Making Cod Liver Oil
For the Guidance of Manufacturts 1st. The manaer in charge of factory must see that the ith is no gall bladede attached to any livers.
2nd. The good livers must then be

only with warm water, soap and water. Soda mult not be used. The best results for medical oil can only be obtained by the use of tin barrels. Wooden packages genterally make the oil dark, and
destroy its fine flavor. Keep all oil in barrels in a cool place, and covered from the sun.
