## "Potato Canker" Disease.

This is the same disease that was first detected at Red Island, in Placentia Bay, about a year ago, and is so fatal in possibility of growing potatoes in Newfonndland for years possibinity of growing pot

The Agricultural Board therefore requests that all potato growers who may observe indications of disease in their crop will at once notify the Secretary of the Agricultural Board at the office of the Department of Agriculture and Mines.

The Agricultufal Board recognizing the incalculable injury that must accrue to the country if this diseáse be not immediately stamped out earnestly requests all perso
In February last the Agricultural Board issued an illustrated pamphlet from a special recport by Professor Gussow on this disease. Some thousands of copies were now requests that potato growers in any affected Distric will procure a copy of this report and be guided by its recommendations.
