Now the doctrine of the Apostolic succession has primarily nothing whatever to do with the Papacy. If it had, how could it be maintained by the Episcopalian and Greek?

On the other hand, an unbroken succession in any particular Bishopric is not necessary, and commonly does not exist. Usually, when a Bishop dies, his See is vacant for months, and in some cases for years.

This abeyance of the Papacy of course lasts until a new Pope is chosen, which in some cases has not been for more than two years. Now what man of common understanding ever imagined that this interval between the death of one Pope and the choice of another took anything away from the legitimacy of the second?

In other words, the right of a present Pope depends only on his personal acknowledgment by the Catholic Church. It is no more concerned with the questions of disputed elections in the past than the right of Edward to the throne of England depends on the question whether Henry VII. had a legitimate title or not.

Trinity Sunday. THE PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH.

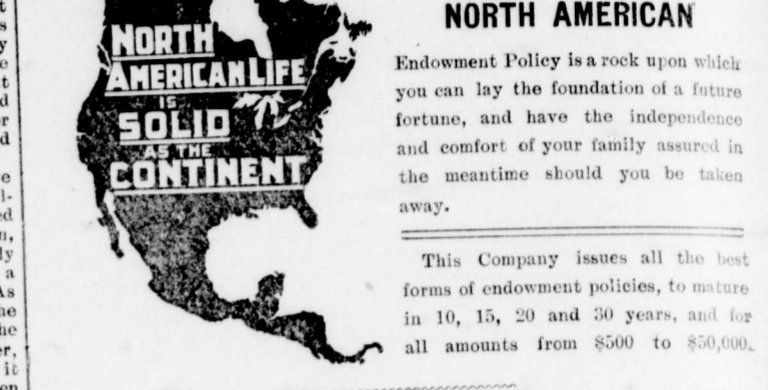

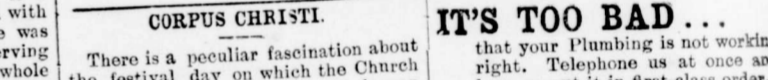
