shall be given to any congregation, parish or mission which shall fail, after due notice, and without sufficient cause shown, to forward and pay to the Treasurer of the Diocese the amount so fixed as aforesaid, nor which shall be considered by the Committee unwilling to do its part towards the support of the clergyman and of the mission work of the Church.

That in case of a vacancy occurring in any parish or mission during the course of any year, the amount appropriated as grant thereto shall

cease; but the Lord Bishop of the diocese may, until the first meeting of the Executive Committee after the occurrence of such vacancy, apply a portion of such grant, not exceeding one-half of the amount payable for said term at the grant rate, for temporary services in such parish or mission; and said Committee shall at its first meeting fix the rate of appropriation for such special services until said mission or parish be again permanently filled. The balance of the grant, as appropriated by Synod annually to such parish or mission, shall revert to the general mission fund.

That after a careful examination of the list of missions and parishes presently receiving aid, your Committee recommended the following classification for the next two years:—

New or Tentative—Chelsea. Progressive—Adamsville, Aylmer, Bolton, Boscobel, Buckingham, Clarendon, Eardley, Edwardstown and Franklin, Grenville, Huntingdon, Iron Hill, Lachute and Arundel, New Glasgow, North Gore, North Shefford and Warden, South Ely, South Stukely, Papineauville, Potton, Upton, West Farnham, West Shefford. Permanent—Aylwin, Bristol, Hemmingford, Kildare, Laprairie, Mille Isles, Milton and St. Hyacinthe, Mascouche, North Wakefield, Onslow, Portage du Fort, Rawdon, Thorne.

TREASURER'S REPORT.

To the Executive Committee of the Diocese of Montreal:

I hand you herewith the accounts of the Diocese of Montreal for the year which ended on the 31st May, 1880.

They comprise the following:

1. Clergy Trust Fund.
2. Widows and Orphans Fund.
3. Sustentation Fund—Capital.
4. Sustentation Fund—Interest.
5. Superannuation Fund.
6. General Expense Account.
7. Mission Fund.

No. 6 is a new account, made out in accordance with the wishes of the last Synod. It contains all the expenses incurred on account of the Diocese, and after deducting credits, the balance has been charged in certain proportions to the different accounts. In apportioning these charges, I have gone upon the principle of charging each fund with a per centage of the expenses, proportioned to the amount handled during the year in each fund.

No. 1, Clergy Trust Fund, shows that \$3,966.37 has been received for interest, \$2,092.68 paid to the five clergymen now ranking on the fund, \$250 charged as its proportion of expenses, and the balance of \$1,623.69 carried to the credit of the Mission Fund. The capital of this fund is \$56,500, which is all invested.

portion of the General Expense account. Two of the annuitants on the fund have died since last Synod.

The subscriptions to this fund by clergymen were \$275.00, or \$17.50 less than last year. The collections in churches amounted to \$381.70, or \$262.74 less than for the previous year.

The sum of \$5,200 has been invested, and there is a sum of \$1,603.72 now waiting for investment. The amount of invested capital belonging to this fund is now \$51,886, or \$5,200 more than last year.

No. 3, *Sustentation Fund—Capital.* Several mortgages, amounting to \$5,800, have been repaid during the year, and \$4,191.81 has been received from various parishes, for local endowments, to be invested.

\$5,533.24 has been invested on mortgage during the year, and there is now \$8,239.09 on hand waiting to be invested. This includes the amounts belonging to local endowments.

The total amount of capital belonging to the Sustentation Fund is now \$72,839.09, of which \$17,419.81 is on account of local endowments.

No. 4, *Sustentation Fund—Interest.* The total amount received for interest was \$4,708.46, of which \$878.08 was for local endowments. \$250 was charged against this fund for expenses, and the balance of \$3,580.38 has been credited to the Mission Fund, being an increase of \$42.58.

No. 5, *Superannuation Fund.* A sum of \$1,800.00 on this account has been invested during the year, making the total now invested \$3,850.00. There is a balance on hand of \$340.96.

The subscriptions to this fund last year amounted to \$240.00, being \$20.00 less than for the previous year. The collections were \$286.18, or \$83.74 more.

No. 6, *General Expense Account.* The total amount of the expenses during the year was \$1,577.27, after allowing for credits received. This has been apportioned to the different funds as follows:

The amount received from the city churches was \$5,031.79, against \$6,728.13 for the previous year, shewing a reduction of \$1,696.34.

The country churches sent in \$2,246.52, against \$2,581.52 for the previous year, or a reduction of \$335.00.

The S.P.G. grant realized \$6,498.76, being less than the previous year by \$280.58. There will be a further reduction this year.

The amount received from the Sustentation Fund for interest was \$3,580.38, or more than the previous year by \$42.58; and the Clergy Trust contributed \$1,623.69, against \$1,828.80, or \$205.11 less than for the previous year.

The amount paid on account of special S.P.G. grants and pensions was \$4,797.07, against \$5,527.09, or a reduction of \$730.02.

The salaries paid to Clergymen amounted to \$10,417.88, and to \$100.00 for a special grant, making a total of \$10,517.88, as against \$11,327.33 for the previous year, or a decrease of \$809.45.

A further sum of \$1,140.11 was also paid last year, being the arrears due for 1878.

Several missions have been vacant during the last year.

The rate of interest has been steadily falling, and it is impossible now to get good mortgages to pay, except in exceptional cases, 7 per cent. interest. A good deal of money, invested at that rate, has been paid off during the year, and in most cases only 6½ per cent has been obtained on new mortgages.

I have now about \$10,000 to invest, but hope in a short time to have it all invested. This change in the condition of the money market has caused a great deal of work during the past year.

The amount paid for Clergymen's salaries is less than for several years previously, caused partly by several missions having been vacant during the year.

It will be observed that the increased balance at the credit for last year has been largely caused by the reduced amount paid for Clergymen's salaries.

I do not think that more than \$13,000 ought to be appropriated for salaries during the current year, looking to the diminishing rate of interest on investment, and to the certainty that further reductions will be made in the grant from the S. P. G.

The balance at the credit of last year's account cannot be considered as regular available income, and now that the balance has happily been brought on the right side, it will be prudent not to expend more than the probable yearly income, and always to keep a moderate balance on hand, to meet contingencies that may arise.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON CANONS.

In the report of the proceedings of the Eighteenth Synod, the Committee on Canons find the following motion referred to it (see page 951): "To change the words 'United Church of England and Ireland' wherever they occur in the Declaration, into the words 'Church of England.'" Your Committee are of opinion that inasmuch as the former designation, viz., "United Church of England and Ireland," has been already assigned by Act of Parliament, any change of designation might involve unforeseen difficulties of a legal nature, and they consider the proposed change unnecessary and inexpedient.

Instead of the passage (2nd paragraph 13th Article of the Constitution, page 1,066), "And a certified copy of every deed and deeds of consecration and boundaries of parishes and every acquisition of property shall be sent to him by the Rural Dean," the Committee recommend that the following be substituted, viz., "And a certified copy of every deed of gift or of other acquisition of property and of every act or resolution fixing the boundaries of parishes or missions, and of every deed of consecration of a church or burial ground, shall be sent to him as soon as possible after their date, by the Incumbent, Rector or Rural Dean, respectively of the parish, incumbency, church or rural deanery."

The Committee beg to call the attention of the Synod to the inconsistency that subsists between Article 12 of the Constitution (page 1,066) and the Act of Provincial Parliament, 22 Victoria, chap. 139, section 1, as to the subject of what constitutes a quorum of the Synod.

In the 20th Article, "For the Preservation of Order," the Committee recommend that the words "for the future" be left out, and that the following words be inserted after the words "their election,"—"or after furnishing the certificate required by the 6th Article of the Constitution."

The Committee beg to suggest that Article 2 of "Occupancy of Parsonages after Decease of Incumbents" (page 1,083), be taken up for further examination, and be remitted to the Committee for that purpose.

The Committee recommend the adoption of the following canon on the Erection, Consecration and Disposal of Churches:

CANON ON THE ERECTION, CONSECRATION AND DISPOSAL OF CHURCHES.

1. From and after the passing of this canon, no chapel or church nor any parsonage shall be erected in any parish or mission within this diocese until the sanction of the Lord Bishop of the diocese shall have been obtained in writing, and the plans thereof, together with the estimates, having been submitted to him, have been approved and

authorized, and that the Bishop be satisfied that the financial position of the parish or mission warrants the expenditure.

2. That the corner-stone of the foundation of every such church or chapel shall be laid by the Lord Bishop of the diocese or by his commissary or authorized representative, according to the forms, usages and practices of the heretofore United Church of England and Ireland; and before the laying thereof the title deeds of said property conveying the same to the Rector, Incumbent or other legal authorities of the church, parish or mission, or to the said Lord Bishop, for the purposes of said parish or mission, or of the Church of England in his diocese, shall first have been duly executed.

3. That any church now, or hereafter erected, within the said diocese, may be consecrated according to the forms and practices of the said Church of England and Ireland; but before consecration the deeds transferring said property to the Bishop of the diocese, for the use of the said parish or mission, and of the said church, shall have been first duly executed.

4. That every church within this diocese heretofore or hereafter to be consecrated, shall forever remain and be kept separate from all common, profane or secular uses; and in case of any such falling into disuse, or becoming unsuitable for use through decay or for other cause, the same shall not be sold, or otherwise disposed of, for any secular use, business, or purpose, but shall be taken down, and removed; but the material thereof may be used for enclosing and protecting the consecrated ground, if any there be, or for the erection of another church or chapel.

The Committee beg to refer to the following verbal omissions or inaccuracies:

In article 2nd of the Constitution, for "the rights," read "right."

In article 5th of the Constitution, for "was elected," read "has been elected."

In article 6th of the Constitution, for "be personally," read "is personally."

In article 7th of the Constitution, for "had been made," read "shall have been made."

In article 12th of the Constitution, for "no less than," read "not less than."

In article 5th, for the preservation of order, after "rise at" insert "the."

In article 16th, for the preservation of order, before "certain" insert "a."

In the Canon on Sermons, page 1,074, for the words "within any parish," read "by any parish."

In article 4th, Rural Deans, page 1080, for "parises," read "parishes."

In the 2nd paragraph, Church Wardens, page 1,084, for "the out-going Church Wardens," read "the out-going Church Warden."

In the 9th paragraph, Church Wardens, page 1,084, for "agains," read "against."

In the Canon on Communicants, page 1,085, leave out the word "hereafter."

REPORT OF THE SPECIAL COMMITTEE OF THE WIDOWS AND ORPHANS FUND.

With reference to the extension of reciprocal privileges to the various dioceses of this Ecclesiastical Province.

The Committee appointed at last Synod beg leave to report:—

1. Correspondence has not resulted in eliciting any special desire for any reciprocal arrangement.
2. That the Committee feel that the Widows and Orphans Fund is one which needs to be guarded for its benevolent purposes with especial care.
3. That absolute reciprocity is the only condition upon which its privileges ought to be extended to clergymen coming from other dioceses.
4. That when in any diocese a Widows and Orphans Fund exists in such prosperity as to approach to equality in its benefits to our own, and when the Synod or controlling body of such fund in any diocese notifies the Bishop of this diocese of their desire for a reciprocity of privileges herein, with a certificate of the passage of the necessary enactments to give legal effect to the same, then the Bishop of this diocese shall direct the notification of the fact to the clergy of the diocese, which reciprocity of privileges shall continue until withdrawn by like authority and notification.

The Committee paid Samuel Johns, according to agreement, for one year. He has since been ordained, and entered into another sphere of labor.

The Committee has had brought before it an appeal of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, which they consider demands the earnest attention of the Synod. The Secretary of the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel writes thus:—"I am instructed by the Society to propose to the Bishops and Diocesan Synods or Committees who administer the Society's grants, to cause in every Christian congregation which derives help from the Society an annual collection to be made to assist the Society in its missionary work among the heathen in India."

The Committee would recommend to Synod to give the Foreign Mission collections to the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel for their work in India—the very object to which it has been applied. Considering the large sums of money received from that Society for our missions, which, with all its reductions, was last year \$6,498,—one-third of the total sum expended for our missions in this diocese—the Committee hopes that every mission and parish will take up the Foreign Mission collection and allow it to be administered by the Society for the Propagation of the Gospel, which has through so many years been the greatest support of our missions. During the year two leaflets have been issued—one about our missions in India, the second about our missions in Africa.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON WORKS OF MERCY.

The Committee on Works of Mercy beg to report that the Chaplain for the Hospital having resigned, the office is at present vacant.

1. The Committee feel that it is most desirable that there should be a City Missionary, who, in addition to the work of the hospitals, should attend to the members of our Church in the different city charities, and to the young people coming into the city from the country, who very often, for want of a little care, cease to attend church.

2. The Church in Canada has no organized system for the care of emigrants, although it has received such large sums from the Society whose great object is to follow the emigrant. A Bishop at the Pan Anglican made the statement that more members were lost to the Church of England by want of care for emigrants, than she gains by all her Foreign Missions. Increased interest is being awakened in the Church of England upon this subject, which it is hoped will lead to more care about it.

3. The subject of the Jails in the Diocese came before the Committee. Application was made to each of the Rural Deaneries as to what jails there were in each Deanery, what religious ministrations were held in each for members of our Church, and if any effort was made when such left the jails to endeavor to start them in a new course of life.

In St. Andrew's Deanery there are two jails, one at Aylmer and one at St. Scholastique.

In Hochelaga Deanery there are three, one in Montreal, one at St. Vincent de Paul, one at Joliette.

In Iberville Deanery there is one at Beauharnois.

In Bedford Deanery there are three, one at Sweetsburg, one at St. Johns, and one at St. Hyacinthe.

The Committee thus far have not been able to find out that there are any regular ministrations in any of the other jails for those in them who may be members of our Church, or that any effort is made to lead such, after they leave the jail, to a better course of life. It is a subject which they would commend to the attention of Synod.

REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON INTEMPERANCE.

Your Committee regret that they are not able to report regarding any particular work done in the diocese during the past year. They know that in many parishes there are various zealous associations in existence; and they would suggest that during the coming year reports should be obtained from each parish of the work being done by associations in connection with the Church. They desire to express their deep conviction of the importance of this branch of the Church's work, and trust that in every parish the promotion of temperance may be specially commended.

REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON SUNDAY SCHOOLS.

To the Lord Bishop of the Diocese, and Members of Synod assembled:

Your Committee, feeling that before any suggestions could be made or any real work done, in the way of ameliorating our Sunday School system, it would be absolutely necessary to obtain, as far as possible, statistics as to the present state of our schools throughout the diocese, formulated, after a great deal of reflection, the following questions, to be submitted to all the various rectors and incumbents, being convinced that, if they were only carefully answered, the information desired would be fully obtained.

The questions submitted were as follows:—

QUESTIONS.

1. How many Sunday Schools have you under your care?
2. Are they held continuously throughout the year?
3. How many scholars are there on the roll of each school, male and female?
4. What is the average attendance at these schools?
5. How many teachers in connection with them?

6. Have you lay superintendents over your schools?
7. Have you any regular course of Biblical instruction?
8. Is the Catechism taught?
9. Have you any monthly periodicals circulated among your schools?
10. How many volumes in each of your libraries?
11. Do your schools contribute to any foreign missionary work?
12. Are you able personally to supervise the working of your own Sunday Schools?

To these enquiries 62 parishes replied, and therefore the information obtained may be considered eminently satisfactory, inasmuch as it fairly represents the present state of Sunday Schools throughout the Diocese. The parishes which have not replied to our questions are those at present without clergymen in charge, and, there being no one to give us the necessary information, we were compelled to omit them from our calculations, though we have no doubt that in some of them there may be not only excellent Sunday Schools, but libraries and other adjuncts of the system.

As the statistics obtained are of great importance, and reveal in the clearest way the actual strength and vitality of our schools, we trust the Synod will give them its careful consideration.

- (1.) Number of Sunday Schools actually in existence throughout the diocese, 94; but, allowing for parishes which have not answered, 100.
- (2.) Of these, 60 only are held continuously throughout the year. Allowing for parishes which have furnished no statistics, 65.
- (3.) Number of scholars at present on the roll: Male, 2239; Female, 3386. Total, 5625. Allowing for parishes not heard from, 6000.
- (4.) Average attendance of both sexes, 3384.
- (5.) Teachers, 508.
- (6.) Schools in which there are lay superintendents, 36.
- (7.) Schools in which there is a regular scheme of Biblical instruction, 76.
- (8.) Schools in which the Catechism is regularly taught, 78.
- (9.) Schools in which monthly periodicals are circulated, 48.
- (10.) Number of volumes in libraries, 13,552.
- (11.) Schools which contribute to foreign missions, 24.
- (12.) Schools which have regular clerical supervision, 75.

After considering these statistics, your Committee humbly begs the attention of the Synod to the following recommendations:—

- (1.) The great importance of holding the Sunday School continuously throughout the year; that is, if circumstances will so allow, thereby obviating the confusion that must of necessity ensue where there is a total suspension of work.
- (2.) The advisability of increasing the number of scholars in actual attendance.

In order to effect this, your Committee would suggest that the various clergymen in charge should bring the subject of Sunday Schools continually before the attention of their people, in order to arouse them to a greater earnestness in the matter. The importance of the Sunday School may be stated as resting not only on the invaluable religious instruction it is calculated to convey, but also on the following considerations:—

(a) That the bringing together a large number of children, under proper superintendence, has the effect of creating a bond of love and sympathy between our members which would not otherwise be likely to exist.

(b) That in this way the minister and the younger members of his flock become better acquainted with each other than they would under any system of parochial visitation.

(c) That children educated in a well-conducted Sunday School become practically acquainted with Church work, and are thus taught more faithfully to discharge the duties of that Divine stewardship which has been entrusted to us all.

(d) That the growing tendency to abolish all Biblical instruction from the ordinary secular schools of the country, and the increase, which candor compels us to admit, of infidelity, rationalism, and other soul-destroying influences in these our days, render each year the duty of the Church more imperative to secure in every possible way the spiritual education of her young, and your Committee know of no way so effectual to this end as the Sunday School, that is, when developed under God's blessings to that position which it may reasonably be expected to assume.

(3.) The importance of clergymen obtaining, if possible, lay assistance in the superintendence of their schools, as thereby the energies of devout laymen find a salutary field of operation, and their sympathy with this department of Church work is greatly increased.

(4.) That there should be a regular form, or scheme, of biblical instruction throughout the diocese, as thereby uniformity would not only be obtained, but also expository works on the lesson of each week might be secured. The material help given by such books would be appreciated alike by teacher and by taught. Your Committee would also suggest that they be allowed to take steps to secure such a scheme during the coming year.

(5.) That monthly periodicals, of a character likely to edify and interest the scholars, be circulated throughout our schools. In order to effect this, as well as to increase the Sunday School libraries at present in existence, your Committee would suggest the formation in this city of a Church of England Depository, from which clergymen could obtain books and periodicals for their schools at the lowest possible rate.

(6.) In order to secure uniformity in Catechetical instructions, your Committee would suggest that the Catechism be divided over the year, and the portion to be learned each week attached to the proposed scheme of Biblical instruction.

(7.) That all the Sunday Schools throughout the diocese be recommended to make regular stated collections for purely foreign missionary work. This they would urge not only because we are all bound to spread as far as possible the Gospel of Jesus Christ, but because by teaching the children to contribute to missions, we educate them as to their responsibilities to others, and may reasonably hope that as Divine grace illuminates them they will realise more fully the missionary character of the Church, and be led in after years to play an important part in the great work of spreading Christ's truth on earth.

(8.) That the ordinary running expenses of the Sunday School be charged to the church of the parish.

In conclusion, your Committee desire to thank the various clergymen who have kindly furnished us with statistics.

It was recommended by the Deanery that the Endowment Committee be called upon to make enquiry about the sum of \$400 said to be willed by the late Rev. J. P. White to Chambly.

SUPERANNUATION FUND.

Seventeen incumbencies have contributed to the Superannuation Fund.

REPORT OF THE RURAL DEANERY OF BEDFORD.

MY LORD :

The eighteenth annual meeting of the deanery of Bedford was held at Waterloo on June 1st instant, the Bishop presiding. There were present eighteen clergymen and seventeen laymen, representing twenty-two incumbencies.

Reviewing the events of the past year, and submitting the general condition of the parishes of the deanery, to your Lordship's consideration, as exhibited in the accompanying schedule of statistics, we venture to lay before you the following circumstances, which are found grouped together under their respective heads:—

RESIGNATIONS.

Rev. E. Archibald has resigned the mission of North Shefford; Rev. R. D. Mills, the rectory of Dunham; Rev. H. W. Nye, the parish of West Shefford; Rev. T. A. Haslam, the rectory of Granby; Rev. R. Ker, the mission of Potton, and Rev. O. J. Booth his position as assistant at St. Johns.

APPOINTMENTS.

Rev. W. Jones has resumed his labours in the diocese with recruited health, and has been appointed to the mission of Brome; Rev. L. N. Tucker to the mission of Sabrevois; Rev. H. W. Nye to the rectory of Bedford; Rev. F. R. Smith to the parish of West Shefford; Rev. G. A. Forneret to the rectory of Dunham, and Rev. A. Lee to be assistant in the parish of Abbottsford and Rougemont.

VACANCIES.

The rectories of Granby and Philipsburg are vacant. Philipsburg is, however, under the temporary charge of Rev. W. Westover. The mission of Potton, vacant at the time of holding the deanery meeting, has since been supplied by the appointment of Rev. T. A. Haslam. Rev. J. Ball has ministered in the mission of North Shefford during the past year, and for this additional labour he has received from the people the inadequate remuneration of \$44.50. The Deanery would, therefore, recommend that the sum of \$50 be paid him out of the appropriation made at last meeting of Synod for North Shefford.

CHURCHES.

Rev. C. G. Kilner is erecting a church at East Farnham, in the mission of Adamsville. The church at West Potton, in the mission of Glen Sutton, is now completed under the indefatigable exertions of Rev. J. Ker, and has been consecrated at the recent visit of the Bishop.

The venerable church at Frelighsburg, the mother church of this part of the Eastern Townships, and long an object of deep interest to every churchman among us, from its association with the revered memory of Bishop Stewart, its founder, and of the late Dr. Reid for nearly fifty years its rector, has now, with all its historic reminiscences, to be reckoned with the things of the past. bling in their decay, endangered the lives of the congregation, and common prudence demanded the removal of an edifice which none desired to retain more than they who had passed their lives beneath the sacred shadow of their beloved sanctuary. It is gratifying to learn that this ancient church is about to be replaced by a beautiful and more durable structure, erected to the memory of the original founder of the parish, Miss Reid contributing \$1000 for the building of a chancel in memory of her father, the late rector.

The building intended for a church at Mystic, in the rectory of Bedford, still remains unfinished. The property is now in the hands of a lady in Montreal, who is prepared to resign her claim to it, provided it be completed and be used as a church.

The church at Henryville, in the rectory of Clarenceville, which largely owes its existence to the munificence of the late Major Christie and members of his family, is in a dilapidated state. It appears desirable that this church should be kept in repair, and if not required for any local English population, it might still be found exceedingly useful for mission work among the French.

PARSONAGES.

The parsonage at Glen Sutton has been improved by the addition of convenient outbuildings. That at North Shefford still remains in an unfinished state, which may be attributed to the fact that no clergyman has yet been appointed to the mission.

In connection with the foregoing subjects of Churches and Parsonages, the Chapter would recommend that a standing committee be annually appointed by the Synod to take into consideration the propriety of the erection or extensive alteration of such buildings, and that no such works should be undertaken without the consent of the Bishop, based upon the report of the Committee.

LOCAL ENDOWMENTS.

The subject of Local Endowments, although one of supreme importance, to the maintenance of our parochial organization, is confessedly attended with many difficulties. Unreasonable prejudices are found to exist in some localities against their formation. It seems desirable that the attention of the various congregations should be constantly directed to the subject, and no better means to this end suggests itself than the adoption of a recommendation of this Chapter, made in its session of June, 1863, that a sermon should be preached annually in each congregation urging the establishment of a local Endowment Fund.

We are of opinion, judging from the report in the proceedings of the last Synod, that the condition and investment of existing local endow-

ments are fitting subjects for careful investigation. It is desirable that all investments within the parishes to which the endowments respectively belong should be strictly examined. There is a danger of favour being extended to individual members of a congregation to the detriment of a fund in which all are interested, and which should be carefully guarded with unflinching firmness and fidelity.

RECTORIES.

There are several rectories in this deanery to which the privilege of selecting their own clergyman has been tacitly conceded, without a compliance with the requirements of the canon on status of parishes. The Chapter would, therefore, submit the consideration of this irregularity of practice to the attention of the Synod.

EMPLOYMENT OF YOUNG MEN NEWLY ORDAINED.

The Chapter recommends that all young men, first ordained or appointed to a cure, be placed under the direct control of a clergyman in priest's orders for a period of twelve months.

CONTRIBUTIONS TO THE MISSION FUND.

4. Respecting the Mission Fund, it was resolved that special collectors should be appointed in each parish to collect in its behalf.

5. In connection with Clergyman's Stipend, it was found that Hemmingford and Hinchinbrooke were in arrears. Explanations from respective Incumbents were considered and accepted.

6. On the question of Insurance. There is no insurance on Church property in this Deanery, except at Lacolle. It was resolved that the Executive Committee be required to insure all Church property in parishes and missions, and that said parishes and missions be assessed therefor *pro rata*, by the said committee.

7. With reference to the Superannuation Fund, the Deanery recommends that 50 per cent., at least, of the balance of the Clergy Trust Fund be annually appropriated for this fund.

8. In discussing the nature of Missions, the Deanery recommends that the Executive Committee reconsider the fact of the mission of Edwardstown being progressive. An opinion which said meeting maintains to be utterly untenable.

9. On considering the Reconstruction of Parishes and Missions, it was recommended that, from Napierville to St. Remi, the mission should be supplied by a man to preach occasionally in both languages.

10. That Edwardstown and Havelock be conjoined under one missionary.

11. That Franklin and a portion of Hinchinbrooke be similarly worked, and that whatever be deducted from present salaries of the incumbents, as under existing division, be refunded by Executive Committee.

DEANERY OF ST. ANDREWS.

MY LORD,—

The annual meeting of this Deanery was held at Aylmer on the second day of June, 1880.

Reports were received from nearly all the missions in the Deanery.

After careful consideration of the condition and circumstances of the several missions, it was agreed that no increase in the amount "proposed to be raised" for the Mission Fund could reasonably be expected from any mission at present, and that no mission could bear a reduction in its grant, the stipends of the missionaries being already far below the moderate standard adopted by Synod, and barely sufficient to secure even the necessaries of life.

The mission of Chelsea, Templeton and Portland has been vacant now about two years. Buckingham has been vacant one year. Thorne has been without a pastor for fourteen months, excepting that it has been partially served by a catechist since January last. New settlements in townships beyond the limits of present missions, and the lumbering districts, have been entirely without the ministrations of the Church. In view of this destitution the following resolutions were unanimously passed, viz:

Resolved,—"That this Deanery would again put on record an earnest expression of its feeling with regard to the want of sufficient missionaries in this part of the diocese. That certain missions have been without an ordained pastor for from one to two years, which has resulted in serious loss to the Church in those missions, and has had a depressing effect on the neighboring missions."

Resolved,—"That this Deanery respectfully and urgently desires to press upon the attention of Synod the desirability of employing a missionary to labor in the scattered settlements beyond the present missions, in the districts of the Upper Ottawa, and to visit the 'shanties' in the winter."

Attention having been directed to the large amount of Church property reported as not insured, it was unanimously

Resolved,—"That this Deanery requests the Synod to take action to secure the carrying out of the Synod rule regarding the insurance of Church buildings." (Report of 18th Synod, page 1084.)

The want of a more efficient system in the collection and payment of the Clerical Stipends, led to the adoption of the following resolution, viz:—

Resolved,—"That this Deanery would again respectfully recommend the adoption of the 'Quebec Plan,' as adapted to the present circumstances of the diocese."

Resolved,—"That this Deanery respectfully requests the Synod to take legal advice as to the constitutionality of the Bishops of the Church of England in the Province of Quebec issuing Marriage Licenses."
