FARM-FIELD AND GARDEN

THE DAIRY.
All milk as it comes from healthy cows is of approximately perfect quality and capable of making a perfect article of sweet cream, butter or cheese if its surroundings are clean and its surroundings are kept immediately after it leaves the udder of the cow, and until it passes under the care of the farmer, are correct.
