He was quite sure that he need not reiterate the expressions of sympathy which, like a thrill, passed over and through the community when the news of St. John's awful visitation was spread—that thrill of sorrow and regret was still remembered, and the general heart of the Province sympathized to-day as strongly as ever with our stricken fellow-citizens of the destroyed commercial metropolis in their great affliction.
