- First*—A Total Eclipse of the Sun, May 17th; invisible. Visible to Europe, Asia, and upper larger part of Africa.
Second—An Annular Eclipse of the Sun, November 2. Invisible. Visible to Australia and Polynesia.
Third—A Transit of Venus across the Sun's Disk, December 6; visible in some degree to a large part of the world, excepting Eastern Europe and Asia; and wholly visible to the Eastern portion of North America and to South America.

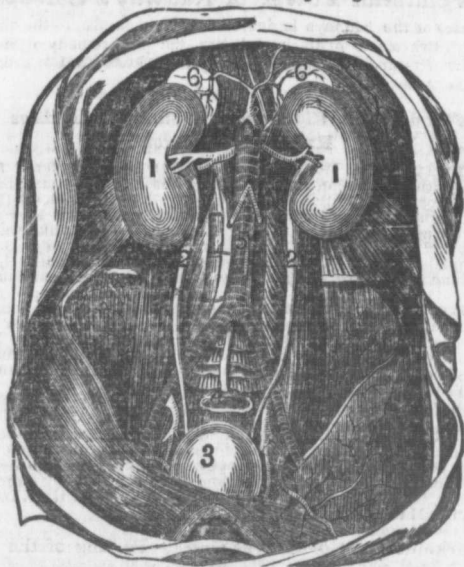

The above rates must in every case be prepaid by postage stamp. When posted wholly unpaid they cannot be forwarded, but will be sent to the Dead Letter Office. Insufficiently paid letters on which a full rate of postage is paid, will be forwarded charged with double the deficient postage, except letters to the United States, which must be fully prepaid.
