

London, March 18—The use of oil as a fuel for engines is coming more and more into vogue. It is but recently that a large order for steamers capable of being driven either by oil or coal was placed with firms on the northeast coast, and now the Great Western Railway Company has conducted a series of experiments with a view of superseding steam power by petrol or a combination of petrel with electricity.

They have installed on their Windsor branch line an experimental coach which is quite independent of steam power and overhead wires. This coach, which was designed by the British Thomson Houston Company is fitted with a Maudsley petrol engine, which transmits its power through an electric motor.


