Rules and Regulations.

1. Admission fee for non-members, first day, 15 cts; children under 12 years of age, 10 cts. Second day, admission 25 cts; children 10 cts; by tickets to be obtained from the Secretary and given up at the entrance-gate during the day, or at the hall door. Double team and driver, 75 cts; single horse and driver, 50 cts; saddle horse and rider, 35 cents.

2. Poultry, Grain, Dairy Produce, Vegetables, Fruit, and Flowers, Ladies' Fancy Work, Domestic Manufactures, etc., must be in the Exhibition Building on Tuesday, October 1st, 1895, by 10 a. m., to be arranged and judged, in order that the hall may be opened for exhibition by 7 p. m. and continue until ten o'clock in the evening of that day. The exhibition of Live Stock (except poultry) and Implements will be held on one day, Wednesday, 2nd of October, when the grounds and buildings will be open for exhibition by 10 o'clock a. m. and remain so until 4:30 o'clock in the afternoon of that day.

3. Exhibitor must be owner and give his name and residence, with the kind of stock exhibited, to the Secretary, who will issue a ticket and number to be put upon each animal or article for exhibition on admittance to the show yard or building.

4. Exhibitors must be on the ground or Exhibition Building by 10 a. m., when the Directors will be there to receive them and give any further instructions that may be required.

5. One person at least must remain in charge of each lot while in the Show Yard.

6. Bulls must have a screw or ring in their nose, and the bulls or boars must be carefully secured to prevent the possibility of accidents.

7. The team horses must be shown in harness, and before a lumber or spring wagon.

8. The grain, roots, fruit, butter, cheese, etc., must be certified to be the property of the member, and produced from his farm or holding the present year, the manner of culture or manufacture to be given to the Secretary, if required. Any person violating this rule will forfeit all prizes that may have been awarded.

9. No sacks to be admitted with name or initials marked on them.

10. All grain under standard weight will be excluded.

11. DOMESTIC MANUFACTURES.—The goods must have been manufactured by the exhibitor, or in case of woolens, from yarn the produce of his flock, and at his expense.

12. No person shall be allowed to enter for exhibition more than one specimen in any one section of the class, unless the additional article be of a distinct variety or pattern from the first. This rule to apply only to all kinds of grain and manufactured articles, in which each additional specimen would necessarily be precisely similar to the first.

13. Any person interfering by conversation or otherwise with the judges till after their judgment is passed, shall not have any prizes awarded to him.

14. Animals or articles exhibited to be known to the judges by the ticket or number only.

15. No person allowed in the show room during the inspection by the judges except the officer appointed by the board of directors to attend them.

16. Nothing shall be allowed to be removed from the hall before 4:30 p. m. on the last day of the exhibition, at which time every person will be asked to leave the building, and those having articles to move will be admitted by check.

17. Ewes that have not raised lambs this season will not be allowed to compete as breeding ewes.

18. No cows will be allowed to compete for a premium unless giving milk when shown, or visible by calf at the time.

19. No premium will be awarded for which there are not two or more competitors; in cases, however, where the judges report great merit this rule may be suspended.

20. Owners of thoroughbred Durham cattle must place in the hands of the Secretary a Dominion pedigree of breeding when making entries previous to the exhibition.

21. No animal shall compete for prizes in more than one class, except in the class of prize for herds of cattle, and sweep-stake prize, and no stallion shall compete in harness or under the saddle.

22. Thoroughbred cattle will not be allowed to compete in the grade class. Fat stock not to be shown outside their own class.

23. The entry ticket upon animals or articles will admit the person bringing them to the show ground for exhibition, along with such animals or articles, without the use of any other ticket.

24. Parties will be allowed on the grounds to sell pears, grapes, melons, taffy or peanuts on the day of the exhibition by paying a fee, but no other pedlar or huckster will be allowed to exercise his calling on or near the grounds of the Society on that day.

25. All tickets sold after September 1st will be charged \$1.50 each.

26. While the directors will take every possible precaution under the circumstances to secure the safety of articles sent to the exhibition, the owners themselves must take the risk of exhibiting; and should any article be accidentally injured, lost or stolen, the directors will give all assistance in their power toward recovery, but they will not make any payment for the value thereof. And as it is essential for the satisfactory working of the exhibition that all articles be entered and forwarded in time, the secretary will receive entries by letter, unrepaid addressed to him at Paris, at any time previous to the evening of the 30th DAY OF SEPTEMBER, when the secretary's book will be closed, after which no entries will be received unless for correction. The prizes will be paid by the secretary at his office from the 10th to the 12th OCTOBER, 1895. All premiums not taken up by JANUARY 1st, 1896, shall be forfeited to the society. Parties residing at a distance can have them forwarded by mail by sending their address to the secretary.
