London, Sept. 30—Preference for continuatio

n of the volunteer system is said to have been expressed by Earl Kitchener at a meeting of labor executives yesterday, addressed by the war secretary. He said, however, that the present rate of recruiting was not equal to the needs.

Earl Kitchener explained that his own plan, which had not yet been authorized by the government, was to apply the system of the military ballot. Every district would be required to furnish its quota of men. In case this quota could not be obtained by voluntary enlistment, the required number would be selected by ballot among the men of military age, and the enlistment of those chosen, would be compulsory. The secretary added there had been no slackening of the pressure to bring out recruits.

Russians Pushing The Enemy Back; Day's Latest News

Petrograd, Sept. 30—Territorial gains of considerable extent by the Russians are indicated by the latest information received at the war office. The Germans have been pushed back from the terminal station at Glubokoi, on the Svient-syanov-Gluboi railroad, to a point midway to the Vilna-Dvinsk railway. The position thus reached is the station of Postawy, representing a gain of twenty-five miles. In the district west and south of Molodechno, the Germans have been forced back eight miles across the Lida-Modechno railway, beyond the

At no part of the northern lines, have German gains been announced, alth ough battles of great intensity are be-ing fought on the line from Koziany, on the Dvina River, to Krivo, a distance of sixty miles in a straight line.

The judge's charge will be given this afternoon following which the case will go to the jury.

London, Sept. 30—The captain, first and second mate, and carpenter of the American sailing ship Vincent were injured in a fire which destroyed the vessel.

The Vincent was blown up September 27 by a mine off Cape Orloff in the White Sea, and is a total loss. The crew was saved, but Captain Amberman and three men were injured.
