





"Left Bay of Islands on Thursday at 6 a.m. and arrived at Battle Harbour at 8 a.m. on Sunday Had fine weather the whole trip, but very cold on Friday and Saturday. The thermometer registered 1 below on Labrador. All the harbors are frozen over which made it difficult to land freight; five hours butting ice in getting into the wharf at Hawke's Bay; large quantity of slob ice in the Straits."






