REPORT FOR 1881.

The Board of the TORONTO HOME FOR INCURABLES gladly welcomes the warm friends and liberal supporters of this charity, on the occasion of this the first annual meeting held in their new and beautiful building, and hopefully looks forward to a continuance of their attachment in the loving work of caring for the lingering days of those who seek a shelter within its walls.

Kind friends have added to the furniture, and adorned the rooms, and the admirable arrangement of the building has enabled us to give it the character of a home rather than that of a hospital. To ensure these comforts has been our constant endeavour, and we hope that in some degree we have attained success.

Our family in March, 1881, numbered 39. There were 28 admitted during the year. The number at present in the HOME is 45; of these 26 are women, and 18 are men; besides whom we have under our care a sadly crippled little boy, who was pronounced incurable, and transferred to us from the Hospital for Sick Children.

We have to record the death of 12 patients during the year—7 men and 5 women. These deaths occurred chiefly among those admitted since our last annual meeting, several of them being brought to the HOME in the last stage of fatal disease.

The Board desires to place on record its appreciation of the kindness of the unknown friend who has presented to the city the gift of an ambulance, by which patients can be brought to this institution in comparative ease.

We bear testimony to the generous grants from the Ontario Government and the City Council.

We are much indebted to Mrs. Topp, the widow of the late President, Rev. Dr. Topp, for the donation of a clock, which is placed in the hall in memory of his name.

Mr. Forbes, the artist, having painted a portrait of the late Dr. Topp, presented it to Miss Dick, who, with her characteristic love for the HOME, has placed it in possession of the Board.

The sum of \$400 was received by Mrs. Cumberland, as the proceeds of an entertainment, given by the Hamilton Amateur Dramatic Club, assisted by some Toronto friends, in the Grand Opera House, on the 19th May, Mr. Manning having with much liberality given the use of the house free of charge. The greater part of this sum has been expended in gas fixtures, in planting trees, and in laying out the grounds, leaving a balance of \$129, which will be used for some special purpose.

Much pleasure has been afforded the inmates by many musical and interesting entertainments which have been given during the year by numerous kind friends, whose efforts are most cordially appreciated. Thanks are due also to the lady who has so kindly presided at the melodeon during the religious services.

The subscriptions for the year, which are liberal, amount to \$2,695.05; but friends are reminded that the work of the HOME is fast increasing, and its means must be kept equal to the demands upon its care.

We refer you to the Treasurer's Report for a specific statement as to receipts and expenditure.

The Board desires to establish a library for the use of the inmates. An invalid lady of Toronto has generously contributed books to the value of \$100. Let us hope that others may follow so good an example.

The debt upon the building is a burden of anxiety to the managers; the Board confidently appeals to the generous public of Toronto and of Ontario for means to liquidate the debt, which amounts to \$10,000, of which \$4,000 is a floating liability.

This institution, during the past year, has been called to mourn the death of two of its directors, who were from the inception of the HOME its liberal supporters and earnest workers; and we place on record our high esteem for the late Mr. F. W. Cumberland and Mr. A. T. McCord.

Mrs. Mulholland, who for some years has so successfully fulfilled the duties of Treasurer, has resigned them into the hands of Mrs. John Kay, the 3rd Lady Directress.

MEDICAL REPORT.

To the Board of Management of the HOME FOR INCURABLES :

LADIES AND GENTLEMEN,—The medical staff of the HOME beg leave to present their report for the year ending March, 1882. In doing so they desire to express their high sense of appreciation of the care and attention bestowed by the Board of Management and Matron upon the inmates of the HOME, and especially upon those who are in great measure helpless, and almost entirely dependent upon the care and kindness of those who have them in charge. The general health of the inmates during the year has been all that could be expected, and the sanitary condition of the HOME unexceptionably good ; cleanliness, proper ventilation, and an abundance of fresh air, the great desiderata of an institution of this kind, have not been wanting, and under these influences, together with proper nourishment and good nursing, many of the inmates, much debilitated on entering, have improved in general health, and have thus been rendered better able to bear up under their heavy afflictions. Some have even improved so much as to lend encouragement to the hope that the diseases formerly believed incurable might yet be permanently relieved. In regard to the mortality during the year, the staff have to report twelve deaths, the chief causes being paralysis and cancer. The following is a list of the decedents, with name, age, date and cause of death :

MRS. BOND, aged 45, died Feb. 27, 1882 ; cause of death, *cancer.*

The increase in the number of deaths during the past year is owing to some extent to the admission of patients from different municipalities in the last stages of disease. In one instance the patient lived only three weeks after admission ; another lived only a few hours after admission, having been so exhausted by her removal. In such cases as these it would be much more humane for the friends to allow them to remain and die in peace at their own homes, as their removal under such circumstances cannot fail to aggravate their disease and hasten their end. In one instance application was made for the admission of a poor woman in the last stage of cancer, but before the Board could be called together to consider the case, the patient died, and thus the poor unfortunate woman escaped the misery and suffering of the journey, and the institution the record of her death.

The staff cannot conclude their report without expressing their entire satisfaction with the manner in which the Matron and nurses have discharged their duties, and carried out every detail of instruction given them from time to time by the medical attendants.
