First Mate Guilty.

First Mate Gality. London, Feb. 9.—To-day's proceed-ings in the trial of the first and sec-ond mates of the British ship George T. Hay, who, with fifteen of the crew of the vessel, were brought here on Jan. 8, charged with causing the death of a seaman named Brostrom by ill-treatment during the voyage of the ship from Mobile, Aug. 24, 1896, to Rio Janeiro, where she arrived Nov. 22 last, resulted in the conviction of the first mate, Fraser, who was found suilty by the jury of having inflicted unlawful punishment upon Brostrom. The court postponed sentance upon Fraser until the completion of the trial of the second mate and the fifteen sea-men, which will take place to-morrow.
