

Toronto. THE ASSIZES OPENED.

Boyd on the Grand Jury System—The Cases to Come Up for Trial

Twenty minutes were lost at the opening of the Assize Court yesterday owing to the absence of the juryman, who, on taking his place in the jury box was reprimanded by Chancellor Boyd.

His Lordship's address to the Grand Jury was of the usual character, commenting upon the institution of the grand jury and the cases to be brought before them, and outlining their duties. "The most obvious thing in your appearance here to-day," said His Lordship, "is the reduction of your number," Referring to the grand jury as one of the ancance here to-day," said His Lordship, "is the reduction of your number." Referring to the grand jury as one of the ancient institutions in our judicial system, he remarked that it was only of late that a great move has been made towards a rhange, and then only after serious consideration and mature deliberation. Under the present law in Ontario, 13 men constitute a grand jury and any seven can concur in finding a true bill. You, gentlemen, comprise the first grand jury of the High Court to meet under the new regulations."

A case in Point

After tracing the history of the grand jury and the legislation of late years looking to its reform and, possibly, its final abolition, His Lordship illustrated a case passing through the hands of a coroner's jury, a stipendiary magistrate, and a grand jury, the first two exercising little care to ferret out the whole truth of the case, and finally reaching a solution or settlement before the petit jury, and expressed a conviction that less circumlocution would be in the interests of justice. "The functions of the Grand Jury might be more advantageously employed if they were not so ageously employed if they were not so frequently, employed. The whole ma-chinery of the law should not be brought into action to find out whether or not a man stole a tin pail which he might be accused of appropriating."

Turning to the work of the present ourt His Lordship said, "The cases efore you are of magnitude in ravity, but not in number. Some of the more important cases on the docket have already been passed upon by the grand jury at previous sessions of the court. In the new cases I find three of the most serious crimes in the criminal list. Two are of murder and one man-slaughter. The first-named are not the ordinary cases of murder, arising out of heated passion or desire for revenge, but were deliberately planned for the sake of pecuniary gains. The insurance company is one of the most beneficent organizations of modern times, but it has called into existence a class of crime which it is exceedingly difficult to detect.

"One peculiarity of these cases is that they were skilfully planned and carefully executed, great care being taken to cover up all trace of guilt or clues which might lead to detection. It will be your duty to scrutinize the more closely the evidence submitted to you in these

Conference on Charities.

Although 21 conferences have been held no convention has ever been held in Canada.




