Principal Scott Makes an Announcement That Will Interest Embryo School Teachers.

erest to school teachers, was made J. the expiring term, remarked Normal School term, as at was too short for the study of the study o present, was too short for the students to do what the Education De fits amounting to the satisfactory sum of he prophesied that, if they would watch the papers for a few days, they would likely come across an announcement that, beginning in September, 1903, the Normal School term would be one academic year, instead of two short terms, as under the existing rule. This would mean he said, that the term would be a continuous one of eight or nine months, instead of four months, as at present. "Of course, I can't say anything in criticism of the proposed change," said Mr. Scott, who afterwards, stated cont.
