A Convention is sitting at Frankfort, in Kentucky, which might furnish a salutary lesson to the Canadian. It is a free and self-constituted assembly of the people, and its proceedings are open to all eyes.

The State of New York embraces within its limits the material resources of a Empire. Its resources are not only abundant, but they are also well protected.

There is not one man, we will venture to say, at least in Canada, England, or the United States, who will acknowledge that it is time for the American Confederation.

When men warn you to beware of American institutions, they are heaping upon you the reproaches of a nation which is your neighbor.

What has been the result? Why, under the old system, men were wont to law and to wait the decision of the Judges, and the Judges were wont to perform all the work which the law required.

There is no doubt that the Convention, and the Convention of Kentucky, assembled at Frankfort, is imitating the example of the State of New York.

THE BRITISH LEAGUE.

We think it was Edgewood, who observed that the revolutions of the human mind are slow, like the course of the life of Nations.

The converts to this belief have rapidly increased in number since the fatal step taken by England, of determining to make no distinction in coming to terms with the Colonies and Foreign Countries.
