# THE OVERTURN IN ALBERTA.

The end of the first stage in the Alberta railway scandal has arrived. Premier Rutherford has resigned, and Chief Justice Sifton has retired from the Supreme

The end of the first stage in the Alberta railway scandal has arrived. Premier Rutherford has resigned, and Chief Justice Sifton has retired from the Supreme Court to take his place as leader of the administration. It is announced that Mr. Sifton accepts the position at the particular request of Sir Wilfrid Laurier. Mr. Rutherford was also chosen at Ottawa when he became the first premier of Alberta. Self government is only in the preliminary stages in the west.

But the right of individual judgment went far enough to cause more than a third of Mr. Rutherford's supporters to withdraw their support when the facts of the railway gratting operations came to light. # THE MONCTON AGREEMENT.

Voters of the city of Moncton have almost unani-mously endorsed the agreement made by the city council with the "Moncton Tramways, Electricity and Gas Com-pany, Limited." This agreement transfers to the comany from the city all the electric lighting and gas light

pany from the city all the electric lighting and gas lighting plant, and authorizes the company to sell light and power, and to establish a street railway system. The company agrees to supply electric lights for public and private use, to provide the street railway and to bring natural gas into the city for light and power purposes. This contract is the result of the discovery in Albert county, within a few miles of Moncton, of natural gas in quantities sufficient, as it is believed, to supply all the requirements for all these purposes. Natural gas will be supplied to those who need it for light, heat and power. It will be changed into electricity for the other purposes. The contracting company is the corporation or is controlled by the corporation which owns the gas wells.

The agreement contains some features which may excite the envy of St. John. It reduces the cost of street lighting. It reduces the price of electric light for private use from twelve cents to eleven cents per kilowatt hour. It provides that the company shall furnish natural gas for light and heat to Moncton customers at not more than fifty cents per thousand, while the price of gas for power purposes must not exceed forty cents. These rates, especially those for natural gas, seem rather attractive. em rather attractive.

As a return for the money which the city has invested in the existing plant there will be a rental paid to the city of not less than \$10,000. This is the minimum payment, but the exact amount is made up by a







