TO MAKE VINEGAR.—The best and quickest way Vinegar can be made of cider, is, in the first place, to draw off the juice from the sediment, and put it in a clean cask, and add one pint of hops to a barrel of juice; place it where it may be kept moderately warm, and add, if you choose, two or three sheets of Brown wrapping paper, beamed with molasses. This is the quickest and best way of making cider vinegar. Excellent vinegar may be made of the sap of maple trees, viz: Boil the sap down in the proportion of four gallons to one in the case of elder vinegar, put it in a cask, leave the bung open, and place it where it may have a moderate warmth. In this way it will soon ferment and become good vinegar.
