OUR ENVOY AT WASHINGTON.

CANADA REPRESENTED IN THE FISHERY NEGOTIATIONS.

Hon. C. E. Tupper goes to the Republic's Capital on an important mission. Mr. McMillan's former Canadian Envoy to the United States.

OTTAWA, Feb. 24.—Hon. Charles E. Tupper, Minister of Marine and Fisheries, is now on his way to Washington as a representative of the Canadian Government in the negotiations pending between Great Britain and the United States for the settlement of the fisheries disputes.

This information was unexpectedly brought out in the House this afternoon in response to a question by Mr. Jones of Halifax. Mr. Jones had asked whether or not the Canadian Government intended to appoint a Canadian commissioner to participate in the fishery negotiations at Washington.

Sir John's answer was a surprise. "There has been no formal announcement," he said, "but the Minister of Marine and Fisheries left this afternoon to represent Canada at Washington." That was all the information given to the House but it was learned subsequently that Mr. Tupper's hasty departure for Washington was the result of a message received by the Governor-General yesterday from Sir Julian Pauncefote stating that formal negotiations were about to commence and leaving the presence of a Canadian Government representative. The matter was considered in committee this afternoon and was decided that Mr. Tupper should go.

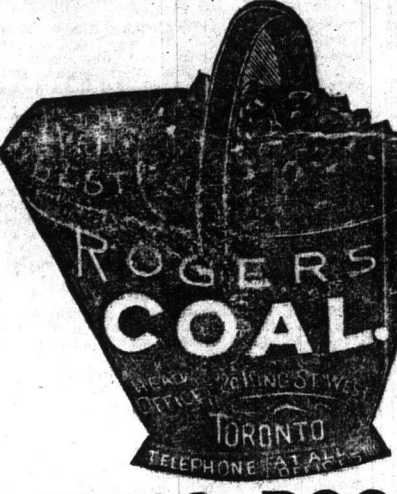
