THE GOVERNMENT SUSTAINED.

Probably 40 Majority—Conservative Leaders Defeated.

In the maritime provinces the returns indicate substantial Liberal gains. In Quebec the Liberals also gain, but in Ontario the Conservatives had much the best of the fight.

The returns up to ten o'clock this morning indicate that the Laurier government will be returned by a slightly reduced majority. Probably the most sensational turnover was in Cape Breton county, where the Opposition leader and his colleague were snowed under.

In this county Mr. Wade won a splendid victory, defeating Mr. Mills, who has represented the constituency for fourteen years and was considered well liked favorably.

Mr. Wade is receiving an avalanche of congratulations, and he deserves them. The county has elected a very able and capable representative.
