There is before the Railway Committee of the House of Commons at the present time one of the most important bills that has been before that body for many years.

The promoters are asking for incorporation for the purpose of building a railway from the Pacific to the Atlantic ocean.

Now, the promoters of this scheme are the same gentlemen who run the Grand Trunk Railway which now has its terminus at Portland, Me., and its operation is naturally asked, not only by the members of the Railway Committee, but by the whole public.

Some of the press in discussing the matter appear to think that all that is necessary is for the Minister of Railways to jump on the promoters and say, if you will not make St. John or Halifax your winter port you no money.

Some members have advanced the proposition that the government extend its Railway to the West. They say if we are going to give large subsidies we might as well own the road.

The Railway Committee of the House of Commons passed yesterday a preamble of the Grand Trunk Pacific Railway bill, and when it adjourned the members were engaged in a general discussion of the bill. The most prominent, if not the sole, question was to what extent the Maritime Provinces would reap the benefit of the enterprise.

The question immediately arises, what inducement a shipper in choosing the route by which his freight shall be carried? These inducements are not only a determining factor in the choice of a shipper, but the freight rate. If the freight rate for Portland was exactly the same as that for St. John, and everything else was equal, it is hardly to be expected that a Canadian shipper would deliberately choose Portland; but so long as rates for Portland are a cent or even a fraction of a cent a barrel cheaper than those for St. John, the shipper will naturally choose the latter.

It is evident, therefore, that the whole matter is a question of freight rates and facilities for shipment. By the present Grand Trunk route Portland is the nearest to the sea. It is alleged, however, that by the adoption of the northern trans-continental route the positions are reversed.

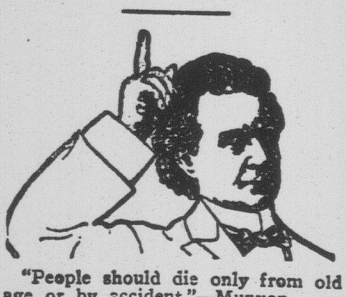

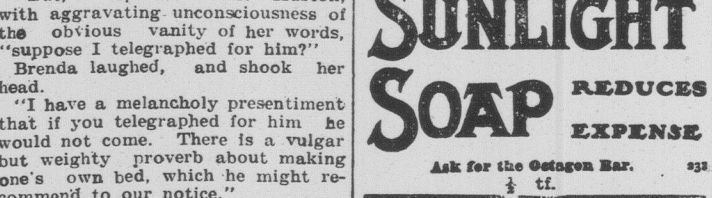

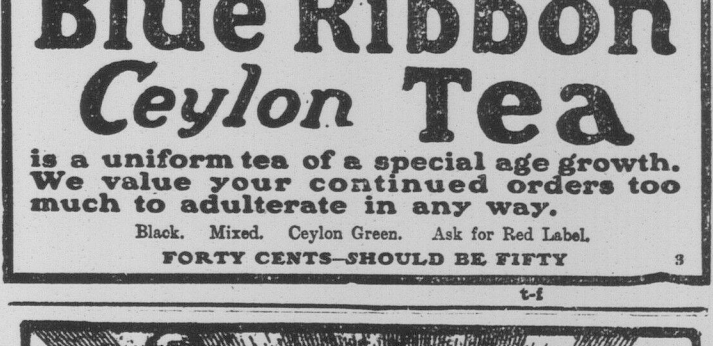
