





EXPLANATIONS

Principal Articles of the Calendar for 1879.

EXPLANATIONS.

All the calculations are reduced to the nearest minute, local mean time, for Charlottetown, with the exception of the equation of time, and the Sun's right ascension and declination, which

are given for the instant of apparent noon.

If it is required to find either of these latter data for the time of mean noon, multiply the change in the succeeding 24 hours, by the equation of time reduced to seconds, divide by 86400, and add the result, if the sun is fast of clock; subtract, if slow. If the Sun's declination, whether north or south, is decreasing, add when the sun is slow, subtract when fast. Example:

The Sun's apparent semi_diameter for every day throughout the year is given in a table on page 21.

The bearing of the Moon, at the time of its changes, is given for the purpose of assisting or testing weather forecasts.

The days of expected atmospheric disturbance are those on which the moon, in its orbit, crosses the equinoctial line, or attains its greatest north or south declination. When these days fall close upon-within two days-the time of Moon's change or perigee, the disturbing influence on the atmospheric tides is proportionally increased. These cases are marked ** or *** according as two or three of these influences are combined, and the closer these times agree, the stronger and more certain is the disturbance to be expected.

PLANETS.

MERCURY.—Apparent motion will be alternately retrograde and direct, when he will be stationary to the west or the east of the Sun, January 4, W.; April 4, E.; April 29, W.; August 10, E.; September 2, W.; November 30, E.; December 20, W. The most favourable time for finding this planet is when he is at his greatest elongation from the Sun toward the east, when he may be seen in the western sky shortly after sunset, this will be about March 29, July 26; or low in the east before sunrise about Sept. 22, and December 29. He will be in conjunction with Jupiter on the 20th of February, with Saturn on the 15th of March.

VENUS.—Motion direct till August 31; retrograde till October 12; afterward direct to the end of the year. She will be in conjunction with Jupiter on the 23rd of January, with Saturn on the 1st of March, and occulted by the Moon, 24th of May, 20th of August and 13th of October, the only planetary occultations of the year, but not visible at Charlottetown.

MARS.—Motion direct till October 7; retrograde till December 16; then direct to the year's end. He will be in conjunction with Jupiter on the 9th of May, with Saturn 30th of June, when the two will approach so near as to appear as one star, but the planet will not rise till about midnight, by which time they will have parted a little. He will be in conjunction with Neptune on the 13th of August, Neptune being about a Moon's diameter to the north of Mars.

The cut on the opposite page shows the apparent path of Mars during part of the year, also its three remarkable conjunctions.

The oblique line represents the Ecliptic. The dotted line the pall of Mars.

The stars shown on the diagram are the four forming the great Quadrangle of Pegasus, viz.; Almaach, Scheat, Algenib and Markab. To the left (on East) are the first two stars of Aries, below which, towards the South, is Mira (Ceti), remarkable for its variations, appearing during fifteen days, as a star of the 2nd magnitude. For five months it is totally invisible, while six months are occupied by its gradual increase and decrease. The entire period of these changes being 331 days, 15 hours and 7 minutes.

JUPITER.—Motion direct till July 2nd; retrograde till October 29th; afterward direct to the end of the year. In conjunction with the Sun February 8th; in opposition, August 31st. Range of motion, 31° in Aquarius.

SATURN.—Motion direct till July 29; retrograde till December 13th. In conjunction with the Sun, March 26; in opposition, October 5. Range of motion, 17° in Pisces.

URANUS.—Motion retrograde till May 9; then direct to the end of the year. In opposition to the Sun, coming to the meridian

NEPTUNE.—Motion retrograde till January 17th; direct till August 15; then retrograde till the end of the year. Range of motion about 5° in Aries.

ECLIPSES.

There will be three Eclipses during the year; two of the Sun and one of the Moon, but all invisible at Charlottetown.

I. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, January 22, Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 11h. 45m. 56sec., a m., only visible at the southern parts of South America, Africa, Arabia and Persia.

II. An annular Eclipse of the Sun, July 18, Greenwich mean time of conjunction, 9h. 8m. 9sec., a.m., visible to South Europe, Africa and India, the central line passing across from Sierra Leone to entrance of the Red Sea.

III. A partial Eclipse of the Moon, December 28th, Greenwich mean time of Opposition, 6h. 28m. 48.5sec., p.m.

VALUABLE COOKING RECEIPTS.

BAKED APPLE CUSTARD.

Ingredients.—1 dozen large apples, moist sugar to taste. 1 small teacupful of cold water, the grated rind of one lemon, 1 pint of milk, 4 eggs, 2 ozs. of loaf sugar.

Mode.—Peel, cut, and core the apples; put them into a lined sauce-pan with the cold water, and as they heat, bruise them to a pulp; sweeten with moist sugar, and add the grated lemon rind. When cold, put the fruit at the bottom of a pie-dish, and pour over it a custard, made with the above proportion of milk, eggs and sugar, grate a little nutmeg over the top, place the dish in a moderate oven, and bake from 25 to 35 minutes. The above proportions will make rather a large dish.

APPLE FRITTERS.

Ingredients.—For the batter, $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ oz. of butter, $\frac{1}{2}$ saltspoonful of salt, 2 eggs, milk, apples, hot lard or clarified beef-dripping.

Mode.—Break the eggs, separate the whites from the yolks, and beat them separately. Put the flour into a basin, stir in the butter, which should be melted to a cream; add the salt, and moisten with sufficient warm milk to make it of a proper consistency, that is to say, a batter that will drop from the spoon. Stir this well, rub down any lumps that may be seen, and add the whites of the eggs, which had been previously well whisked; beat up the batter for a few minutes, and it is ready for use. Now peel and cut the apples into rather thick whole slices, without dividing them, and stamp out the middle of each slice, where the core is, with a cutter. Throw the slices into the batter; having ready a pan of boiling lard or clarified dripping; take out the pieces of apple one by one, put them into the hot lard, and fry a nice brown, turning them when required. When done, lay them on a piece of blotting-paper before the fire, to absorb the greasy moisture; then dish on a white d'oyley, piled one above the other; strew over them some pounded sugar, and serve very-hot. The flavor of the fritters would be very much improved by soaking the pieces of apple in a little wine, mixed with sugar and lemon-juice, for 3 or 4 hours before wanted for table; the batter, also, is better for being mixed some hours before the fritters are made.

TO MAKE A PLAIN SWEET OMELET.

54

Ingredients.-6 eggs, 4 ozs. of butter, 2 ozs. of sifted sugar.

Mode.—Break the eggs into a basin, omitting the whites of 3; whisk them well, adding the sugar and 2 ozs. of the butter, which should be broken into small pieces, and stir all these ingredients well together. Make the remainder of the butter quite hot in a small frying-pan, and when it commences to bubble, pour in the eggs, &c. Keep stirring them until they begin to set; then turn the edges of the omelet over, to make it an oval shape, and finish cooking it. To brown the top, hold the pan before the fire, or use a salamander, and turn it carefully on to a very hot dish; sprinkle sifted sugar over, and serve.

SODA-CAKE.

Ingredients.— $\frac{1}{4}$ lb. of butter, 1 lb. of flour, $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of currants, $\frac{1}{2}$ lb. of moist sugar, 1 teacupful of milk, 3 eggs, 1 teaspoonful of carbonate of soda.

Mode.—Rub the butter into the flour, add the currants and sugar, and mix these ingredients well together. Whisk the eggs well, stir them to the flour, &c., with the milk, in which the soda should be previously dissolved, and beat the whole up together with a wooden spoon or beater. Divide the dough into two pieces, put them into buttered moulds or cake-tins, and bake in a moderate oven for nearly an hour. The mixture must be extremely well beaten up, and not allowed to stand after the soda is added to it, but must be placed in the oven immediately. Great care must also be taken that the cakes are quite done through, which may be ascertained by thrusting a knife into the middle of them: if the blade looks bright when withdrawn, they are done. If the tops acquire too much color before the inside is sufficiently baked, cover them over with a piece of clean white paper, to prevent them from burning.

SALLY LUNN CAKES.

Mix two tablespoonfuls of light yeast into a pint of warm new milk, or cream, if you wish the cakes very good; rub four ounces of butter into two pounds of flour, strew into it a half teaspoonful of salt, then pour in the milk gradually, beating up the batter with a wooden spoon as you proceed; add the yolk of three eggs, well beaten, and when smoothly mixed, let it rise an hour before the fire; then fill your cake tins, and bake fifteen to twenty minutes in a quick oven.

COUNTY COURTS.

JURISDICTION OF COUNTY COURTS.

The County Courts have not power to try any of the following actions, namely:

First—Detinue, replevin, ejectment, or any action where the title of land is brought in question. Or, Second—Actions in which the validity of any devise, bequest, or limitation, is disputed. Or, Third—Criminal conversation or seduction. Or, Fourth—Breach of promise of marriage. Or, Fifth—Actions against an executor or administrator, but executors or administrators may bring actions in the said Courts. Or, Sixth—Actions against any Justice of the Peace for anything done by him in the execution of his office. Or, Seventh—Actions upon a Judgment in the Supreme Court.—(See Section 16, County Courts' Amendment Act.)

The County Courts have jurisdiction in all civil actions both of debts and contracts, wrongs and damages, where the debt or damages claimed, whether on balance of account or otherwise, do not exceed one hundred and fifty dollars, and on all claims on Bail Bonds or on other Bonds, given under the County Courts' Act, or any Act in amendment thereof, whatever may be the amount sought to be recovered, and in all actions recoverable under any Provincial Statute, where the remedy provided by such statute is by suit before any Court of Commissioners for the recovery of Small Debts.—(See Section 17 County Courts' Amendment Act.)

Where the debt or demand claimed is a balance not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars, after an admitted payment, or set off of any debt or demand, claimed or recoverable by the defendant from the plaintiff, the Court shall have jurisdiction to try such action. (See section 18 County Courts' Amendment Act.)

The plaintiff, in any County Court, cannot divide any cause or action arising out of a debt or contract, for the purpose of bringing two or more actions; but any plaintiff having cause of action, arising out of a debt or contract, may abandon the excess and can, on proving his case, recover to an amount not exceeding one hundred and fifty dollars; and the judgment of the Court in such cases, shall be in full of all demands in respect of such cause of action. Provided that when any plaintiff shall have cause of action against a defendant for goods sold and delivered, and shall at the same time be the holder of promissory notes, made by such defendant and due and payable to the plaintiff, the plaintiff may sue for the amount of his claim for goods sold and delivered, without being required to sue at the same time upon such promissory notes, or that he may sue for such promissory notes, without being required to sue at the same time for the amount of his account for goods sold and delivered. (See section 20 County Courts' Amendment Act.)

BANKRUPTCY JURISDICTION.—The jurisdiction in matters of Insolvency is vested in the County Courts under the Insolvent Act of 1875 and Amending Acts. Under these Acts a Writ of Attachment may be issued out of the County Court against a trader who has committed any of the Acts of Insolvency set forth in the 3rd section of the Insolvent Act of 1875, at the instance of any unsecured creditor whose debt amounts to \$200 and upwards. The Insolvent Act of 1875 also provides that the estate of any trader may be put into Insolvency by means of a written demand made on him at the instance of any one or more of his creditors for unsecured claims of not less than \$100 each, and amounting in the aggregate to \$500, requiring him to make an assignment for the benefit of his creditors. Sec sec. 4 and 9 of Insolvent Act 1875.

MICMAC SOCIETY OF P. E. ISLAND.

Eighty cents per annum constitutes a person a member, and a donation of \$16 a life member of the Society.

Any such letter posted wholly unpaid (or prepaid less than one full rate of three cents) cannot be forwarded to its destination, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office, with the reason plainly written or marked upon it—"postage not prepaid."

Letters as aforesaid posted in Canada, and addressed to places in Canada, when weighing more than half an ounce, and liable therefore to two or more rates of postage, will be transmitted by mail to destination, though not fully prepaid, if as much as one full rate of three cente has been prepaid thereon by postage stamp; and in such cases will be forwarded charged with double the amount of deficient postage not prepaid: Thus, if such a letter weighing more than \(\frac{1}{2} \) oz., and not exceeding 1 oz. in weight, be posted prepaid 3 cents only, it will be rated 6 cents unpaid—"more to pay"—and forwarded to its address.

On letters posted at an Office to be delivered from it commonly known as "drop letters," the rate is 1 cent per ½ oz.; to be in all cases prepaid by postage stamp affixed to such letters when posted.

The charge for the Registration of a letter is 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

CANADA AND NEWFOUNDLAND.

Letters for Newfoundland are charged at the rate of five cents per half ounce, and must in all cases be prepaid.

The Registration fee to Newfoundland is the same as to places within the Dominion, viz. 2 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

CANADA AND THE UNITED STATES.

The rate of postage upon letters passing by mail between Canada and the United States is the same as to places within the Dominion, and must in all cases be prepaid by postage stamp.

The Registration fee to the United States is 5 cents, to be prepaid by Registration stamp.

RATES OF POSTAGE.

Transient Newspapers and Periodicals Addressed to Great Britain must be prepaid by postage stamp *Two* cents per 4 oz. each packet.

Parcel Post to places in Canada, 121 cents per 11h. weight.

Parcels intended to pass through the Mails should not exceed 5lbs. in weight, or 24 inches in length, or 12 inches in breadth, and should be marked "by Parcel Post." Parcels may be Registered by affixing a 5 cent Registered Letter Stamp thereto, in addition to the Postage.

MISCELLANEOUS POSTAL MATTER.

Books and Pamplets, Printed Circulars, Prices Current, Handbills, etc.

CANADA AND UNITED STATES.

When posted addressed to any place in Canada or the United States, and not exceeding 5lbs. in weight, 24 inches in length, and 12 inches in breadth or depth, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of one cent per 4 ounces in weight, and must be put up so as to admit of inspection. Such books, papers, returns, etc., must not be accompanied by any instructions or directions. Bank notices, advices of goods in transit, and personal notices are liable to letter rate because intended for the information of a particular person. Post Bands with an impressed one cent stamp for this purpose, may be obtained at the rate of 4 or 5 cents.

PATTERN AND SAMPLE POST.

CANADA.

Patterns and Samples of merchandise, not exceeding 24 ounces in weight, when posted in Canada for places within Canada or Newfoundland, must be prepaid by postage stamp at the rate of One Cent per 4 ounces, and put up in such a manner as to admit of inspection. Goods sent in execution of an Order, however small the quantity may be, or articles sent by one private individual to another, which are not actually Trade Patterns or Samples, are not admissable.

UNITED STATES.

Patterns and Samples of Merchandize, posted for places in the United States will continue to be subject to the special rate of 10 cents each, prepaid by postage stamp, and must not exceed 8 ounces in weight.

UNITED KINGDOM.

Books and patterns of Merchandise, when addressed to places in the United Kingdom, must be prepaid by postage stamps at the rate of 2 cents per 2 ounces or fraction of 2 ounces. CIRCULARS AND PRICES CURRENT, 2 cents each.




