

## BILL.

An Act to improve the proceedings in Prohibition and Mandamus, in Upper Canada.

Received and read, 1st time, Thursday, 17th September, 1863.

An Act to improve the proceedings in Prohibition and on Writs of Mandamus, in Upper Canada.

Writ of Prohibition is productive of unnecessary expense, and the allegation of contempt in a declaration in Prohibition filed before Writ issued, is an unnecessary form; and it is expedient to make some 5 better provision for payment of costs in cases of Prohibition: Therefore, Her Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and Assembly of Canada, enacts as follows:—

1. And whereas Writs of Mandamus, other than such that relate to the offices mentioned in or provided for by the said Act made in the ninth year of the Reign of Queen Anne, are sometimes issued to officers and other persons, commanding them to admit to offices, or do or perform other matters, in respect whereof the persons to whom such 5 writs are directed claim no right or interest, or whose functions are merely ministerial in relation to such offices or matters; and it may be proper that such officers and persons should in certain cases be protected against the payment of damages or costs to which they may other-

In case the return to any such writ shall, in pursuance of the authority given by this Act, be expressed to be made on behalf of any 40 other person as aforesaid, the further proceedings on such writ shall not abate or be discontinued by the death or resignation of, or removal from office of the person having made such return, but the same shall and may be continued and carried on in the name of such person; and if a peremptory writ shall be awarded, the same shall and may be directed 45 to any successor in office or right of such person.

And for making some further provision for the payment of costs on applications for Mandamus, it is enacted, that in all cases of application for any Writ of Mandamus whatsoever, the costs of such ap- 50 plication, whether the writ shall be granted or refused, and also the costs of the writ, if the same shall be issued and obeyed, shall be in the discretion of the Court, and the Court is hereby authorized to order and direct by whom and to whom the same shall be paid.

6. And whereas it is expedient that parties interested in the issuing 55 of or in the Proceedings upon Writs of Mandamus shall be enabled in certain cases to have the Judgments and Decisions of the Courts of

Prohibition by a Judge in term time.

10. And whereas a prohibition cannot at present be obtained in may be issued term time, and it is expedient in that respect to amend the Law, it is therefore enacted, that it shall be lawful for any Judge of any of Her Majesty's Superior Courts of Common Law at Toronto, as well in term time as in vacation, to hear and determine applications for writs of pro- 5 hibition, and to make such rules or orders for the issuing of such writs as might have been made by the Court, and all such rules or orders so made by any such Judge shall have the same force and effect as rules of Court for such purposes now have, and such writs shall be issued by virtue of such rules or orders as well in term time as in vacation; pro-10 vided always, that any rule or order made by any such Judge, or any

writ issued by virtue thereof, may be discharged or varied or set aside by the Court, on application made thereto by any party dissatisfied with such rule or order.
