Rules of The Toronto Hunt

MANAGEMENT

1. The management and control of the affairs of the Club shall be entrusted to a Board of Directors, consisting of twenty shareholders, each holding one or more shares of the capital stock of the Club, and not in arrears for any calls thereon.

ELECTION OF DIRECTORS

- 2. At every Annual Meeting, the Shareholders shall elect twenty Directors, five of whom shall constitute a quorum, and they shall remain in office until their successors are appointed.
- 3. The Directors shall have power to fill any vacancy on the Board, through death, resignation or otherwise.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS AND EXECUTIVE

4. The Directors shall elect annually, from among themselves, a President, a Master of Hounds, an Executive Committee of six, three of whom shall constitute a quorum, and such other officers as they think fit.

ELECTION OF COMMITTEES

5. The Directors shall elect annually from among themselves, a Hounds and Stables Committee, and a Grounds Committee; and they may also elect from among the Club Members a Golf Committee, a Polo Committee, and any other committees which they from time to time consider advisable.

PRESIDING OFFICER

6. The President, or in his absence the M.F.H., shall preside at all meetings of the Directors, and they shall *ex-officio* be members of all committees.

DUTIES OF THE EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE

7. The Executive Committee shall control the management of the Club House and property, and all expenditures in connection therewith, and such other matters as may be referred to them by the Directors.

DUTIES OF THE HOUNDS AND STABLES COMMITTEE

8. Subject to the approval of the Directors, the Hounds and Stables Committee shall have control of the Hounds and Stables, and of all ordinary current expenditure in connection therewith. They shall engage and have control of the stable and kennel servants, and shall from time to time pass such stable and kennel rules as they think fit.

DUTIES OF THE GROUNDS COMMITTEE

9. Subject to the approval of the Directors, the Grounds Committee shall

have control of the Club Grounds and the Golf Links, the improvement of the same, and the expenditure on account thereof.

DUTIES OF THE M.F.H.

10. The M.F.H. shall be Chairman of the Hounds and Stables Committee. He shall have control of the pack and of the Hunt servants, and shall maintain order in the field. He shall give such directions from time to time as may be necessary for the enforcement of the Club Rules and Regulations, and in the absence of the President from Toronto, shall perform all the duties and have all the powers of the President. In the absence of both the President and the M.F.H. from Toronto, the duties of President shall be performed by the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or such other member of the Board of Directors as may for the time being be nominated, either by the Executive Committee or the Directors.

SECRETARY

- 11. The Secretary shall hold office at the pleasure of the Directors. He shall ex-officio be a member of all Committees. He shall attend all meetings; shall issue notices of all meetings; conduct the correspondence of the Club, and keep its records. He shall collect all accounts, subscriptions and fees; shall keep the books of the Club; have custody of the Club seal, and, under the directions of the proper Committees, disburse the Club funds.
- 12. An Assistant Secretary may be appointed by the Directors, who shall perform such of the Secretary's duties as the Directors from time to time prescribe.

DISBURSEMENTS OF CLUB FUNDS

13. All disbursements shall be authorized by the Directors or the proper committees; and except in petty cash all payments shall be made by cheque,

signed by the Secretary or the Assistant Secretary, and the Chairman of the Executive Committee, or in his absence by a Director deputed by him.

ANNUAL AND SPECIAL MEETINGS

14. The Annual Meeting of Shareholders shall be held at the Club House, on the third Tuesday of September in each year, or on such other day as the Directors may appoint. Special meetings may be called by direction of the Directors. At all such meetings ten shall constitute a quorum.

DIRECTORS' AND COMMITTEE MEETINGS

15. The Directors shall hold monthly meetings, and whenever summoned by the President or M.F.H. The Executive and other Committees shall hold monthly meetings or whenever summoned by their respective Chairmen.

NOTICE OF MEETINGS

16. For the Annual or any Special Meeting, five days' notice shall be given by circular letter or postcard, and no advertisement or other notice shall be required. The object of the meeting shall be set forth in the notice of call. Board and Committee Meetings may be called by verbal or other notice.

FISCAL YEAR

17. The fiscal year of the Club shall begin on the first of September, and end on the following thirty-first of August.

MEMBERS

- 18. There shall be five classes of Club Members:—
 - (a) Members,
 - (b) House Members,
 - (c) Honorary Members,
 - (d) Non-resident Members,
 - (e) Lady Members.

TOTAL MEMBERSHIP

19. The number of Members and House Members shall be limited to two hundred and fifty, and of Lady Members, to eighty-five.

20. In further addition to the number of members above mentioned, the Directors may admit to membership such persons who may become residents of Toronto, at no time exceeding twenty in number, as they from time to time deem to be a valuable addition to the strength of the Club in sport. Any such person shall pay the annual fee payable by members of the class to which he is elected, but shall not pay any entrance fee. The membership of any such person shall cease at the end of the Club year in which he is elected, but he shall be eligible for re-election.

MEMBERS

21. Members shall be entitled to ride to hounds, and shall have all the privileges of the Club House and Grounds.

HOUSE MEMBERS

22. House Members shall have the same privileges as Members, except that of riding to hounds.

HONORARY MEMBERS

23. The Directors may by an unanimous vote of those present, admit any person to honorary membership for life, or a limited period.

NON-RESIDENT MEMBERS

24. There may be admitted to memship non-residents of the City of Toronto to the number of one hundred. No person shall, however, be eligible for membership under this Rule who has any usual place of residence or business in Toronto, or within ten miles thereof. Any person admitted to membership under the terms of this Rule and ceasing to be eligible as aforesaid, shall forthwith resign his membership, and in default of such resignation the Directors may declare his membership to have ceased.

25. Any Member may on resigning, claim, if eligible, to be admitted without ballot as a Non-resident Member upon the occurrence of the first vacancy; and in such case he may, upon subsequently resigning his Non-resident Membership, claim to be again admitted without ballot as a Member upon the occurrence of the first vacancy.

LADY MEMBERS

26. Lady Members may ride to Hounds, and shall be entitled to such privileges of the Club House and Grounds as may from time to time be prescribed by the Directors.

ELECTION OF MEMBERS

27. A candidate for admission to membership shall be proposed in writing by one Member or House Member and seconded by another; but a Director may not propose or second a candidate. Every proposal for membership shall be first brought before the Directors for

approval, and afterwards the proposal shall be posted in the Club House for at least two weeks, at the expiration of which period the Directors may, on the occurrence of a vacancy, proceed to ballot for the election of the candidates. One black ball in seven shall be sufficient to exclude a candidate from membership.

ENTRANCE FEES

28. Members and House Members shall pay an Entrance Fee of twenty-five dollars. Non-Resident Members, Lady Members, and Officers of the Militia Permanent Force shall pay no entrance fee.

ANNUAL SUBSCRIPTION

29. The Annual Subscription shall be as follows, payable in advance, on the 1st of September in each year:

For Members - - - - \$30.00 For House Members - - - 20.00 For Non-Resident Members 10.00 For Lady Members - - - 10.00

SUBSCRIPTION FOR BROKEN PERIODS

30. Any Member elected after the 1st of March in any year may, in lieu of the annual subscription for the current year, pay as follows:

HUNTING MEMBERS

31. The Directors may admit to a class to be known as "Hunting Members" such persons as they deem fit. Admission to such class shall only be for the current year. Hunting Members shall be subject to such Rules, Regulations and Orders, and shall be entitled to such privileges as shall from time to time be passed or defined by the Directors. The fee for admission to such class shall be twenty dollars for the current year.

NOTIFICATION OF ELECTION

32. The Secretary shall furnish each candidate elected with a statement of the amount payable for entrance fee and subscription, and until the same has been paid such candidate shall not be deemed to be a Member of the Club, or entitled to any of the privileges thereof; and if any candidate fail to pay such entrance fee and subscription within four weeks after notification, his election may be declared void by the Directors.

SUBSCRIPTIONS, ETC., IN ARREARS

33. The name of every Member failing to pay his annual subscription before the 1st day of October in any year shall be posted in the Club House; and if not then paid, he shall pay an additional subscription of \$2.00 per month or portion thereof during which he is so in default; and if the subscription, with all fines, be not paid before the 1st of January following, he shall then cease to be a

Member, and his name shall be erased from the books of the Club; and in the case of any Member, if he be in arrears for any house or other account due to the Club for 30 days after posting under Rule 46, he shall cease to be a Member, but the Directors shall have power to extend in the case of any Member the period above mentioned.

34. No Member shall be allowed to use the Club House or Grounds, or exercise any of the privileges of membership, unless he shall have paid all subscriptions due by him, and all accounts or arrears due to the Club or the Steward.

RESIGNATION AND EXPULSION

35. All resignations of membership shall be in writing, addressed to the Secretary and shall be submitted by him at the next meeting of the Directors which shall be held thereafter. All subscriptions, fees, and accounts shall be paid before a resignation is considered. If any resignation be not

received by the Secretary before the fifteenth day of August in any year, the subscription and fees for the current year shall be paid.

36. Any Member infringing the Rules of the Club, or being guilty of conduct in or out of the Club which, in the opinion of the Directors, or of any five members who shall certify the same in writing to the Directors, is detrimental to the character or interests of the Club, or is unbecoming a gentleman, shall be liable to suspension from all the privileges of the Club on a vote of two-thirds of the Directors present, when the question of the Member's conduct shall be investigated. Notice of such suspension shall forthwith be given by the Secretary by post to such Member's last known address, and such Member shall have the right of appeal, by giving notice in writing within seven days after notification of his suspension, addressed to the Secretary of the Club, posted and registered, and such appeal

shall be to a meeting of shareholders to be held within one month of such suspension, of which meeting at least seven days' notice shall be given on the Notice Board, and also by post to the suspended Member at his last known address, and if such suspension be sustained by a majority of shareholders at the Special General Meeting so called, or if the Member suspended fail to notify the Secretary of his intention to appeal, he shall be considered to be expelled and shall forfeit all privileges of the Club, including his entrance fees, but his subscription for the current year shall be returned to him pro tanto.

37. Any Member who shall withdraw, resign, or be expelled, shall cease to be a Member of the Club, and shall forfeit *ipso facto* all right or claim therein, or in or to its property or funds, and any Member who shall be expelled shall thereafter be ineligible to be re-admitted as a Member of the Club, or to be introduced as a visitor.

38. The Directors may admit to the privileges of the Club any stranger visiting Toronto to whom it may seem proper to offer such a compliment.

39. By consent of the Directors, Officers of His Majesty's Active Forces, attached Officers of the Cavalry or Infantry School Corps, and strangers temporarily resident in Toronto, may be admitted to the privileges of the Club, on payment in advance of a subscription of five dollars per month. The name of any person to be admitted under this Rule with the name of his proposer, shall be forwarded to the Secretary in writing, who shall lay the same before the Directors for approval. This privilege shall not exceed twelve months.

40. Any Member may at his own expense introduce at any time one or more guests for lunch or dinner; and may also introduce one or more friends to the smoking-room, but this latter privilege shall not be repeated oftener than twice a month.

41. Any Member may introduce a visitor resident elsewhere than in Toronto for a period of two weeks.

The name and residence of such visitor shall be first entered in a visitors' book provided for that purpose, and such entry shall be signed by the Member introducing him.

The Member introducing a visitor shall be responsible for all bills he may incur to the Club.

No visitor shall be introduced more than once in six months.

- 42. The privileges of any visitor may be terminated at the discretion of the Directors.
- 43. Visitors may not introduce any other person to the privileges of the Club.

SUBMISSION TO RULES

44. A Member on paying his subscription shall be considered to have submitted himself to the Rules of the Club, and on this condition only shall be entitled to enjoy its privileges.

ABSENCE OF MEMBERS

45. Any Member, other than a Non-resident Member, who may be absent from Toronto during the whole period for which his annual subscription is payable, may continue membership by paying in lieu of the annual subscription, the sum of five dollars in advance; but a Member desiring to take advantage of this Rule shall notify the Secretary in writing of his intention before such annual subscription falls due.

POSTING OF UNPAID ACCOUNTS

46. Members shall pay all diningroom and other charges at the office
before leaving the Club House. If any
Member's account be not paid on or
before the fifteenth day of the month
following, his name together with the
amount due shall be posted, and he shall
be refused credit.

COMPLAINTS

47. All requests and complaints must be made in writing to the Secretary, whose duty it shall be to investigate the same and report thereon to the Executive Committee for further action.

CLOSING OF CLUB HOUSE

48. The Club House shall be closed at 12 p.m., except on Sundays, when it shall be closed at 11 p.m.

DOGS

49. No Member shall be allowed to keep a dog upon the Club premises, or bring a dog into the Club House.

NOTICES

50. Any notice duly posted on the Notice Board in the Club House, shall be deemed a sufficient notice to all the Members of the Club, unless special notice is ordered.

STOCK, ETC.

- 51. Calls upon subscribed stock shall be made from time to time as the Directors may determine, and interest at the rate of seven per cent. shall be payable on all calls from the dates at which they respectively become payable until paid.
- 52. The Directors shall have power to summarily forfeit shares, and the money paid thereon, upon which any call shall have remained unpaid, with interest for two months after it shall become due and payable, and such forfeited stock and the money paid thereon shall thereupon become the property of the Club.
- 53. Interim receipts for the payment of calls shall be issued from time to time by the proper officer as such payments are made, to be substituted by stock certificates whenever the shares are fully paid up, and both receipt and certificate shall be authenticated by the signature

of the M.F.H. or a Vice-President, and the Secretary under the seal of the Club.

54. No stock, unless fully paid up, shall be allowed to be assigned without the approval of the Directors, and no stock under any circumstances shall be allowed to be assigned until all calls made on it are fully paid up; nor shall it be permitted to be assigned to any person who is not, at the date of such assignment, a duly elected Member of the Club; and every transfer shall be in such form as the Directors shall from time to time prescribe; and they shall have an absolute discretion without assigning any cause to refuse to approve of any assignment or to permit any transfer to be made. The transfer books shall be closed for 15 days before every annual meeting.

55. Any Shareholder, having stock for sale, shall first offer it to the Club or the Directors through the Secretary, at the amount paid by him therefor with interest thereon from the date of payment,

at the rate of 5% per annum, giving an option of 10 days on it; and no Member shall hold more than \$1,000 par value of stock.

56. The Directors may from time to time repeal, amend and re-enact these Rules; but such change, (unless in the meantime confirmed at a Special General Meeting duly called for the purpose), shall only have force until the next Annual General Meeting, and, if not then confirmed, shall from that time cease to be in force; and in the practical application of these Rules, or any to be hereafter made, the construction put upon them by the Directors shall be final and conclusive.

57. In the construction of the above Rules, following Rule 32, the word "Member" shall include "House Member" and "Lady Member."
