SIR S. L. TILLEY DEAD. The Veteran Statesman Passed Away Last Thursday Morning.

One of the Fathers of Confederation and a Finance Minister of Canada.

Sir Leonard Tilley passed quietly away at five minutes past twelve o'clock on Thursday morning after what may be termed a brief illness.

Samuel Leonard Tilley was born at Gagetown, Queens County, May 18, 1818, and received his education at the Gagetown Grammar School.

He also submitted rules of order, which were the same as those governing the city council of Halifax.
