TWENTIETH SESSION.

KINGSTON, JUNE 5TH, 1882.

The Twentieth Session of the Incorporated Synod of the Diocese of Ontario opened this day.

DIVINE SERVICE IN THE CATHEDRAL.

PETITIONS AND CORRESPONDENCE.

The Rev. Canon Bleasdel presented a memorial from the Incumbent and Churchwardens of Trinity Church, Frankford, referring to a memorial presented by them in December last, and praying that the prayer of that memorial may be granted forthwith.

The Rev. W. Roberts presented a memorial from himself as Incumbent of the parish of Amherst Island, desiring permission to lease for a term of ten years from Nov. 1st, 1882, the land which forms the endowment of said parish.

This memorial was referred to the Committee on Petitions as to Sales of Land.

STIPEND OF BISHOP OF ALGOMA.

The Clerical Secretary read a communication from the Rev. Canon Norman, Hon. Clerical Secretary of the Provincial Synod, calling attention to the scale of assessment of the several Dioceses of this Ecclesiastical Province proposed by the Provincial Synod at its recent session, in order to make up a stipend of \$4000 per annum for the Bishop of Algoma, viz. :—

Toronto, \$1,000; Huron, \$700; Niagara, \$500; Montreal, \$500; Ontario, \$400; Quebec, \$300; Frederickton, \$300; and Nova Scotia, \$300.

SUSPENSION OF RULES OF ORDER.

The Rules of Order being suspended, it was moved by Judge McDonald, seconded by Dr. Henderson,

That a Committee be named by His Lordship the Bishop to consider and report during the present Session of Synod upon the mode in which the amount to be contributed annually by this Diocese towards the stipend of the Bishop of the Missionary Diocese of Algoma shall be provided.—*Carried.*

STAFFORD CHURCHYARD CASE.

The Rev. Rural Dean Nesbitt presented a memorial from the Incumbent and Churchwardens of St. Stephen's Church, Stafford, appealing to the Synod and Churchmen generally for sympathy and aid in raising an indemnity fund of \$300 to pay the costs of a test case of trespass which they were forced to take in order to defend the Church property of the Parish.

The memorial was referred to a Committee consisting of Rev. C. P. Emery, Mr. Reynolds, and Dr. Ruttan.

COMMUNICATIONS RESPECTING THE BIBLE.

A communication was read from the Presbyterian Synod of Hamilton and London asking the co-operation of this Synod in having the Bible used as a text-book in the public schools of Ontario.

A communication was also read from the President and officers of the Upper Canada Bible Society, calling attention to the operations of that Society and its need of increased support.

These communications were referred to the Book and Tracts Committee.

A communication asking for a reduced rate of interest on loan was referred to the Investment Committee.

NOTICES OF MOTIONS.

By Rev. Canon Bleasdel.

That the memorial presented by the Incumbent and Churchwardens of Trinity Church, Frankford, referring to a General Cemetery, be not referred to any Committee but considered on its merits by the Synod in due course of business.

By Mr. H. B. White.

That a Committee be appointed to draft a memorial to the Legislature of Ontario, setting forth why, in the opinion of this Synod, that the bill presented to, and referred by them to the Committee on Private Bills, for the purpose of granting the new Protestant Episcopal Divinity School in Toronto the power of granting degrees be not concurred in. Such committee to be named by the Lord Bishop with instructions to report during the present session of Synod.

By Rev. F. W. Kirkpatrick.

That the Clerical Secretary be authorized to pay to the Bishop of Algoma on his consecration the sum of \$250, the amount of Episcopal Stipend accruing due since the death of the late Bishop, to be used by him at his discretion as part of general purpose fund for that Diocese.

By the Chancellor.

No clergyman can take or assume, or shall be considered as having taken or assumed, the charge of any Parish, Church, or Mission unless he first obtains from the Clerical Secretary of the Synod and to whom the License hereinafter mentioned shall be forwarded by the Bishop, the Bishop's License to officiate in such Parish, Church or Mission. The date and terms of the said License shall be entered by the Clerical Secretary in a Registry Book to be kept by him for that purpose, and on payment to him of the sum of One Dollar by the Clergyman to whom the License is addressed he shall deliver to such Clergyman the License. The sums so received by the Clerical Secretary shall be placed by him to the credit of the Assessment Fund of the Synod.

By Rev. R. Lewis.

That in the opinion of this Synod \$120 per annum is sufficient rent for the school offices and the use of St. George's Hall for four days; and that the Cleri-

cal Secretary be requested to notify the owners thereof that no more will be paid in future. And in case this offer is refused the Secretaries be authorized to rent suitable rooms, rent not to exceed \$120.

By Mr. Wilmot.

That a Committee be appointed to consider the question of assessing the several parishes and missions of this Diocese for the purpose of raising the amount required to carry on the missionary work of this Diocese.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS.

Moved by the Chancellor, seconded by Judge McDonald,

That the amendment of Canon XXVI, passed at the last session of the Synod be confirmed, as follows:

1. That Sub-section 3 of Section 5 of Canon XXVI be repealed, and the following substituted:

"That in case of failure to offer himself for ordination, or to procure the necessary testimonials, after being thereunto required by the Bishop of the Diocese, unless delayed by illness or other cause satisfactory to the said Bishop, he shall within six months after being so required, refund the full amount which he has received from the Fund, with interest."

2. That Sub-section 4 of Section 5 of Canon XXVI be amended by inserting the words "with interest" after the word "refund."—*Carried.*

The motions of Mr. Walkem, Q.C., for the adoption of a proposed Canon respecting Secretaries, and also of a Canon for the Settlement of Parochial Disputes, were allowed to stand over as unfinished business.

The motion of the Hon. Lewis Wallbridge, Q.C., for a Committee of Enquiry respecting Lands belonging to the Rectory of Belleville was dropped, the mover not being present.

Moved by Rev. J. A. Morris, seconded by Rev. Rural Dean Nesbitt,

That the following members of this Synod be a Committee to report at the present Session on certain alleged deficiencies in the endowment of the Rectory or Mission of Ameliasburg: Rev. Rural Dean Baker, Rev. Richard Lewis, Mr. Reynolds, Mr. Barlow, and the mover and seconder.—*Carried.*

Moved by the Rev. J. W. Burke, seconded by the Rev. J. A. Morris,

That a Committee be appointed by the Lord Bishop to enquire and report what lands liable to sale belonging to the Rectory of Belleville, by whatever name the same are called, have been sold, the sum realized or yet unpaid thereon, and what income is derived therefrom, what lands belonging to the said Rectory are yet unsold, with power to report to the next Synod or to the Executive Committee, as the Committee may see fit.—*Carried.*

The Bishop appointed Rev. Rural Dean Baker as a member of the Committee.

And it shall be the duty of the Clerical Secretary to forward to the Bishop annually a list of the Clergy who have failed to forward the collections taken up in their parishes in proper time.

The resolution was referred to the Committee on the Stipends of Missionaries, the names of the mover and seconder being added to that Committee.

9.—REPORT OF THE COMMITTEE ON JAMES SHANNON'S CLAIM TO BE ADMITTED AS LAY DELEGATE FROM ST. PAUL'S CHURCH.

[Not Adopted.]

The Committee appointed to consider the claim of Mr. James Shannon to sit as delegate for the parish of St. Paul's Church, Kingston, beg leave to report as follows :

From the statements laid before them by the parties they find the following facts :

1. That Mr. James Shannon was duly elected as a representative to the Synod for St. Paul's Church for three years at the Easter Vestry in 1881.

2. That he ceased to attend that Church though he remained a pew holder till last Easter and began to attend St. James' Church, Kingston, about the 1st August, 1881, and he has continued to attend St. James' and has been a communicant at that Church since that time.

3. That at the Vestry Meeting of St. Paul's Church held at Easter, 1882, the question of the effect of Mr. Shannon's absence as affecting his status as a delegate was brought up, the seat was declared vacant, and Mr. Zachariah Guy was elected in his stead.

It was contended on behalf of Mr. Guy that Mr. Shannon had under the provisions of section 7 of the Constitution forfeited his position as delegate by wilfully absenting himself from public worship in St. Paul's Church, which he had been accustomed to attend, for the space of six calendar months.

Your committee cannot concur in this contention which restricts the meaning of the word "Church" to a particular place of worship, and is in their opinion utterly opposed to the spirit of that part of the Constitution affecting lay representation in the Synod.

It seems to your committee that it could never have been intended by the framers of the Constitution to permit representation by absentees and yet to disqualify a representative for changing his place of attendance at the public worship of the Church, and they consider that the word "Church," even though it

is coupled with the words "which he had been accustomed to attend" must be read as meaning the Church of England.

The contention of Mr. Guy, if supported, would lead to this result that a representative though an absentee at the time of his election would forfeit his seat by changing his place of attendance at public worship, even although he should still be to the Church as whose representative he was originally elected.

We see no escape from this conclusion in the provisions of the Constitution.

We are further strengthened in our conviction by an attentive consideration of the provisions of the 7th section respecting disqualifications.

In the first part of the section are grouped together those disqualifications which do not affect a man's status in the Church; in the second, beginning with the word "moreover," are grouped those disqualifications which affect or ought to affect his status as a Church member. It was not intended we think that a man who merely changes his place of worship though attending the same Church should be classed with and incur the same penalty as seceders from the Church, abstainers from the Holy Communion or convicted criminals.

The use of the word "wilfully" in the connection in which it is found in the Constitution implies the doing of something which might not be done; and the leaving of one place of worship belonging to the Church and going to another can hardly be regarded as an offence or as even censurable.

We think that the word "Church" in the sentence "or should he wilfully absent himself from public worship in the Church which he had been accustomed to attend" means the Church of England generally.

We find therefore that Mr. James Shannon has not forfeited his seat as a delegate from St. Paul's Church, and that he is still entitled to sit as a delegate.

Proposed Canons, Reports of Provisional Committees, &c.

I.—PROPOSED CANON ON CONTESTED SEATS IN SYNOD.

Proposed by Dr. Henderson, seconded by the Rev. Dr. Wilson.

1. The Clerical Secretary, under the direction of the Bishop, shall enter the names of those clergymen who are entitled to seats in the Synod on the Synod List mentioned in the fifth section of the Constitution.

2. Any member of the Church of England resident in the Diocese of Ontario may object to the claims of any person on the said list to take a seat in the Synod, provided always that the objections, together with the grounds thereof in writing, be transmitted by him to the Clerical Secretary and to the party so objected to one week at least before the meeting of Synod; provided also

objection may be taken at the Synod. The name of the objector shall not have to be decided upon forthwith. The Chancellor of the Diocese shall be a member of the Synod, together with two lay members, who shall be appointed by the Synod, to be also appointed to divine service, shall be appointed to examine the certificates that may be submitted to the Synod, and to them shall be reported to the Synod. The Synod shall be in order at any time.

2.—PROPOSED

Proposed by Dr. Henderson. That the second section of the Discipline in the Church of England be amended by inserting the words "Or whose usual place of worship appears to be gone by reason of the following shall be entitled to sit as a delegate from the said Canon: 'The Clerical Secretary, so that he cannot be a member of the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario be a member of the Synod and entitled to sit as a delegate from the Synod being first had, and

The Committee on the proposed Canon submit the following report after due consideration of the several suggestions. In the Diocese of Ontario, the objects should be kept in view. To apply the Missionary Canon to render each Mission

objection may be taken and given during the session of the Synod to any person whose name shall not have been entered on the Synod List, and shall be heard and decided upon forthwith.

3. The Chancellor of the Diocese, or in his absence any barrister-at-law, being a member of the Synod, to be appointed by the Bishop, together with two clerical and two lay members, whose title to seats had not been disputed before the Synod, to be also appointed by the Bishop on the first day of the Synod previous to divine service, shall be a Court to consider such objection and to adjudicate thereon; and to them shall be referred for final adjudication all cases of doubtful certificates that may be submitted by the Clerical Secretary or by the Committee appointed to examine the certificates of the lay delegates. The decision of the majority of the Court, which shall be accepted as the decision of the Court, shall be reported to the Synod with all convenient speed. Its reception and adoption shall be in order at any time, and the decision shall be final.

2.—PROPOSED AMENDMENTS TO CANON ON DISCIPLINE.

Proposed by Dr. Henderson, seconded by the Rev. Dr. Wilson.

That the second section of Canon VIII, entitled "For the better enforcing discipline in the Church and for the administration of the Diocesan Court," is hereby amended by inserting after the words "as having so offended" the following words: "Or whose usefulness in the discharge of his Parochial duties shall appear to be gone by reason of incapacity, or neglect, or any other cause."

That the following shall be added to the said Canon as section 17, and made part of the said Canon: "17. And in case any Clerk shall leave the Province of Ontario, so that he cannot be served within the Province with any of the notices or proceedings under this Canon, or shall leave the Province before or after the sentence shall be pronounced by the Bishop, he shall *ipso facto* cease to be a member of the Synod of this Diocese, his name shall be taken off the Clergy List of the Diocese of Ontario by the order of the Bishop, and he shall forfeit all claim on the funds of the Synod. Such Clerk shall not again become a member of the Synod and entitled to the benefit of its Funds except on a vote by ballot of the Synod being first had, which shall specify the terms of his restoration."

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REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PROPOSED CANON ON STIPENDS OF MISSIONARIES.

The Committee on the proposed Canon for Stipends of Missionaries beg leave to submit the following report:

After due consideration of the subjects referred to them and after careful examination of the several systems in force in the different dioceses throughout this Ecclesiastical Province, the Committee are of opinion that the following principles or objects should be kept in view:—

To apply the Mission Fund so as to elicit the greatest amount of local effort to render each Mission as soon as practicable self-supporting.

2. To grant each Mission just so much aid as it requires : taking up each case upon its own merits.

3. To raise the present scale of pecuniary remuneration to our Missionaries.

4. To render the payment of stipends to Missionaries as certain and as regular as possible without wholly destroying that wholesome degree of stimulus necessarily implied in the voluntary system.

5. To relieve the Missionary from the unpleasant, invidious, and derogatory task of pleading before his people for his own individual remuneration ; and yet make it his duty and his interest to urge the claims of the Mission Fund on them.

6. With a view to securing the last mentioned result, that the stipends of our Missionaries be paid wholly through the Clerical Secretary of the Synod and by consequence the contributions of the people be sent in to that official.

The Committee therefore recommend that the existing canons be amended or repealed in part in such manner as may be necessary to make them consistent with the following Canon, which the Committee think should be enacted by Synod :

Proposed Canon on the Stipends of Missionaries.

1. There shall be elected annually (at the time of the election of the officers of Synod) by the members of Synod, for each Rural Deanery, two Clergymen and two Laymen, being communicants, and living in the Rural Deanery for which they shall be elected, who with the Archdeacon and the Rural Dean of the locality, shall constitute a Committee on Missions for that Rural Deanery ; and a quorum of said Committee shall consist of the Archdeacon or Rural Dean and any two elected members.

2. Before a grant is made by the Mission Board in aid of any Mission it shall be the duty of the said Committee to visit such Mission in order to confer with the several congregations thereof for the purpose of ascertaining their resources and liabilities, and of arranging with them as to the amount which they might fairly be expected to raise towards the stipend of their Missionary unless in the case of any remote Missions, where such a visit may be deemed expedient by the Bishop and three-fourths of the members present at a regular meeting of the Mission Board ; and such Committee shall report to the Bishop within one week of their visit, the result of their enquiries, the arrangements which they have made with the several congregations, and the action they would recommend.

3. This Report with such remarks thereon as the Bishop may deem fit shall be laid before the Mission Board at its next meeting, when the Board shall decide as to the amount which it is able and willing to grant towards the support of a Missionary in said Mission ; which decision shall regulate the amount to be given to such Mission from the funds at the disposal of the Board from the date of the agreement with the several congregations of the Mission ; or in case of new Missions, or of the appointment of a new Missionary, from the date of the appointment of the Missionary to said Mission.

4. In case the several of a Missionary's stipend

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4. In case the several congregations of any Mission fail to make up their quota of a Missionary's stipend required by the Mission Board, in conformity with the following scale, viz.: \$800 as the stipend of a Missionary in Priests' Orders and \$600 for those in Deacons' Orders, then the said Committee on Missions for the Rural Deanery shall revisit the several congregations of said Mission and endeavour to induce the people to raise the proportion payable by them towards the stipend of their Missionary to the amount required, and report within one week of the time of their visit to the Bishop the result of their labours; which report the Bishop shall transmit to the Mission Board with his recommendations in regard thereto at its next ensuing meeting.

5. That whenever the Mission Board and the several congregations of any Mission have agreed as to the amounts which they shall severally contribute towards the stipend of their Missionary, which stipend shall never be lower than \$, except the Bishop of the Diocese and three-fourths of the members of the Mission Board present agree to accept a smaller sum in lieu thereof, then it shall be the duty of the Clerical Secretary of Synod to enter into an agreement in duplicate with two or more members of such Mission approved by the Mission Board according to the following form, viz.:

Articles of agreement between the Board of Missions of the Diocese of Ontario and two or more members of the congregation of the Mission of

WITNESS that the undersigned members of the said congregation do hereby undertake and agree on behalf of said congregation to have the annual sum of _____ dollars of lawful money of Canada collected and paid quarterly to the Clerical Secretary of the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario, so long as the ministrations hereafter agreed upon to be afforded to said congregation shall be continued.

The services referred to in the above paragraph shall be

and in consideration of the regular and punctual payment of the above mentioned from the Board of Missions aforesaid hereby undertake to maintain such ministrations of the Church in the place and at the time mentioned above so long as the said sum shall be paid.

The present agreement is for the term of three years counting from the

6. These agreements having been thus entered into, it shall be the duty of the Clerical Secretary of the Synod to pay quarterly the stipends of the Missionaries of the General Mission Fund of the Diocese, according to a list furnished by the Bishop, but subject to the regulations contained in the subsequent clauses of this Canon.

Every engagement between the Board of Missions and the congregations of Mission shall be binding upon both parties for three years unless otherwise agreed upon; but it is expressly understood that every such engagement shall be liable to revocation or modification at the end of each three years; or on a

change of the Missionary in charge; or whenever two-thirds of the members of the Board of Missions at any meeting of the same, see sufficient reason to alter their estimate of the pecuniary ability of the Mission; notice of such proposed modification or revocation must be given at one meeting of the Board, and discussed and disposed of at the next.

8. Whenever any congregation in any Mission shall fail to remit the amount agreed to be paid into the Mission Fund by said congregation or any part thereof, then three months after the same shall have fallen due (the amount still remaining unpaid) it shall be the duty of the Clerical Secretary of the Synod meanwhile to suspend payment to the Missionary of the amount in arrear from said congregation and a proportionate amount from the grant made to the Mission to which said congregation belongs from the Mission Fund, and to report the said failure to the Bishop, who shall order the Clerical Secretary to transmit to the Missionary and also to the Churchwardens of the congregation in arrears, a copy of the following notice:—

To the Churchwardens and Members of the Congregation of

GENTLEMEN,—I have been directed by the Mission Board to notify you that the contribution due from you to the Mission Board of the Diocese on day of last not having been paid, the services of the Church will after Sunday next (or from this day, or as the case may be,) be suspended by order of the Bishop, in accordance with a standing rule of the Synod to that effect, until the payment as agreed upon is duly made.

This may seem to be a severe measure, but the Board of Missions has been unable to devise any other just and practicable course which might bring home to all parties the gravity of the occasion, and the imperative necessity of prompt and decisive action in the matter.

11. It shall be the duty of the Missionary in charge of the defaulting congregation, and the Churchwardens thereof, to appear before this Committee on Missions when notified by the Chairman thereof of the time and place of their meeting, which place shall be in the Mission.

12. That a full written report of all the evidence taken by the Committee, with their opinion on the merits of the case, shall be forwarded to the Bishop within one week after the completion of their enquiry by the Archdeacon or Rural Dean

13. That when the congregation are found in fault and they can show no just cause for complaint against their Missionary, and they still continue in arrears, then their Missionary, if he desires it, shall be sustained in his position at the discretion of the Bishop.

14. That in case the congregation shall continue in arrears in regard to their engagement after having been reported in fault and still refuse or neglect to pay up such arrears, then the Bishop shall direct the Clerical Secretary of the Synod to pay to such Missionary so much from the Mission Fund of the Diocese as will enable him to remain on the spot for a period not exceeding three months at the discretion of the Bishop; or as will enable him to remove to some other Mission in the Diocese to which he may be appointed; and it shall not be lawful for the Clerical Secretary to pay any moneys to a new Missionary in said Mission until all arrears shall have been paid to the Clerical Secretary of the Synod by said Mission as due their late Missionary for services performed; and also until they shall have paid to the Clerical Secretary sufficient to repay the Mission Fund the money advanced to their Missionary to bear the expenses of his removal. In every such case the Mission Board may aid in sustaining another clergyman to serve the Mission at such time and on such conditions as the Bishop shall deem right.

15. No Clergyman or Layman shall serve on the Committee on Missions when his own Mission forms the subject of enquiry; but the Missionary in charge shall have the right of objecting to any elected member of the Committee on showing cause for so doing to the satisfaction of the Bishop, who shall then appoint another in the room of the one objected to as far as the case is concerned.

16. Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained the Mission Board may at the instance of the Bishop make grants from time to time to such Missions as may be found to be unable to comply with the conditions above set forth; no such grant shall exceed \$, and a special report of each such grant shall be made to the Synod at its next meeting, at which the grants may be confirmed or disallowed.

17. That the actual expenses of the Committee on Missions in each Rural Deanery incurred in carrying out the provisions of this By-law be paid by the Clerical Secretary out of the General Mission Fund of the Diocese to the Chairman of the Committee, who shall pay the expenses of the several members of the said Committee.

18. It shall be the duty of every clergyman holding a parish in this Diocese to hold annually a Missionary Meeting in every Church and out station where he holds Sunday services; and at all such meetings a collection shall be taken up for the Mission Fund of this Diocese. He shall also see that suitable collectors be appointed to take up the annual Parochial Collections in each year, and it shall be the duty of the Clerical Secretary to forward to the Bishop annually a

list of the Clergy who have failed to forward the collections taken up in their parishes in proper time.

4.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND CANON.

The Special Committee on the Widows' and Orphans' Fund Canon beg leave to report as follows:

1. They have obtained and examined the Canons of the following Dioceses: New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, Quebec, Montreal, Toronto, Niagara, Huron, and Ruperts' Land, and after carefully considering the whole subject would recommend the amendment of the existing Canon of this Diocese as follows:

(1.) The repeal of Clause 5 of Canon XXVIII and the substitution of the following:—

5. Every licensed Clergyman in the Diocese in order to entitle his widow and orphan children to the benefits of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund shall within six months from the adoption of this Canon, or within one year from receiving Holy Orders or from his admission into the Diocese, apply to the Clerical Secretary for a certificate (A), and such certificate being granted he shall thenceforth pay to the Clerical Secretary for the Widows' and Orphans' Fund annually the sum set opposite his age in the annexed Scale (B)—Provided always that all clergymen who at the time of the adoption of this Canon may be subscribers of \$5.00 per annum to the Fund and have paid up all arrears and interest, as required by the said Canon XXVIII, and who have fulfilled all other conditions of the said Canon, may receive their certificate (A) and be entitled to all the benefits of the Fund by continuing their payment of \$5.00 per annum together with the annual collections from their parishes as hereinafter provided for.

Any applicant after such period of time shall only be permitted to receive certificate on payment of all arrears and interest and the additional sum of \$25.00 as a fine.

(1.) Every clergyman applying for a Certificate (A), excepting those already entitled to the benefits of the Fund at the time above named, shall produce a Medical Certificate (Form C).

(2.) Every clergyman holding a certificate as above shall make and forward to the Clerical Secretary a yearly collection from every congregation in his Parish or Mission. Provided always that nothing herein contained shall be construed to prevent the widow or orphans of a clergyman duly licensed and recognized by the Bishop as an Assistant, or who has been placed on the list of retired clergymen, from participating in the benefits of the Widows' and Orphans' Fund

(3.) All payments from the first day of January in each year and all congregations on the first day of May in each year. Payments of this section shall be made upon paying therefor a certificate is taken out of the collection of a new Medical

(4.) The Clerical Secretary shall make payments mentioned in the Canon, and he shall keep a complete list of all the subscribers.

At the end of the Section 7, add: "Widows under this Canon shall be entitled to orphans shall be entitled to under this Canon."

7 (A). No certificate shall be granted to a clergyman of the age of 55 years, who is now licensed in the Diocese, to receive a certificate on his application.

Any clergyman who by reason of public ministrations may be unable to do the same to the satisfaction of the Synod, upon paying his annual fee. If any clergyman being married, he shall thereupon give notice of such marriage.

Any clergyman removing from the Diocese without the Bishop's consent shall be liable to the annual payments to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

Any clergyman removing from the Diocese shall not be liable to the annual payments to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund for the year in which he removes, nor for the year following.

Any clergyman coming into the Diocese during the last ten years of his life shall be liable to the annual payments to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

Any clergyman coming into the Diocese in Canada who has been a member of that Diocese, shall be liable to the annual payments to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund.

though no annual collection may be made by him, so long as such clergyman continues to make his annual payments hereinbefore provided for.

(3.) All payments from the Clergy under this Canon shall become due on the first day of January in each year, and shall be paid within 30 days thereafter; and all congregational collections under this Canon shall be sent in before the first day of May in each year; any clergyman failing to comply with the requirements of this section shall forfeit his certificate, but he may obtain a new certificate upon paying therefor at the rate payable at the age at which said new certificate is taken out together with all arrears and interest and on the production of a new Medical Certificate.

(4.) The Clerical Secretary shall immediately after the receipt by him of the payments mentioned in this section, transmit to the sender a written acknowledgment thereof, and he shall also publish annually in the Journal of Synod a complete list of all the subscribers under this Canon.

Section 6 of the present Canon to remain.

In Section 7 the words "of the death" should be inserted after the word "event" in the 15th line.

At the end of the Section add the words "Provided that all annual payments to widows under this Canon shall be similar in amount, and that all annual payments to orphans shall be similar in amount to those who are similarly classified under this Canon."

7 (A). No certificate under this Canon shall be issued to any clergyman over the age of 55 years, who is not already licensed in this Diocese, but any clergyman who is now licensed in this Diocese, and who is over 55 years, shall be entitled to receive a certificate on his complying with the requirements of this Canon.

Any clergyman who by reason of sickness or accident is unable to continue his public ministrations may upon the production of a Medical Certificate, testifying the same to the satisfaction of the Bishop, continue his connection with the Fund upon paying his annual fees.

If any clergyman being a beneficiary under this Fund and becoming a widower or unmarried, he shall thereafter pay the annual sum for the age he may be at the date of such marriage.

Any clergyman removing from this Diocese into the Diocese of Algoma with the Bishop's consent shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund on continuing his annual payments to the Widows' and Orphans' Fund of this Diocese; and any clergyman removing from this Diocese with the Bishop's consent after officiating for not less than ten years shall be allowed his claim upon the Fund on continuing his annual payments, and in addition thereto the amount of the average annual collections for the W. & O. Fund from all the parishes and missions of the Diocese during the last ten years he laboured therein.

Any clergyman coming into and taking a charge or curacy in this Diocese from any Diocese in Canada whose Synod or other body governing the W. and O. Fund of that Diocese, shall adopt a similar provision for the benefit of the widows

and orphans of the clergy of this Diocese, shall be placed upon the same footing with respect to the benefits of the W. and O. Fund as clergymen already in the Diocese, and may obtain a Certificate (A) and become entitled to the benefits of the Fund by paying annually the amount payable under Scale (B) at the age at which he began to make annual payments to the W. & O. Fund of the Diocese from which he came, and on his fulfilling the other requirements of this Canon. Provided that he hath left the former Diocese with the consent of the Bishop thereof, and further provided that he produce from the Secretary, Treasurer or other proper officer of said Diocese a certificate evidencing his regular payments to the W. & O. Fund thereof, and all other fulfilment of the Canon or Rules of that Diocese under which the said W. & O. Fund is governed, and provided always that he produce the Medical Certificate (C) under this Canon.

The remaining clauses of this Canon now existing to continue as they are.

5.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON PERPETUAL DIACONATE.

The Committee appointed at the last Synod beg to report the following Canon on the Lay Diaconate :

Whereas by Canon XVIII of the Provincial Synod it is enacted that "**A Deacon need not surrender his worldly calling or business, &c., &c.,**"

And whereas it is desirable to define the position and status of those Deacons who do not surrender their worldly calling or business in this Diocese,

Be it therefore enacted,—

1. That until such Deacons shall have been accepted by the Bishop as candidates for Priests' Orders, they shall be known as and called LAY DEACONS, and that before they can enter on the performance of their duties they must obtain the license of the Bishop, which license shall be revocable by him at pleasure, and on its revocation, or surrender, their functions shall cease and determine.

2. That such Deacons shall be considered Laymen to all intents and purposes as regards the temporalities of and their standing in this Synod, and their election hereto. They shall not have any claims whatsoever as beneficiaries on any of the various funds subscribed, collected, and held in trust by the Synod for the benefit of the Clergy.

3. In case a Lay Deacon who has not taken a Degree in Arts or Theology in a University or a Theological College shall, after ordination, be accepted as a candidate for Priests' Orders, and placed by the direction of the Bishop upon the Clergy List of this Diocese, the said Deacon shall have no claim whatsoever on the temporalities of the Synod, nor be a beneficiary of any Synod Fund, the Mission Fund alone excepted, until he shall have been duly admitted to Priests'

3.—REPORT OF COMMITTEE ON FOREIGN MISSIONS.

The Board of Foreign Missions beg respectfully to present their Report:

Inasmuch as the chief and most important part of their work has related to the Missionary Diocese of Algoma, the Board desires to place on record, in the first place, the deep sorrow felt by them, as it has been by all the Church, in the sudden removal of the late beloved Bishop Fauquier. It will be ever impossible to dissociate the operations of the Church in Algoma from the revered name of its first Bishop, to whom is due not only the present prosperity of that Diocese, for which he laboured so lovingly and zealously, but the promotion of a missionary spirit throughout the Province, and especially in our own Diocese. The Board feels that it is but simple justice to the memory of the late Bishop to mention in this Report the fact that the visits paid by him to the various localities were mainly instrumental under God in evoking a Christian sympathy and liberality for the missionary work of the Church, which will have far-reaching results, and which have laid a solid foundation for all the future superstructure. May this superstructure be worthy of the foundation, and the servant of God who laid it, is the fervent prayer of the Board.

It is now the duty of your Board to congratulate the Church in this Diocese on the appointment of one of the most eminent Clergymen in Canada, unanimously elected by the Provincial Synod, to fill the vacant office of Missionary Bishop—Rev. Edward Sullivan, D.D., Rector of St. George's Church, Montreal.

It is also the duty of your Board to remind the members of the Church of the responsibility resting on them through the action of their representatives in the Provincial Synod. Most positive assurances of generous support were given to the House of Bishops when they proceeded to the nomination of a successor to the late Bishop of Algoma. The Board have no reason to doubt that these assurances will be fulfilled. They would, however, beg to impress upon their brethren, clerical and lay, that it should be a matter of honorable pride that this Diocese of Ontario should hold a high place in its efforts for the cause of Christ throughout as well as within our own borders. And they rejoice in being able to report that simultaneously with an increased liberality towards our Home Mission work, there has been a corresponding increase in the contributions to the Board of Missions extra-Diocesan.

Herewith is appended the statement of accounts, certified by the Auditors, which shows that an amount of \$1,347.67 was received by the Board during the year ended April 30th—a very gratifying increase on the receipts of the previous year of \$377.

Still, no doubt, much more might be done, and your Board would invite the co-operation of the Clergy and Christ-loving men and women of our Church in stirring up a spirit of zeal in spreading the gospel of Christ among all nations, and more particularly our Indian fellow-subjects.

4.—REPORT OF THE MISSION BOARD.

The Mission Board begs to present the following Report for the year ending 30th April, 1882 :

Bearing in mind that by the action of last Synod it is required to be printed, it is made as concise as possible.

The Board in the first place would express their deep sorrow that the illness of Canon Forest, deplored in its last report, has resulted in his death, and the Diocese is thus deprived of an earnest worker in the cause of Missions. They also regret that Archdeacon Lauder, though somewhat better, is not yet enabled to take his accustomed place.

They are pleased to be able to report a marked improvement, the debt having been reduced to \$335.33, although of course this will be largely increased before September. Yet even then it is hoped there will be a permanent reduction as compared with last year. The new work entered on may, however, cause this indebtedness of the Board to be paid off more slowly, than if the rules respecting the increase of the Sustentation Fund were strictly carried out, but in view of the loud calls of our fellow churchmen this is not to be deplored.

The Board regrets to state that the Parochial Collections have not been sent so promptly this year as last, thirty-two Parishes having not sent in their returns before the close of its fiscal year against twenty-three last year. Some parishes have, however, since sent in their collections.

This leaves \$7,400, which with the amount paid in since the end of the year, and that estimated from Parishes as yet unheard from, will make up about \$8,100.

This exceeds the estimated income, but it is presumed the deficiency will be somewhat lessened by unused grants. It is gratifying to be able to state that its grant to the Mattawa and Chalk River Mission (Township of Clara and parts adjacent) has, after some delay, been made use of, and a Missionary is now looking after the interests of the Church in that remote portion of the Diocese. It would be well if the good work could be followed up by sending a Travelling Missionary to labour on the Hastings road. Instead of paying off the debt as rapidly as was contemplated, it was resolved to place \$700 at the disposal of the Bishop, \$400 towards the support of a Missionary at Rockingham or Watson's Mills (Townships of Brudenell, etc.,) who may take charge of those faithful members of the Church, who have for eighteen years bravely kept themselves together by Lay services, and \$300 for a Mission to be composed of the Townships of Clarendon, Miller, Palmerston and South Canonto.

The Board had the pleasure of making its grants without being obliged to deduct 10 per cent., as in the two past years.

It is believed the money placed at their disposal has been divided among the Missionaries as equitably as possible, bearing steadily in mind, however, the resolve to make the older Missions gradually self-supporting, that more assistance may be given to the newer fields of Mission work.

It will be noted that \$200 (or, more exactly, \$183), has been charged against the funds to recoup the Clergy Trust Fund for the large uninvested balance which has till now been held by the Bank as an offset against the debt of the Board.

The large sum of \$500 appears for pensions, which could be devoted to the support of a Travelling Missionary if the Superannuation Committee could take charge of this necessary portion of Church work. The usual amount of \$400 is devoted to the salary of the Bishop of Algoma, which the Synod is requested to vote as heretofore.

Owing to the disorganization of the Rural Deaneries, through the change of Rural Deans from one parish to another, the Missionary Deputations were not so methodically managed as in previous years. It is hoped that the measures taken by the Rural Deans now in office may tend to the further increase of its missionary funds.

The following resolution was adopted by the Board in reference to a Missionary Agent:

"It was moved by Mr. Reynolds, seconded by Rev. H. Pollard, and Resolved That the Revs. G. W. White, F. W. Kirkpatrick, and E. P. Crawford, also the Chancellor, and the mover and seconder, be a Committee to report to the next meeting of this Board upon the advisability of appointing a Missionary Agent to attend the annual meetings on behalf of the Mission Fund."

5.—REPORT OF WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' FUND COMMITTEE.

To the Synod of the Diocese of Ontario :

The Widows' and Orphans' Fund Committee beg leave to report :

That the Widows' and Orphans' Fund has increased during the past year from \$21,918.82 to \$22,717.81, being an increase of \$798.99.

That the income from collections has been (during the past year) \$616.07 which as compared with the previous year shows a decrease of \$71.02, while the amount received from Clerical subscriptions was \$315.00, which shows an increase of \$85.00. The income from interest was \$1,379.40, besides there was a special anonymous donation to capital of \$14.00.

That Mrs. Mockridge and Mrs. Taylor having died and Mrs. Mockridge's son being of age the Fund has been released from the payment of their pension, and Mrs. Forest and the two children of the late Rev. Rural Dean Carroll have been placed on the list of pensioners.

The Bank of Ontario stock was sold at the rate of \$68.50 which was considered a good sale under the circumstances.

1.—Auditors' Report.

We the Auditors appointed at the last Session of Synod have the honour to present the following Report respecting the Synod Accounts for the year ending 30th April, 1882:

The examination of the details of the accounts has, in accordance with a resolution passed at the last session of the Synod, been committed to two skilled accountants whose certificate is submitted herewith. It appears by this certificate that the entries in the books have been properly made, that they agree with the vouchers produced, and that the accounts generally are correct.

A balance sheet, a statement of receipts and expenditure, and a statement of the securities belonging to each fund are submitted with our report.

The payments made during the past year are all duly vouched by cheques.

SUSTENTATION FUND.

Some of the debentures belonging to the Sustentation Fund referred to in our last report (p. 1886, Journal of Synod) are still held by the Bank of Montreal as security for the Mission Fund overdraft. As the Sustentation Fund in effect forms part of the Mission Fund no inconvenience results from the hypothecation of these securities, but it is desirable that they should be restored as soon as possible to the Fund to which they belong; \$6,000 of the debentures originally pledged have been handed back to the Sustentation Fund and the Bank now hold only \$7,000 County of Simcoe debentures. The debenture of St. George's Cathedral referred to in our last report has been paid in full.

MISSION FUND.

We have much pleasure in recording a further reduction in the Mission Fund debt to the Bank of Montreal. On the 30th April, 1881, it stood at the sum of \$4,050.77, and on the 30th April, 1882, at the sum of \$335.33.

This reduction is, however, due in a great measure to the fact that many grants made during the past year were unused. It must be borne in mind too that the present balance does not represent the average debt, which is still in excess of \$2,000. This Fund can scarcely be said to be out of debt until there shall be in hand at the end of April a sufficient sum to pay the ensuing year's outgoings. A glance at the Bank account will illustrate this. On the 31st March the Fund owed the Bank \$6,014.02. On the 30th April this debit balance was reduced to \$335.33, but at the time we write the balance is a little to credit. The June and September payments will consume about \$4,000 and there will be no substantial income till Advent.

EPISCOPAL FUND.

The debit balance of the interest account of this Fund referred to in the statement as the overdrawn interest account, stands at \$4,301, the same amount as at year.

RECTORY LANDS FUND.

A separate cash account has since the 30th April, 1881, been opened for each rectory, a great improvement on the old system. We have recommended that in all cases of sales of land the ledger account should begin with a debit of the whole purchase money instead of the amount of mortgage given for the balance. Our recommendation has been adopted as respects sales of which returns have been made within the last two years. Care should be taken in all cases of sales to make an immediate return to the Secretary of the particulars of sale, and to hand over the mortgage for the balance, with the first instalment of the purchase money.

The amount of the debit of the late Clerical Secretary for money received on account of the capital of the Rectory Lands Fund, and not accounted for, is \$3,245.78, and we suggest that this sum should be charged *pro rata* against the capital of all the Rectories, as it is impossible to ascertain what particular moneys received are not forthcoming.

ASSESSMENT FUND.

The debit balance of this Fund is being rapidly reduced under the system adopted at the meeting of the Executive Committee in May, 1881, which, while it precludes the possibility of increasing the debt, makes provision for its total extinction in five years.

The Bank balances agree with those in the Secretary's books, except so far as the differences are caused by outstanding cheques.

Some final disposition must be made of the balances due by the late Clerical Secretary to the several Funds. Any moneys which may be realized from the securities held against this indebtedness can be appropriated as they are received.

We have examined the securities in the Bank of Montreal. Those transferable by delivery we found to be in the joint possession of the Treasurer and Clerical Secretary. The mortgages were all in the possession of the Clerical Secretary, with the exception of those in the Solicitor's hands, for which vouchers were produced, and a few which have been paid and discharged since the 30th April last.

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MISSION BOARD.

RULES OF ORDER AND BY-LAWS,

(Revised and Adopted Sept. 6th, 1882.)

RULES OF ORDER.

1. The meetings of the Board shall open and close with prayer.
2. Reading, correcting, and approving the minutes of the previous meeting.
3. Presenting Reports.
4. Presenting and reading petitions and correspondence.
5. Taking up unfinished business.
6. Proceeding with general business.
7. The above order may be changed in any particular case on the vote of the majority of the members of the Board.

BY-LAWS.

- I. That the Board shall not proceed to business unless there be at least *eight* members present.
- II. That at each meeting of the Board in May, September and December, a financial statement of the Mission Fund shall be presented by the Clerical Secretary for the period which has elapsed since the closing date of the statement furnished at the previous meeting.
- III. That at each meeting of the Board a short statement showing the receipts and disbursements of the Mission Fund for the year preceding the meeting, together with a comparative statement for the corresponding period in the previous year, shall be distributed to the members.
- IV. That all grants made by the Board be made to the Mission or Parish, and be subject to withdrawal upon any change taking place in the Incumbency.
- V. That in case of clergymen not making all the collections appointed for missionary purposes, their cheques from the Mission Fund be withheld until such collections be made, unless the Board, on application of the clergyman in default, shall be satisfied that the failure to make the return is excusable. The Parochial Collections shall be forwarded to the Clerical Secretary before the first day of May in each year, and the other collections within one month of the time appointed for making the same.
- VI. That after the expiration of one month from the time when any periodical collection should be made in any Parish or Church for the Mission Fund, the Clerical Secretary shall address a circular to the clergymen of such Parishes or Churches as have not remitted the collection, requesting to be informed of the reason of such omission.
- VII. That the Clerical Secretary shall, on or before the fifteenth day of March in each and every year, send to the several Missionaries of the Board the following circular:

Reverend and Dear Sir,—

Will you have the kindness to furnish, for the information of the Board of Missions, answers to the following questions, which please address to the undersigned, on or before the 30th day of April next.

_____, Clerical Secretary.

"QUESTIONS, ETC.

1. What is the extent of your Mission?
 2. What is the number of Church people in your Mission? State also the number connected with each Church or congregation.
 3. How many Church families in your Mission?
 4. How many Churches and Stations in your Mission? Give the names of the Churches, and state of what material they are built. How often have you Divine Service therein?
 5. What is the distance of each Church or Station from the principal Church? Give also the distances of the principal Church from Churches in neighbouring Parishes or Missions.
 6. How many communicants in your Mission? What is the average attendance for the year at Holy Communion?
 7. How many Baptisms, Marriages and Burials during the year?
 8. Have you a Parsonage? If so, of what material is it built? How much land is there attached to it?
 9. Have you any endowment? What is its nature and annual value?
 10. Is your Parish in debt? If so, to what amount? Why incurred? What means of payment? State particularly the nature and amount of any incumbrances on the Church property.
 11. What was the stipend promised by the people for the past year, and what did you receive from them?
 12. What amount do you consider your people should contribute towards the support of their clergyman?
 13. Give the number of Sunday Schools in your Mission, and of children attending them?
 14. Are the Church Buildings and Parsonage insured? If so, in what company and for how much?
- Until the report required by such circular shall be furnished, the grant for the Mission shall not be paid.
- VIII. When a clergyman who receives a grant from this Board is placed on the Commutation List, such grant shall at once cease.
- IX. That Rural Deans and Conveners of Deputations shall invariably send their returns before April 30th in each year.
- X. That each clergyman shall send to his Rural Dean within one month of the date ordered for the Advent and Whitsunday sermons, and in the case of Parochial Collections before the 30th day of April in each year, a statement according to the form provided for the purpose.
- XI. That the Archdeacons, or the Rural Deans under their instruction when required by the clergyman in charge of any Mission of which the grant has been reduced under the classification scheme, promptly visit such Missions and endeavour to induce the congregation to make good the amount withdrawn from the Board.
- XII. That By-laws, or Rules of Order, or amendments thereto, unless carried by a two-thirds vote, shall not come into effect until the following meeting.
