OVER THE FALLS.

Another Victim of the Great Cataract— Sad Death of a Parisian Lady.

Niagara Falls, June 21.—This morning about half past ten o'clock a lady named Mrs. Pierre Rolland, a guest at the Park Hotel, fell into the Niagara river and was swept over the Horseshoe Falls. The details of the affair are as follows: This morning Mr. and Mrs. Rolland, who were recently married, left the hotel in apparent good spirits and took a walk around the village. They went to Goat Island about ten o'clock, and according to the husband's story, walked around it once, and when on the Canada side she went to the water's edge, with the intention of getting a drink, when her foot slipped and she fell into the river, the rapid torrent quickly carrying her away. What seems remarkable is that the husband made no outcry nor told anyone about the sad affair until he returned to his hotel. Neither he nor his wife could speak a word of English, so that it was some time before he made himself understood. Rolland and family were residents of Paris, France, and were consequently of French extraction. They were en route from Japan, and were to have left the Falls this afternoon for the East. Considerable excitement exists here over the affair. Rolland was perfectly frantic and had to be closely watched to prevent him from committing suicide.

DAIRY MARKETS.

On Tuesday, Mr. Atcheson of Elma, shipped 250 boxes of cheese from the Bluevale factory, and 120 packages of butter from Goldstone, via G. W. R. for Glasgow 5/6. was the figure paid for the cheese. Butter forwarded on consignment.

London.—The cheese market on Saturday last proved to be the largest, in point of attendance and offerings, of the season. The cable advices had further declined one shilling during the week, and stood at 37s. Sales were made as follows:—North Branch, 450 boxes, 5/6; West Nissouri, 40, 5/6; Pond Mills, 250, 5/6; Belmont, 30, 5/6; all the first half of June orders. Also the following of half-May and half-June together:—Elgin, 180 boxes, West Maadala, 350, each 5/6. Total offerings, 2,250 boxes; total sales, 2,000 boxes. Some factories are shipping their cheese on consignment, preferring to take the chances of the market rather than the low prices current, which are, nevertheless, fully as high as are justified by trans-Atlantic reports.

Latest cable advices from England report a dull market. New York gives cheese market moderate, and business uncertain.

Utica, N. Y., June 23.—Ninety-eight hundred boxes of cheese sold at 5c to 5 1/2c, the latter price being the average; fifty-eight hundred boxes consigned.

A GREAT PEDESTRIAN FEAT.

Weston Walks 550 Miles With Five Minutes to Spare—Wins the Astley Belt, a bet of \$2,500, and the World's Championship.

London, June 21, 11 p. m.—The great contest is finished. Weston is just being proclaimed, with shouts and cheers, champion of the world. He completed his 550th mile precisely at eleven, winning the belt, his bet of \$2,500 and the championship. From 2 p. m. until 8, Weston, after five days on the track, continued making 5 miles an hour. At 2 o'clock the score stood 507. During the next six hours he had piled up the miles to 536. The excitement was wonderful, and the plucky hero of the hour was greeted with shouts and cheers as he plodded along. From 8 o'clock the excitement steadily increased, and reached the culminating point just before the finish. At half-past 9 Weston had made the highest score on record, 543 miles, 5 laps, beating "Blower" Brown's great score of 542 miles, made in the same hall in April. The hall was filled with an enthusiastic crowd, who seemed never to grow tired of cheering. Weston though evidently suffering from fatigue maintained a smiling face, and was the recipient of many friendly greetings. The great struggle came to an end at 11 o'clock, Weston doing 550 miles, with 5 minutes to spare.
