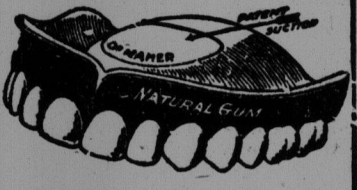

KEEP AMBULANCE SERVICE AS NOW

Hospital Commissioners' Decision Yesterday—Winter Conditions.

The Commissioners of the General Public Hospital yesterday passed a resolution favoring the continuation of the ambulance service as at present. J. King Kelley, K. C., presented a committee report on the matter. He said

that at present the city was supplying a general ambulance service, if the hospital took the service it would become more of a private service. The cost of the service he estimated would be about \$7,500 a year. The report contained some further recommendations which Mr. Kelley himself voted against on further discussion, and which were voted down by the whole meeting. These recommendations were that an interne might accompany the ambulance when it made accident calls eastward of the hospital, that the Workmen's Compensation Board might take steps to arrange a medical service in conjunction with the ambulance for service in southern and northern sections of the city as well as in the Parish of Lancaster. The committee considered the presence of Dr. Kenney and Dr. Ellis in West St. John sufficient to cover

A Minority Report.

Dr. Crawford presented a minority report as a member of the committee, stating that he believed the time was opportune to establish a hospital ambulance service because the present quarters of the ambulance were unsatisfactory and because the ambulance attendants could not give the proper attention in some cases where medical care might be essential. The minority report was ordered filed.

The president of the board, M. E. Agar, said he was much in favor of the hospital having control of the ambulance as the majority of accident cases came to the hospital, but he felt the board did not want to request the Municipal Council to make so heavy an expenditure as would be necessary. If the request came from the city or from the county and the money was provided without the hospital board having to appear to ask for the expenditure he would be willing to have the ambulance at the hospital.

With regard to the expenditure, Dr. Crawford pointed out that much of the expenditure listed was already provided for and the money was being paid out to maintain the present service. He was told the present service cost \$5,000 a year. With regard to extra interne service which maintaining the ambulance at the hospital would entail, he said the service of these internes would be given to the hospital for seventy-five per cent. of their time and the hospital would soon have need of more interne service.

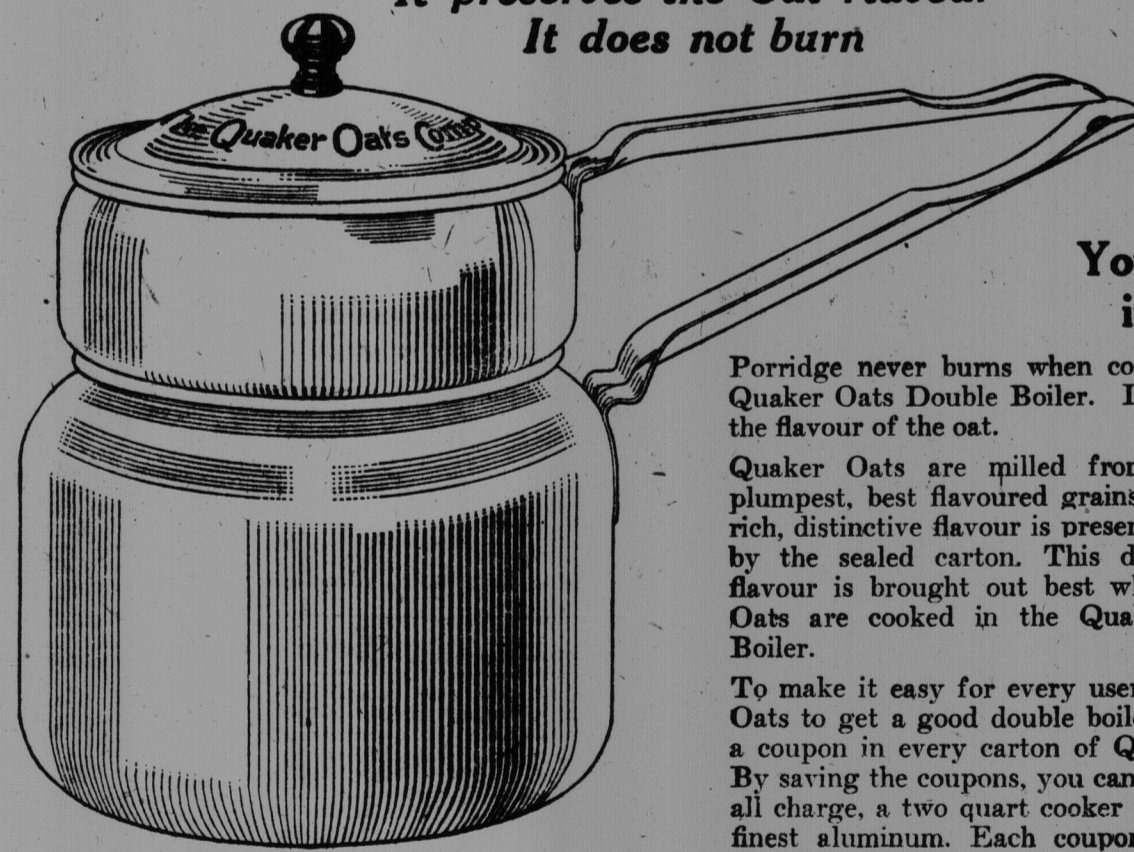

Mr. Meyer and Mr. Mondell, together with a representative of the Department of Agriculture will visit the Dakotas, Minnesota, Montana and probably Nebraska and other wheat growing states. They will give assurance to the farmers who enlist in the co-operative movement that ample Government funds will be available.

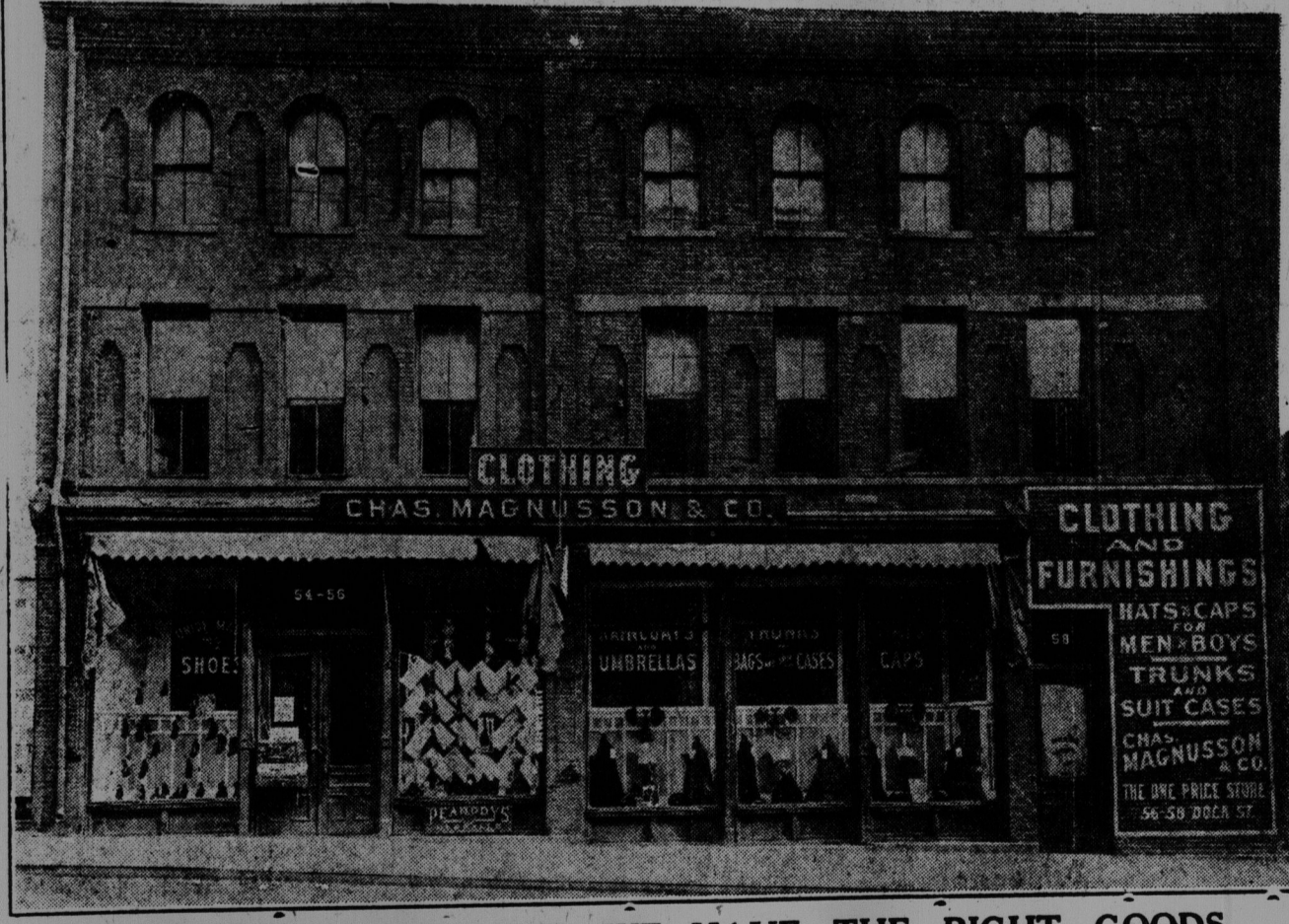
