Editorial Notes.

Occasionally statements are made in the public prints which go to prove that the policy of protection has in no few cases assisted Canada to the detriment of the products of other countries. An important admission was made a few days ago when Mr. Andrew Allan of the Allen line, and Mr. Torrance of the Dominion line of steamers waited on the premier at Ottawa on Wednesday last for the purpose of complaining that the iron duties had so enhanced the manufacture of pig-iron in Canada as to materially reduce the freight before obtained from that article. They asked that the duties be reduced or abolished. The premier promised to lay their views before his colleagues, but intimated that he was glad to hear from so independent a source that such an important success was attending the iron branch of the national policy and gave the reputation to hope that their views would prevail.

Three elections were held on Thursday last the result being that the party complexion remains the same as before. In Kingston the contest is said to have been close and resulting in the election of the Conservative candidate by the majority of 97, the total vote being as follows—Metcalf, 1,831; Gunn, 1,734. The vote at the election in 1891 was Sir John A. Macdonald, 1,784; Gunn, 1,301.

Metcalf in his speech on the evening after his election said:—Last night I was your candidate; to-night I am your member. It was the memory and deeds of the late premier that elected me. The eyes of Canada were towards Kingston and from one end of the country to the other there was jubilation because of this city being true to the government. Where is Sir Richard? he asked. The knight had come to Kingston and visited the speaker and the members of the government. He had got his reply.

The speaker concluded by saying he had heard Baroness Macdonald that King was true to the memory of her husband.

In Malton Henderson's majority is 441, the largest polled in the constituency since confederation, he leading in every polling district but one. The Conservative majority in the last election was 140.

In Lincoln the Liberal member, Gibson, was re-elected.

In Victoria, C. B. on Thursday last John A. Macdonald, a liberal conservative was elected by a majority of 42.

On Cumberland on Saturday last Mr. McKay was returned with a large majority than at the general election. The figures are McKay 2041; Howard 1125.

In Laval Hon. Mr. Oulmet was to have been opposed on Monday by Mr. St. Amour, but a despatch to the St. John Star says that late Saturday afternoon St. Amour, who had been induced to leave his unlicensed grocery and champion the Laurier cause, sneaked into the returning officer's place, withdrew his deposit and retired from the contest. So demoralized and discredited was the Laurier cause that the Liberal candidate would not have received 100 votes in the entire county. AN OPEN LETTER TO BUSINESS MEN AND COMMERCIAL TRAVELLERS.

The Travellers' Circle of Canada wish to call your attention to the system of treating and being treated to intoxicating liquors when transacting business. We are pleased to note that this custom is now by many entirely avoided, yet some are led to continue it, perhaps fearing that to discontinue a practice they have followed for some time might affect the success of their business. We believe no merchant will allow himself to be biased in the place of an order by a treat from a traveller who is visiting him, but we feel the practice in the past has sometimes been adopted, in the hope of so influencing the customer, and some travellers who have practiced it have been gradually led into the use of intoxicants to such an extent as to ruin themselves, while in some cases it has resulted in the loss of their situations and suffering to their families.

In these days of keen competition a traveller sometimes finds his sales not equal to his anticipation, a spirit of hesitancy is apt to take possession of him, and if he is susceptible to the influence of alcohol, and has taken some with his customers during the day he is likely to indulge further at night when he meets his fellow-travellers after his customers have gone home.

We ask retail merchant to give this matter their careful consideration, remembering that many of these young men have come from homes where parents, sisters and brothers are anxious about their welfare, or perhaps a young wife who has confided her all in him, has high hopes of his success on the road, trusting he may soon secure promotion or establish a business for himself, and continue for her a comfortable and happy home. Kindly abstain from being a party to any course, which, indulged in, will wreck all those high hopes and leave the victim a nuisance to society. It is individual effort that counts, and every man should recognize that he has a responsibility on this question.

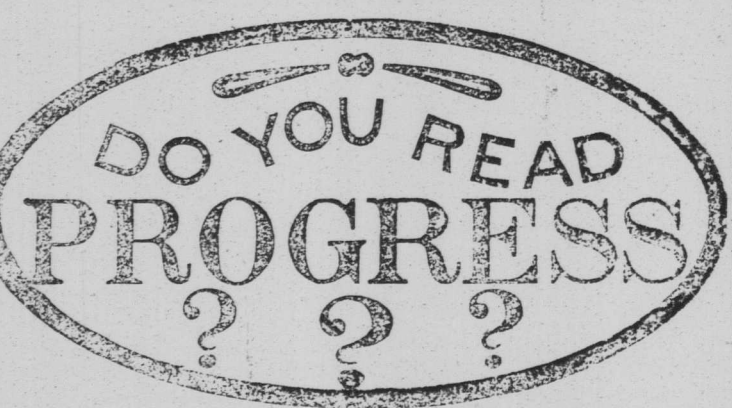
