

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 1857.

PRESENTED 5TH JANUARY, 1858.

GENTLEMEN,-The Board of Management of the St. George's Society, on retiring from their respective offices, have the honor to submit to the members a General Report of the proceedings and condition of the Society during the year 1857.

As a national Society we have passed through 22 years, constantly endeavoring to carry out the happy idea which prompted our formation as an English institution—our success in relieving indigent fellow countrymen has steadily increased, and we are this day in prosperous continuance in the cause of charity. Hitherto we have met the numerous demands to which our position has rendered us liable, enabled so to do, by members being added to our body, and the usually fair state of our Treasurer's account. We humbly trust that by the blessings of a kind Providence, and our own united exertions, our noble Society may long continue to prosper, and pour forth its charity to any of our fellow-countrymen who may be unfortunate enough to require our aid.

St. George's Day was, as usual, celebrated by the members attending divine service at the Cathedral. The Lord Bishop preached a beautiful and very appropriate sermon on the occasion, and an excellent musical service was performed under the direction of our talented artist, Henry Carter, Esq., assisted by ladies and gentlemen attached to his excellent choir, and others to whom the Society beg to tender their best thanks.

The collection in aid of the Charitable Fund amounted to £22 13s 6d.

Balance from Ball Committee, £12 15s. 5d.

With satisfaction your Committee refer to the Report of the Sub-Committee of Charity. The demands on the Society have been more numerous than tast year, although a smaller amount has been paid out.

The number of cases relieved is 86, last year the number was 69. £129 12s. 6d. has been expended, the amount last year was £132 17s. 6d.

During the past year the Society has to lament the loss by death of six of its members.

The Earl of Ellesmere, a life-member, died in England on the 18th of February.

George Ardouin, life member, died in Quebec, 23rd February, aged 34.

Wm. Doponi, life member, died in Three-Rivers, on the Sth November.

Edwin King, died in Toronto on the 3rd of May.

John Rowbottom, died in Quebec on the 6th of May.

James Maclaren, died in Quebe on the 26th of June.

Ten new members have been added to our list during the past year. One ordinary member has become a life member.

The permanent fund now amounts to £1416 8s. 9d. Balance to the credit of Charitable Fund, £50 2s. 2d.

Before concluding the Report, the Committee would acknow-

ledge the kind and prompt manner in which the Victoria Hospital Committee responded to its request, that the amount of £44 10s, 10d, presented as a donation should be returned, the Society being responsible for its repayment when required.

The Committee would also refer gratefully to the valuable assistance rendered by A. Hawkins, Esq., in facilitating the passages of distressed Englishmen, to their native land.

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REPORT

OF THE

CHARITABLE COMMITTEE ST. GEORGE'S SOCIETY.

Your Committee have much satisfaction in laying a statement of their proceedings before the Society, which will be found similar to that of the preceding year.

During the past year, relief has been afforded in Eighty-Six (86) cases, at an expenditure of £129 12s. 6d. currency.

In addition to the usual revenue for Charitable purposes from the Invested Funds of the Society, your Committee have received from the Governors of the projected Victoria Hospital the sum of £44 10s. 10d., on the condition that should at any time hereafter a similar project be carried out the said amount to be refused to that Institution.

Your Committee have prudently and faithfully (as far as in their power) expended the monies entrusted to them, but they fear that occasionally they may have been deceived by misrepresentations, and want of due investigation into cases by the Members before recommending applicants for relief.

Considering the present general distress, and as a means of dimnishing misrepresentation, your Committee would recommend that the sum of £10 be given to the Ladies' Protestant Relief Society, whom, from their frequent visitations of the poor. Would more economically carry out the objects of the Society, by relieving the deserving poor of our Countrymen than can be done by the casual gifts of your Committee.

The Treasurer, in presenting his Annual Report, has again the pleasure of congratulating the St. George's Society upon its great extent of usefulness, which the transactions of the Charitable Committee during the past year will amply testify; no less a sum than £129 12s. 6d. having been administered to the necessities of their afflicted countrymen since the period hast year.

The receipts for Subscriptions and Entrance Fees amount to £34 53. £18 5s. of which was received from New Members, leaving the small sum of £16 collected on the subscriptions of old Members.

The amount of the Permanent Fund is £1416 8s. 9d. being a small increase of £5 since the last statement.
