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THREATENING TO KILL

Dr. G. Hamilton Griffin Charged With Sending Threats of Killing

To Hon. Robert Dumas—The Case in the Police Court—Continued From the Daily Colonist, Nov. 15.

Dr. G. Hamilton Griffin was charged with sending threatening letters to Hon. Robt. Dumas. The prisoner did not betray the slightest embarrassment as he stood up in the dock while the information was read to him.

Mr. Taylor, of Eberts & Taylor, who appeared for the prosecution, wished to amend the information by inserting the word "Gustava" for "John," charging Gustava Hamilton Griffin with the crime stated in the information.

The change was made, the doctor remarking that he wished to have the correct name inserted.

"It would be rather difficult to say which is correct," remarked Mr. Taylor, "but I will leave it to the jury to decide."

Dr. Griffin stated that he intended to conduct his own defence, and the magistrate, in reply to Mr. Taylor's request that the prisoner be asked to enter a plea of guilty or not guilty, stated that he would not do so, as he was not trying the case but merely conducting a preliminary examination.

Supp. Shoppard, being sworn, stated that the information was correct to the best of his knowledge and belief.

Dr. Griffin then addressed the court. He said he liked to go on to go on at once. We are prepared to go on. Our character is suffering in the eyes of the public, and it is not a man in the city for whom I have more respect than Hon. Mr. Dumas. In my paper and newspaper, I have shown my high respect for him. We would ask that the case proceed.

Supp. Shoppard stated that a remand was necessary to allow the prosecution to procure their witnesses.

His honor—Then the case is remanded. Dr. Griffin asked if he would be allowed out on bail, stating that he could give \$2000 as security.

Mr. Taylor stated that the prosecution would ask that the bail be fixed at a large amount, and the doctor remarked: "When I will not ask for bail. We can get a bail for one night. It will suit us very well."

The case was remanded until this morning at the usual hour.
