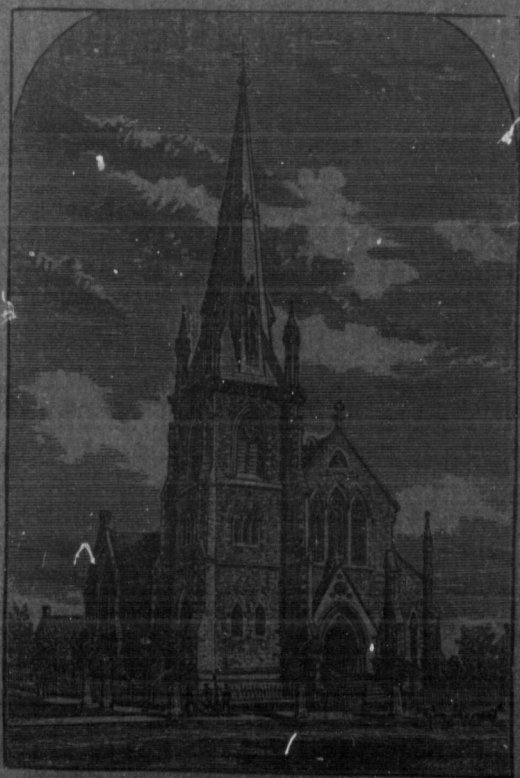

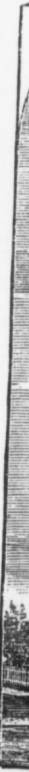

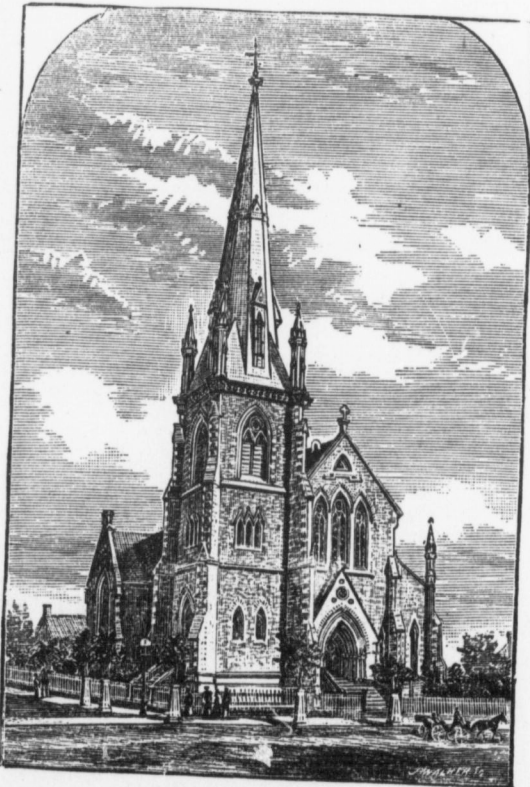

DISTRICT NO. 3.—Mr. E. H. Bronson: Richmond Road from the toll-gate eastward, Rochesterville, Wellington Street south, and Albert Street north and south, westward from Concession Street.

DISTRICT No. 4.—Mr. G. P. Drummond: Ashburnham Hill, eastward to Bay Street and northward to Sparks Street.

DISTRICT No. 5.—Mr. Clegg: From Bay Street eastward to Bank Street and northward to Sparks Street.

DISTRICT No. 6.—Mr. Gibson: From Maria Street northward to Sparks Street, and from Bank Street eastward to the Canal.

DISTRICT No. 7.—Mr. Hamilton: From Maria Street southward to Lewis Street, and from Bank Street eastward to the Canal.

DISTRICT No. 8.—Mr. F. H. Chrysler: From Lewis Street southward, and Bank Street eastward to the Rideau River and Billings' Bridge.

DISTRICT No. 9.—Mr. A. Drummond: From Sparks Street northward to the Ottawa River.

DISTRICT No. 10.—Mr. Larmonth: Sandy Hill from Rideau Street southward, and from the Canal eastward to Rideau River.

DISTRICT No. 11.—Lieut.-Colonel Macpherson: From Mackenzie Avenue eastward to the Rideau River, and from Rideau Street northward, and New Edinburgh.

DISTRICT No. 12.—Mr. Borthwick: Gloucester and country sections beyond Rideau River.

PASTORAL LETTER.

My Dear Friends :

I take pleasure in inviting your attention to the following Reports which contain such statements of the work of the Congregation throughout the year as are capable of being made in words and figures. I would fain believe that more has been omitted than said, and that the best record of our history is with God.

Your continued regard for the services of the Church is a source of much encouragement to me, and I pray that the preaching of the Word may show its blessed results in your lives. In view of the fact that all our pews are rented, I deem your action in declaring your seats free for one of the Sabbath services highly appropriate, and likely to minister to the influence of the Church throughout the whole community. Not a few have expressed to me their appreciation of your Christian courtesy in this matter.

It would cheer me greatly to observe a still further interest in the Wednesday evening service, though, on the whole, it has been well attended throughout the year. I ask you, if need be, to make some sacrifice for the sake of this hour of prayer and Bible Study, and I feel confident that you will find yourselves well repaid in the strengthening of your spiritual energies amid the temptations of daily life.

I gratefully acknowledge the prompt and cheerful aid which has been rendered me in various departments of christian work, and the enthusiasm with which the various societies and organizations of the Church have sought to contribute to the furtherance of our common welfare.

I have been privileged during the year to minister to the needs of the sick and troubled, but have not been able to visit the whole congregation. This fact is a source of personal regret, but I am sure you will feel that special cases must have precedence in the distribution of pastoral labors. I shall always feel it a pleasure to be informed of any circumstances in the home where my presence and sympathy can be of any service.

My heart's desire is that you may be saved, and that in no narrow or partial way. I long to see more and more of the fruits of the Christianity we profess, in quickened zeal and more abounding charity; and I ask you, therefore, to unite in faithful toil in the Master's vineyard, that you may reap your reward when the day is done.

REPORT OF THE KIRK SESSION.

In presenting their Annual Report, the Kirk Session take a grateful pleasure in noting the peace and prosperity which has marked the life of the congregation during the past year, and the continued tokens of Divine blessing.

The attendance at the Sabbath services has been uniformly excellent. The Christian courtesy of the pew-holders in recently declaring their seats free at the evening service has been much appreciated, and has secured the regular attendance of many who formerly felt a diffidence in occupying seats which belonged to others.

While finding no reason for great complaint as regards the Wednesday evening service, the Session have still to express the hope that a larger number will avail themselves of this hour of worship. They desire cordially to commend to the young women of the church the prayer-meeting held before the Wednesday evening service, and to the young men the Sunday morning prayer-meeting. Both of these services have been productive of much good.

At the request of the members of St. Andrew's residing in Stewarton and vicinity, the Session have cordially agreed to maintain a Friday evening Service in the School House of that suburb, and confidently look for the best results from it.

The Sabbath Schools continue to carry forward their operations with efficiency and vigor, but are always ready to welcome recruits into this important field of Christian work.

In the Autumn, Professor Macoun took charge of the congregational Bible class, but after conducting it with much success for a few Sundays, was compelled to abandon the work on account of ill health. In the meantime Mr. F. P. Bronson very kindly agreed to assume the leadership of the class, and is maintaining it with much profit to every member. The Session desire to invite the attention of the congregation, and especially of the young people to this excellent opportunity for Bible study. They would also express the hope that Prof. Macoun will soon be restored to his accustomed vigor.

The Ladies' Aid Society has done invaluable service to the congregation during the past year. It judiciously controls the charities of the church, and in a variety of ways ministers increasingly to its welfare.

The Woman's Home Missionary Society has enthusiastically undertaken to assist the Missions in the North-West, and during the year has given substantial aid to Dr. Jardine in his labours for the Nesbit Academy.

The second year of the Institute's existence has been marked with progress. An admirable standard of excellence has been maintained in all its meetings, and much has been done by it to unite the young people of the congregation and stir them up to intellectual and moral improvement.

Considerable change has taken place in the Communion Roll through removals and deaths. Many who have passed away to a higher Communion will be remembered for their sincere and earnest Christian characters. During the year 157 names were added to the roll and 44 removed. The present membership is 506.

The Session would urge members of the congregation to inform the Elder of their district of change of residence so that the utmost possible accuracy may be maintained in the census of the church.

The Session look forward to still wider participation in the privilege of giving to the missionary and benevolent work of the church, and note with pleasure the increasing liberality which has enabled them to allocate larger amounts than last year.

MINUTES OF ANNUAL MEETING.

The Annual General Meeting of the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa, was held in the Lecture Room of the Church, this day, Monday, the 4th March, 1889, at the hour of 7:30 p.m.

In the absence of the President of the Temporal Committee, it was moved by Rev. W. T. Herridge, seconded by E. H. Bronson, that P. Larmonth be appointed Chairman of this meeting.—Carried.

The meeting was opened with prayer by the Rev. W. T. Herridge.

Minutes of last Annual Meeting, and Special Meeting held on the 31st December, 1888, were read to the meeting, and sustained.

Reports and accounts of Kirk Session, Temporal Committee, Ladies' Aid Society, Schedule Fund Account, St. Andrew's Church Institute and Sabbath Schools were read.

It was moved by F. P. Bronson, seconded by G. L. Orme, that the reports and statements which have been presented to this meeting be approved.—Carried.

It was moved by C. S. MacNutt, and seconded by C. C. Ray, that Rev. W. T. Herridge, Messrs. W. Hamilton, James Cunningham, E. H. Bronson, Jas. Gibson and P. Larmonth be a committee to attend to the printing of the annual reports and statements, for distribution to the Congregation.—Carried.

It was moved by F. P. Bronson, seconded by James Gibson, that the incoming Temporal Committee be recommended to take into serious consideration, without delay, the project of erecting on the site of the manse and care taker's house, a building to be used by the Church for purposes to which the basement of the Church is now put. That the Congregation, in Annual Meeting assembled, hereby thank the Ladies' Aid Society for their admirable suggestions regarding said building, and pledges itself to assist their enterprise to the utmost of its powers.—Carried.

A letter from the Ladies' Aid Society to the Temporal Committee regarding the proposed building was read to the meeting.

REPORT OF THE TEMPORAL COMMITTEE.

To the Congregation of St. Andrew's Church in general meeting assembled :

The Temporal Committee beg to submit a statement of the Finances of the past year, which do not materially differ from those of preceding years. The liabilities at this date are about equal to the out standing pew rents, and these will no doubt soon be collected. The Committee have, however, been obliged to borrow from the Land Sale fund of Spenceville about \$800.00, which is all that has been realized from the sale of 28 lots to this date. During the year your Committee received from the Schedule Fund the sum of \$1500.00 or about \$555.00 less than the amount paid for interest, and unless this amount can be increased, so as to reach a sum equal to the interest required annually, the temporalities cannot be conducted on the present basis of pew rents.

Your Committee recommend to the consideration of the Congregation, the annexed letter from the Ladies' Aid Association, relative to the desirability or necessity of the erection of a New Hall, offering generous aid towards that end. While the Committee deeply sympathize with the ladies in their desire to have the present basement done away with, it

cannot see its way clear to undertake the work at present for want of funds. In addition to the cost of a building, the loss of rent of the Manse and caretaker's house, at least \$600, is an item that cannot be done without at present.

Your Committee have not succeeded in getting any offer for the Glebe lot during the year, neither can they hope to get an offer until the property is placed in the hands of Trustees who will be authorized to close at a fixed price.

The office-bearers of the Ladies' Aid Society have much pleasure in presenting this, their annual report.

The day of meeting has been changed this season from Thursday at two o'clock to Friday at three o'clock in the afternoon, and the Poor Relief Committee from four o'clock to half past two, Friday being found a much more convenient day by the members of the Society. The meetings of the Society have been held in the Bible Class room; the Poor Relief Committee meeting in the vestry.

The average attendance has been 15 as against 18 of last year; the largest number present at any one meeting having been 26, the smallest 8.

Six entertainments were given during the year. The first, a lecture on Chatterton, by Mr. J. F. Waters, on the evening of the 22nd of March, realizing the sum of \$50.80 (fifty dollars and eighty cents). The second, readings from Dicken's "Christmas Carols," by the Hon. Mr. Boyd, on the evening of the 13th of April, realizing the sum of \$33.90, (thirty three dollars and ninety cents). The third, on April the 18th, when the Society had the pleasure of entertaining the members of Synod at tea. The fourth, the annual Christmas sale, held on the afternoon and evening of the 13th of December, realizing the sum of \$147.-

71 (one hundred and forty-seven dollars and seventy-one cents). The fifth, the Anniversary Social, on the evening of the 25th of January, 1889, which was as usual free of charge, and was one of the most enjoyable held for some years. The sixth, An Evening with Medelsohn, held on the evening of the 22nd of February, realizing the sum of \$32.50 (thirty-two dollars and fifty cents).

The whole amount raised from sources during the year has been \$316.89 (three hundred and sixteen dollars and eighty-nine cents).

The following sums and articles have been donated: To the Women's Auxiliary of the Y. M. C. A., \$100 (one hundred dollars); to the "Home of the Aged," \$25.00 (twenty-five dollars) and 25 white counterpanes; to the Flower Mission of Y. W. C. T. U., \$10.00 (ten dollars); to the Refuge Branch of the Orphan's Home, one dozen and a half pairs of slippers; to the Busy Bees' Bazaar, fancy articles; to the Choir gallery a carpet; for the pews in the Church gallery, 45 hymn books, and for the pulpit, Bible, Psalter and Hymnal.

The society gladly avail themselves to the opportunity of recording their sincere and grateful thanks to the members of the congregation as well of St. Andrew's, who have so kindly aided them in getting up their programmes, and also to the Church Institute for allowing them the use of their piano for the entertainments.

And this report of the previous year was submitted.

In presenting the first annual report of this Society, we must remind our readers that the season has been a short one, and therefore very great results could not be expected, but from the measure of success vouchsafed to our work, we are encouraged to hope for great success in the future.

It was in response to an appeal from the Pastor that a number of ladies met together on Nov. 14th, last year, to form a Home Missionary Society. Thirty five members were enrolled. Meetings were held on the first Thursday of each month throughout the season. The funds of the Society are wholly dependent on membership fees and voluntary and thank offerings, and during the year amounted to \$134.85, \$110.00 of which was sent to Dr. Jardine, of Prince Albert, in aid of Nesbitt Academy ; \$20.00 to the Home for Friendless Women, leaving a balance on hand of \$14.85. The ordinary meetings were opened and closed with devotional exercises, and interesting reading matter, specially referring to mission work of any country, was provided by the different ladies.

In April the first Thank Offering meeting was held, and the sum of \$94.45 handed to the Treasurer. The meetings were closed for the season in June, and on entering on another year's work, we thank our Heavenly Father for what He has enabled us to do in the past, and trust that He will put it into the hearts of others to come forward and assist in the work of the future, as "in His vineyard the harvest truly is plenty, and the laborers few.

REPORT OF ST. ANDREW'S CHURCH INSTITUTE.

To the members of St. Andrew's Church, Ottawa.

Since the last Report of the Executive Committee there has been little change in the character of the meetings of the Institute. The same standard of excellence has been maintained in arranging programmes, and subjects tending to the development of thought have been invariably chosen. The membership has increased by 34 as compared with the previous year; there are now 165 members on the roll. Outlining a programme of subjects for each evening during the season has been beneficial in many ways. It has lessened the labours of the Committee, enabling them to arrange for several meetings ahead, and it has given those taking part a longer time for the preparation of subjects. The Institute has depended entirely upon its members to provide literary and musical contributions. This has been the custom since its inception. Eight meetings have already been held this season among which may be mentioned. "The Tercentenary of the Defeat of the Spanish Armada." "Life of Daniel," "An Evening with Wordsworth," "An Evening with Longfellow." Two excellent debates have taken place. There are four meetings yet to be held, comprising a Lecture by the Honorary President on "Elizabeth Barrell Browning, her life and works." "The Life of Elijah," a miscellaneous programme, and the closing Social.

After paying all current expenses the executive have been enabled to augment their donation of Hymn Books for use at the Wednesday evening meetings; and it is proposed that the proceeds of the Lecture to be given on the 19th March be handed over to the Ladies Aid Society.

In presenting this report the Executive, while cordially inviting others to join the Institute, earnestly draw the attention of the congregation to the Prayer Meeting held on Sunday mornings from 10.15 to 11 o'clock, and which is mainly sustained by members of this organization. They ask that a larger number avail themselves of this privilege, if in their power to do so, thereby becoming a mutual benefit, beside strengthening the hands of our esteemed Honorary President and respected Pastor.

Until time is no more its record will be change. Our Society has been no exception to this law, for to-night we miss loved ones with us a year ago, but we rejoice in the belief that within the inner chamber they see the Master face to face and are forever with the Lord. May we, who wait a little longer in the vestibule, so follow their bright example that when the summons comes to us we also may be welcomed home by "Angel faces which loved long since were lost a while"

REPORT

The number of scholars on the roll is 257. The decrease as compared with last year is in appearance only, not in reality, as the roll has been carefully examined and the names of all scholars not actually in attendance removed. That the school is not behind is evident from the average attendance of scholars being in excess of last year, namely 174. Teachers and officers number the same as last year, viz: 34, with an average attendance of 27, the ladies as usual being in a large majority. During the year six teachers have left the city; one has retired from

the work, and one has been called by the Master to exchange her labor of love here, for higher service and reward in the world above. The places of those removed have been taken by Mrs. Kenley, Miss Drummond, Miss Blanchet, Miss Holbrook, Mr. McMinn, Mr. Gordon and Mr. Strachan, the last mentioned being formerly our esteemed secretary. Mr. H. E. Baine now fills the office of secretary, and has been assisted in the Library with praiseworthy regularity by Mr. Gordon Scott and Mr. Geo. McCarthy. The school was kept open throughout the year except during the month of August.

The Sabbath collections are in excess of the amount raised last year, and are as formerly devoted wholly to Missions.

The session as usual, granted \$100 for the ordinary expenses of the school. After disbursing this sum, we still have a liability of \$70, which we should be glad to see our way to liquidate. Considerable additions to the library must be made very soon, for which extra funds will be required.

The Annual Festival was held on February 15th, when the scholars enjoyed a magic lantern exhibition through the kindness of Mr. Topley.

The teachers meet monthly for prayer, and weekly for the study of the lessons.

The special services held last winter resulted in great blessings to our school, for, at the April Communion, out of 97 who joined the church, 38 were our scholars, and at each Communion Season during the year, we have had the joy of seeing others from our school making public profession of their faith in Christ. We have in view of these things great reason to thank God for past mercies, and take courage for future work. "The Lord hath been mindful of us; He will bless us." "Therefore my beloved brethren, be ye steadfast, unmovable, always abounding in the work of the Lord, for as much as ye know that your labor is not in vain in the Lord."

Our offertory in the past has always been used to pay for the lesson and illustrated papers. We think of following the good example of the other schools and devoting the whole of our offertories to the mission schemes of the Church. In that case we would ask the Session to make us a grant for the many expenses for the year together with our indebtedness for rental of organ.

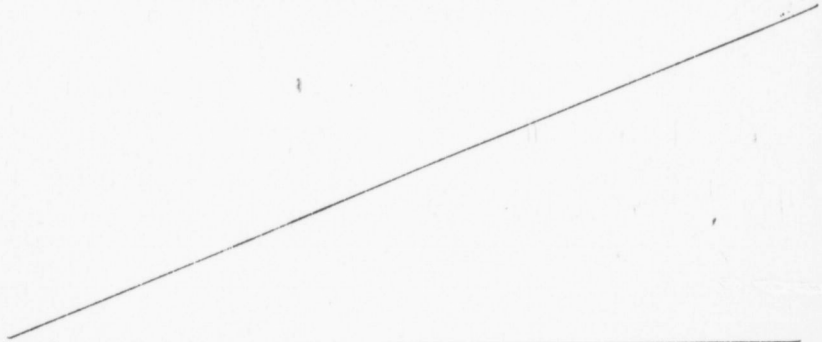
