



TO JACQUES CARTIER,
CELEBRATED NAVIGATOR OF ST. MALO.
DISCOVERED CANADA, AND NAMED
THE ST. LAWRENCE, 1534-1535.

Erccted on front of City Hall, Notre Dame Street, East.

THIS SITE WAS SELECTED AND
NAMED IN 1611, LA PLACE ROYALE, BY
SAMUEL DE CHAMPLAIN,
THE FOUNDER OF CANADA.

Erceted on the west side of front door of the Custom House, Place Royale and Common Street. THE SEMINARY OF ST. SULPICE,
FOUNDED AT PARIS
BY MONSIEUR JEAN-JACQUES OLIER, 1641;
ESTABLISHED AT VILLE-MARIE, 1657;
MONSIEUR GABRIEL DE QUEYLUS,
SUPERIOR,
SEIGNEUR OF THE ISLAND OF MONTREAL,
1663.

Erected on the Gate of Seminary of St. Sulpice, Notre Dame St., opposite Place d'Armes.

NEAR THIS SPOT,
ON THE 18th DAY OF MAY, 1642,
LANDED THE FOUNDERS OF MONTREAL,
COMMANDED BY PAUL DE CHOMEDY,
SIEUR DE MAISONNEUVE;
THEIR FIRST PROCEEDING WAS
A RELIGIOUS SERVICE.

Erected on the east side of front door of the Custom House, Place Royale and Common Street. HERE WAS THE

FORT OF VILLE-MARIE, FIRST DWELLING

PLACE OF THE FOUNDERS OF

VILLE-MARIE,

BUILT 1643, DEMOLISHED 1648.

REPLACED BY THE HOUSE

OF MONSIEUR DE CALLIÈRES, 1686.

Erected at the south corner Place d'Youville and Port Street.

HOTEL-DIEU DE VILLE-MARIE,
FOUNDED IN 1644 BY JEANNE MANCE.
TRANSFERRED IN 1861 TO THIS LAND,
GIVEN BY BENOIT AND GABRIEL BASSET.
REMOVAL OF THE REMAINS OF
JEANNE MANCE AND 178 NUNS, 1861.

Erected on the wall of Hôtel-Dieu, Pine Avenue. NEAR THIS SQUARE,

AFTERWARDS NAMED LA PLACE D'ARMES,

THE FOUNDERS OF VILLE-MARIE

FIRST ENCOUNTERED THE IROQUOIS,

WHOM THEY DEFEATED;

PAUL CHOMEDY DE MAISONNEUVE,

KILLING THE CHIEF WITH HIS OWN HANDS,

30th MARCH, 1644.

Erected on the Royal Trust Building, 107 St. James Street.

CHEVALIER LOUIS D'AILLEBOUST

DE COULONGE, ONE OF THE CHIEF

DEFENDERS OF VILLE-MARIE, OF WHICH

HE WAS GOVERNOR, 1645-1647.

FOURTH GOVERNOR OF NEW FRANCE,

1645-1651.

DIED, 31st MAY, 1660.





OCCUPIED THE

MIDDLE OF NOTRE DAME ST.

Erected on the Seminary of St. Sulpice, Seminary wall, Place d'Armes.

HERE STOOD, UNTIL 1866,
THE CHURCH AND MONASTERY OF THE
RECOLLET FATHERS, ERECTED IN 1692, IN
WHICH ALSO WORSHIPPED
THE ANGLICANS FROM 1764 TO 1789
AND THE PRESBYTERIANS
FROM 1791 TO 1792.

Brected at corner St. Helen and Notre Dame Streets, 230 Notre Dame Street. IN 1675, HERE LIVED

DANIEL GRESOLON, SIEUR DULUTH,

ONE OF THE EXPLORERS OF THE UPPER

MISSISSIPPI;

AFTER WHOM THE CITY OF DULUTH

WAS NAMED.

Erected on east corner Notre Dame and St. Sulpice Streets.

HERE

MONSIEUR DE LAPRAIRIE

OPENED THE 1st PRIVATE SCHOOL IN

MONTREAL, 1683.

Erected on east corner Notre Dame and St. Sulpice Streets, 54 Notre Dame Street West. SITE OF THE CHATEAU OF
LOUIS-HECTOR DE CALLIÈRES, GOVERNOR
OF MONTREAL, 1684, OF NEW FRANCE,
1698-1703.
HE TERMINATED THE 14 YEARS' IROQUOIS
WAR BY TREATY OF MONTREAL, 1701.

Erected on Ogilvie Flour Mills Co. Building, 16 Youville Place, corner Port Street.

CONGREGATION OF NOTRE DAME
FOUNDED BY MARGUERITE BOURGEOYS.

CONVENT BUILT 1686.

JEANNE LE BER LIVED HERE SOLITARY
FROM 1685 TO 1714.

THE CHAPEL WAS CONSTRUCTED IN 1692.
RECONSTRUCTED IN 1769 AND 1823.

Erected on Notre Dame Street, opposite St. Lawrence Boulevard.

HERE REST THE MORTAL REMAINS
OF FRANÇOIS THORONHIONGO, HURON,
BAPTIZED BY THE
RÉVÉREND PÈRE BRÉBŒUF.
HE WAS, BY HIS PIETY, AND BY HIS
PROBITY, THE EXAMPLE OF THE
CHRISTIANS, AND THE ADMIRATION OF
THE UNBELIEVERS;
HE DIED AGED ABOUT 100 YEARS,
21st OF APRIL, 1690.

Erected inside the Old Tower, Grand Semimary.

HERE STOOD THE
CHURCH, CHAPEL AND RESIDENCE OF THE
JESUIT FATHERS, BUILT 1692,
OCCUPIED AS MILITARY HEADQUARTERS
1800, BURNED 1803.
CL ARLEVOIX, LAFITAU, AMONG OTHERS
SOJOURNED HERE.
ON THE SQUARE IN FRONT, FOUR
IROQUOIS SUFFERED DEATH BY FIRE IN
REPRISAL, BY ORDER OF FRONTENAC,
1696.

HERE REST THE MORTAL REMAINS OF

HE DIED IN 1701, CURÉ OF THE PARISH.



This tablet was originally placed on the west side of a house near the foot of St. Urbain Street. The building however has since been demolished and tablet is missing. SITE OF THE HOUSE
OF GENERAL RALPH BURTON,
SECOND GOVERNOR OF MONTREAL, 1763.
HE EXECUTED ON THE
PLAINS OF ABRAHAM, AT WOLFE'S DYING
COMMAND, THE MILITARY OPERATION
WHICH FINALLY DECIDED THE DAY.

Originally erected on St. Paul Street, opposite Bonsecours Market. The building has since been demolished and tablet is missing.

SIR WILLIAM JOHNSON OF
JOHNSON HALL ON THE MOHAWK RIVER,
THE CELEBRATED SUPERINTENDENT
OF INDIAN AFFAIRS,
AND FIRST AMERICAN BARONET,
COMMANDED THE INDIAN ALLIES WITH
AMHERST'S ARMY IN 1760.

MAJOR-GENERAL JAMES MURRAY,
BRIGADE COMMANDER UNDER WOLFE
AT QUEBEC, 1759, AND AFTERWARDS
FIRST BRITISH GOVERNOR OF CANADA,
ENCAMPED ON THIS PLATEAU
WITH THE SECOND DIVISION OF
AMHERST'S ARMY UPON THE SURRENDER
OF MONTREAL AND OF ALL CANADA,

IN HIS HONOR, ST. LAMBERT HILL
RECEIVED ITS NAME.

South corner St. Lawrence Boulevard and St. James Street. Building demolished and tablet missing. THIS SQUARE OCCUPIES THE SITE OF "LA CITADELLE" BUILT IN 1685, REPLACING THE MILL ERECTED BY MAISONNEUVE AND D'AILLEBOUST IN 1660. ROYAL EATTERY 1723. LEVELLED AND PRESENTED TO THE CITY BY EARL DALHOUSIE, GOVERNOR-GENERAL, 1821 NEAR THE EAST CORNER OF NOTRE DAME STREET STOOD THE PORTE ST-MARTIN (QUEBEC GATE). ETHAN ALLAN ENTERED IT PRISONER OF WAR, 1775. THIS STATION REPLACED THE FRENCH ARSENAL REMOVED 1881, WITH THE LAST PORTION OF THE FORTIFICATION WALLS IN 1721.


