TRADE AND FINANCIAL

The value of turpentine has been an uncertain quantity for some time. One week it shows a decline of 1/2 a gallon, while the other a gain of 1/2 or more is recorded. This week the market opened with more than usual excitement. In Savannah the merchants were afraid to buy, while telegrams to New York from dealers in Toronto for quotations brought responses which fell to the ground in consequence of the refusal of Weaver to sign the dollar. He says that Weaver is well known in Toronto and throughout Western Ontario, and several local creditors.

Stocks of prunes in this city are reduced to a minimum and a scarcity is staring wholesalers in the face. The cause seems to be largely the result of misadventure. The market for prunes is a big crop of apples this year and its preparations would to a large extent take the place of prunes as an article of consumption. The expectations have not yet materialized. On the contrary, the demand for prunes does not seem to have been even detected in the least and dealers now find themselves short.

The truthfulness of the old proverb, "Necessity is the mother of invention," has again been exemplified. For some time the Fraser River salmon cannery have been utilizing the river as a sewer for their fish oil and other waste refuse. Mr. Wilcox, superintendent of fish culture, estimated that in 1929 443 tons was disposed of in this way. The Fisheries Act of Canada forbids the dumping of fish oil or any other deleterious matter into waters frequented by fish, and last year the Federal Government intimated to the cannery that the law would be enforced and that the cannery was to be held responsible for the pollution of the river. The cannery refused to accept the law and the Government in the light of an unjust interference with their rights, sought to have the law annulled. The cannery's lawyers are now croaking about their ill-luck other than about devising new means for disposal of the oil. Mr. T. K. Linder of the Lepid cannery has announced that he is going to make a game of it. He decided the experiment and the result is a fish guano which Professor Saunders, Director of Fisheries, has examined and found to be of great value. He is now making arrangements to be proposed to add fish oil refuse to his repertory. There is nothing that succeeds like success.

The advance in the price of grain will tend to lighten farmers' deliveries. Owing to the complaints which have been heard from time to time a good many farmers were inclined to clean out their bins forthwith. With the prospect of enhanced values and a chance to get a good deal of extra profit they will defer their intentions till spring.

The art of adulteration seems to keep pace with the leather market. It is among the latest articles of commerce to come under the microscope of the adulterator. The object of the adulteration is to bestow upon the leather a weight which it has no right to possess. The practice seems to be confined to portions of Europe.




