### FISHERIES' DEPARTMENT.

*Cape Sable Seal Island Light.*—The first Light in approaching the Bay of Fundy is on the South Point of the Seal Island. This is a plain White Light, elevated about eighty feet above high water mark, and may be seen on approaching the Island from any point of the compass. A very dangerous rock, under water, but upon which the sea always breaks, called *Blonde Rock*, lies about  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles S. by W. by compass, from the Light House. Between this rock and the Island, there are some dangers—the ground is rocky throughout, and large vessels, therefore, ought not to attempt passing between them.

*Brier Island Light.*—In advancing up the Bay, the next Light is situated on Brier Island, about half a mile N. E. from the N. W. point thereof—a plain white light.

*Digby Gut Light.*—The next light on the coast of Nova Scotia, is placed on the West side of Digby Gut—from Brier Island North Eastward. The coast is very bold, and not indented; the light is therefore chiefly intended as a guide into Digby Basin—a white light.

*Gannet Rock Light.*—This light is intended to warn vessels of their approach to a very dangerous range of shoals and ledges, which extend from the Old Proprietor to the Seal Islands, off Machias, a distance of about twenty miles. It is a light of the Fourth order, Holograph system—fixed white light 45 seconds, eclipse  $5\frac{1}{2}$ , flash  $5\frac{1}{2}$ , eclipse  $5\frac{1}{2}$ . The Light House is painted in stripes, vertical, black and white.

*Bearings and Distance by Compass from the Gannet Rock Light House.* This Light bears from the Light House on Brier Island, N. N. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W., 22 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Old Proprietor, E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., distance 7 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Black Rock, off White Head Island, N. E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E., 7 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the South West Head of Grand Manan, N. N. W.,  $6\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

From the Gannet Rock to the Northernmost of the Murr Ledges, N. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.,  $2\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

To the Southernmost of ditto, called Saint Mary's Ledge, W. S. W. 2 miles.

From the Gannet Rock to Machias Seal Island, W. and by N.,  $\frac{1}{2}$  N., 12 miles.

NOTE.—Between the Northernmost and Southernmost of the Murr Ledges, there is a range of dangerous rocks and shoals, many of them always above water, and which extends Westward from the Light House about four miles; from this range, farther Westward, about six miles from the Gannet Light, lies a dangerous breaker, called the Bull. This may be avoided by keeping three remarkable headlands near the S. W. end of Grand Manan, open.

From Brier Island Light to the Old Proprietor, N. and by W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  W.,  $18\frac{1}{2}$  miles.

The Blonde Rock from the Southernmost point of the Cape Sable Seal Islands S. and by W.,  $3\frac{1}{2}$  miles distant.

*Machias Seal Island Lights.*—There are two fixed *white* lights upon the Machias Seal Islands, one elevated about forty-five feet above high water; the other a new tower, erected last season, fitted with a 3d Dioptric light, stands 69 feet above high water level, and visible from all points of approach for a distance of 25 miles in clear weather; and bear from each other E. S. E. and W. N. W., distant about 170 feet, by which circumstance of two Light Houses at the same station, they will be immediately distinguished from all other lights upon the coast (British or American.) Both the buildings are painted white. The following are the bearings from them, viz.:

To the Southernmost Murr Ledge (St. Mary's) E. S. E., easterly.

" Gannet Rock Light, E. by S.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S., 13 miles.

" Southern Head of Grand Manan, E. by N.  $\frac{1}{2}$  N.

" Northern Head of Grand Manan, N. E.  $\frac{1}{2}$  E.

" N. E. Rock, distant 2 miles, N. E. by N.

" Little River Head, N. by W.

" Libby Island Light House (American), N. W. by W.

Vessels standing to the Northward, between these Lights and the Gannet Rock, should tack or haul off the moment they bring these Lights in one, as they will not then be more than three-fourths of a mile from the Murr Ledges, if more than five miles to the East of the Lights.

[It is recommended that the Ships' Compasses should be well compared and adjusted particularly in new ships, before they leave Partridge Island, as serious errors have frequently occurred from want of attention on this point; and as the variation in the Bay of Fundy is seventeen degrees Westward, (or  $1\frac{1}{2}$  points), it will be found by the latest published Admiralty Charts, that the course from Partridge Island down the Bay, South Channel, between the Old Proprietor and N. W. Ledge, is S. W.  $\frac{1}{2}$  S.; but the course to be steered must depend on the direction of the wind on leaving Partridge Island.]

*Head Harbour Light.*—Next in order, after passing Grand Manan and the plain white Light (American), on West Quoddy Point, is Head Harbour Light. This is placed on the North East extremity of Campobello, and is a guide to vessels entering the main channel to West Isles,

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Moose Island, and the inner Bay of Passamaquoddy; it enables vessels also at all times to enter Head Harbour—it is a fixed *white* light. The building is painted white, with a red cross on it.

*Point Le Preaux Lights.*—Upon this projecting head land, two lights are placed, one above the other, in the same house, and distant 28 feet. Both lights can be seen from every point of the compass, they where may be useful—both are fixed, and *white*. The Light House is painted red and white, in stripes of five feet broad each, horizontally.

A Steam Fog Alarm has been placed in this Station, which will sound twice in each minute.

*Partridge Island Light.*—This Light at the entrance of the River and Harbour of Saint John, having been established upwards of forty years, requires no particular notice, further than that it is a fixed *white* light, and that the Light House and Keeper's Dwelling are painted red and white, in vertical stripes. The Steam Whistle on this Island is sounded ten seconds in every minute during foggy or thick weather.

*Beacon Light.*—Within Partridge Island, and upon a Spit or Bar, which extends about half a mile S. S. E. off Sand Point, and which dries at two-thirds ebb, stands the Beacon Tower. Upon this Tower a Fourth Order Dioptric Light, visible ten miles, is established, which is eminently useful to the coasting trade of Saint John, and to all other vessels having pilots on board, as it enables them to enter the harbour at all hours of the night. A fixed *white* light. The house is white and black, in stripes vertically.

*Quaco.*—A revolving *white* light is placed on a small rock off Quaco Head, showing twice full and twice dark in a minute. This light can be seen from any quarter where a vessel can approach. The Light House is painted white and red, in horizontal stripes.

*Cape Enrage Light.*—On the Point of that name, in Westmorland, nearly opposite Apple River Harbour, N. S. A plain *white* light. The house is painted white, and is about 120 feet above tide mark. Light visible 13 miles.

*West Quoddy Light.*—This is an American Light, and is placed on the West side of the entrance into the St. Croix by Lubec and Eastport.

*Cape Porchu Light.*—On Cape Forechu, on the Western side of the entrance to Yarmouth (Nova Scotia), in lat. 43°30', N. long. 66°8' W. It exhibits a plain, revolving light—visible one minute and a quarter, and invisible half a minute. The building is painted white, and is elevated 235 feet above the level of the sea.

*Grindstone Island Light.*—An Octagonal Tower, 60 feet above the level of high water on Grindstone Island, in Chignecto Bay, in lat. 45° 43' 13" N. Long. 64° 37' 25" W. The Tower is painted white, as is also the Keeper's House, one story, situate about 50 feet to the Eastward of the Tower.

Bearings and distances of several places from the above Light House: Cape Enrage Light, by compass, S. 61½ W., 10 1-7 miles.

Highest Point of St. Mary's Ledge, by compass, N. 40 W., 6-10 mile. The point of low water off the Light House, by compass, S. 78 W., 2-10 mile.

Jones' Ledge, N. 10 W., 3-10 mile—it dries at low springs, and has about 2½ fathoms on it at half tide.

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*Grand Manan.*—There is a Light House and Keeper's house at the "Swallow Tail," on the North Eastern part of the Island of Grand Manan, in the Bay of Fundy. The Light is 45 feet from Base to Deck; the point on which it stands is 103 feet above high water, making 148 feet elevation. This is a conspicuous mark in the South Channel between Briar Island and Grand Manan. Both houses are painted white.

*Richibucto Head Light.*—This is a fixed White Light, situated on Richibucto Head, Northumberland Strait, in the Gulf of Saint Lawrence. The light is placed at an elevation of 70 feet above high water, and should be seen in clear weather from a distance of 14 miles. The illuminating apparatus is dioptric or by lenses of the fourth order. The tower is square, about 50 feet high from base to vane, painted white, and stands in lat.  $46^{\circ} 39' 40''$  N., long.  $64^{\circ} 43' 30''$  W. of Greenwich.

*Cape Jourdain, Straits of Northumberland.*—Lat.  $46^{\circ} 10' 00''$  N.; long.  $63^{\circ} 51' 00''$  W.—Visible from all points of approach from S. E. around by N. to W. The Light House is an octagonal wooden pyramidal building, painted white, 40 feet high, elevated 72 feet above high water, and stands 66 feet from the extremity of the cliff. The Keeper's house, a one and a half story wooden building, painted white, is situated 50 feet to the westward of the Light House.

*Point Escuminac Light.*—This Light House is situated in Miramichi Bay, north latitude  $47^{\circ} 4' 30''$ ; west longitude,  $64^{\circ} 50' 30''$ . It is a fixed bright light, elevated seventy feet above high water. A Third Order French Dioptric lighting apparatus has been placed on this Tower, which is visible for twenty-five miles.

*Miscoon Island Light.*—This Light House is situated on Birch Point, north latitude  $48^{\circ} 1' 00''$ ; west longitude,  $64^{\circ} 30' 00''$ . It is a fixed red light, elevated seventy-nine feet above high water.

*Shediac Lights.*—On Point DuChene Wharf, in the summer, north latitude  $46^{\circ} 14' 6''$ ; west longitude  $64^{\circ} 31' 5''$ . It is a fixed White light.

Two Fixed White Beacon Lights on Shediac Island, visible ten miles.

*Miramichi River.*—Light House on Portage Island. Fixed White Light, elevated — feet above high water.

Two Beacon Lights on "Preston's Beach," about five miles above Escuminac Light. Two Beacon Lights at Oak Point. Two Beacon Lights at "Grant's." All fixed *white* Lights. Visible ten miles.

*Caraquet Island, Bay de Chaleur.*—A new Light Tower and Keeper's House is in course of erection. Character not yet determined on.

*River St. John Lights.*—Green Head, Sand Point, Oak Point, No Man's Friend, Oromocto Shoals, Wilmot's Bluff, and Cox's Point, Grand Lake. Visible ten miles.

### RATES OF PILOTAGE.

*Established by a Law or Ordinance of the Common Council of the City  
of St. John—passed 27th July, 1869.*

One dollar per foot for bringing any Ship or Vessel into the Harbour of Saint John, and mooring her in a safe place or berth, or securing her alongside of one of the wharves ; and One dollar per foot for removing or taking any Ship or Vessel out of the Harbour.

In cases where Pilots shall be detained on board of vessels, under and by virtue of the Quarantine or Health Laws of the Province, they shall be entitled to demand and receive from Masters of such vessels, the sum of Two Dollars per day, for every day of such detention, in addition to the allowance aforesaid.

Coasting Vessels (unless square rigged), going from one part of the Bay of Fundy to another, vessels not exceeding 100 tons burthen, registered at any port within the Dominion, Steamboats, and Vessels propelled by steam, trading and plying between this port and any port or ports in North America, and all Vessels drawing under six feet of water, are not compelled to take pilots; when employed, they are to be paid according to the rate above mentioned.

For removing vessels from any mooring ground to any wharf, or from one wharf to another wharf, and seeing them properly moored or secured, the following rates: For Vessels not exceeding one hundred tons, One dollar and Fifty cents; for vessels over one hundred, and not exceeding two hundred tons, Two Dollars; for vessels over two hundred, and not exceeding three hundred tons, Three Dollars; and for all vessels over three hundred, and not exceeding four hundred tons, the sum of Four Dollars; and twenty-five cents additional for every fifty tons each Vessel may measure over four hundred tons.

*First Distance.*—From Partridge Island to Musquash Head, bearing North West, One dollar per foot.

*Second Distance.*—From Musquash Head to Point Le Preaux, bearing North West, One dollar and Twenty five cents per foot.

*Third Distance.*—From Point Le Preaux to North Head of Grand Manan, bearing North West, or North Channel, bearing South East, one dollar and Fifty cents per foot.

*Fourth Distance.*—From the North Head of Grand Manan, or North Channel, as aforesaid, to Machias Seal Island, bearing South, or Brier Island, bearing South-East, One dollar and Seventy five cents per foot.

*Fifth Distance.*—Any where outside of and beyond the fourth distance, and within a bound ranging with Mount Desert and Cape Sable Seal Islands, bearing Northwest and Southeast, being the outer cruising bound, Two dollars per foot.

### Rates of Slippage at the Corporation Slips.

All decked vessels, same rates as for wharfage ; woodboats, or other boats, or undecked vessels, having standing masts, and all scows, and not lying at the wharves on either side of the Slips, to pay the following rates :

All empty packages to pay half the rates of full packages; and on all goods, wares, and merchandize not hereinbefore enumerated and rated, to pay at the rate of one shilling per ton weight or measurement, at the opinion of the collector, proprietor, or lessee of the wharf or wharves where the same is placed.

## Time for Going Through the Falls.

The Falls are level or still water at about three and a half hours on the flood, and about two and a half on the ebb, so that they are passable four times in twenty-four hours, about ten or fifteen minutes each time. No other rule can be given, as much depends on the floods in the River Saint John, and the time of high water or full sea, which is often hastened by high winds, and in proportion to the height of them.

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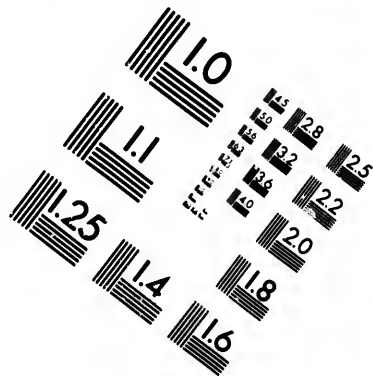
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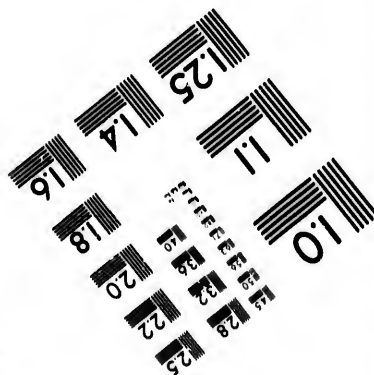
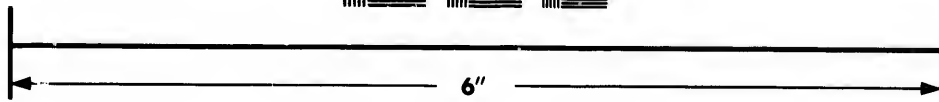

This Railway, 108 miles in length, extends from the harbour of St John, Bay of Fundy, to the harbour of Shediac, on the Gulf of St. Lawrence. It was constructed at a cost of about five million dollars, and is run by the Government.

From Amherst, 138 miles from Saint John, travellers are conveyed daily, by four-horse coaches, 65 miles to Truro, and thence, 64 miles, by Railway, to Halifax, Nova Scotia.

During the Summer, Steamers running from Shediac, in connection with the European and North American Railway, convey passengers and freight to the northern portion of New Brunswick; to Canada and Prince Edward Island.

The Governor in Council may, from time to time, transfer to the list of goods which may be imported into Canada free of duty, any or all articles (whether natural articles or products of manufactures), used as materials in Canadian manufactures; and any such materials mentioned in any Order in Council in that behalf, shall be free of duties of Customs from the time therein appointed for that purpose.

The Governor in Council may authorise the admission, free of duty, of any machinery to be used in any Canadian manufactory, on satisfactory evidence that like machinery is not then manufactured in Canada.

**Table for Foretelling the Weather through all the Lunations of each Year.**

This Table, and the accompanying remarks, are the result of many years' actual observation; the whole being constructed on a due consideration of the attraction of the Sun and Moon, in their several positions respecting the Earth, and will, by simple inspection, show the observer what kind of weather will most probably follow the entrance of the Moon into any of its quarters, and that so near the truth as to be seldom found to fail.

**The Time Ball, at the Observatory on Fort Howe, St. John, N. B.,**

Will be hoisted half its elevation each day (Sundays excepted) at fifteen minutes before 1 o'clock. At one minute before 1 o'clock it will be hoisted its full height; and at 1 o'clock, mean time at Observatory, the Ball will be dropped. A Chronometer keeping correct Greenwich time, should then shew 5h. 24m. 15s., and the difference between this and the time shewn by a Chronometer, is its true error on Greenwich time at that moment. As the above hour of 1 o'clock, when the Ball drops, represents 5h. 24m. 15s. at Greenwich, the error of a Chronometer may be ascertained, no matter where the Ship is lying. Masters of vessels arriving at Saint John should compare their Chronometers by the Time Ball, as it will enable them to get the sea rate, which frequently varies from harbor rates.
