


THE BRAVE AT HOME.

He holds the Officers' Decoration Medal.





Corps of Guides

Samuel, S. A.

The Corps of Guides, a mounted combatant corps, was organized by Lord Dundonald in 1903, and is a staff organization, with headquarters at Ottawa, and is divided into nine detachments, one assigned to each territorial command.

The functions of the Corps of Guides are similar to those of the Army Intelligence Department of the Imperial Service, and the duties include the collection and compilation of all military statistics, and intelligence concerning the military division to which they belong. The officers of the corps are specially trained in various branches of the service, including military map drawing and topography, scouting and reconnaissance. An important duty of the corps is to provide expert information regarding the features of the country from a military standpoint, and its resources in horses, transport and supplies, and the means of communication by water, rail, road, telegraph, wireless, etc.

The detachment assigned to the Vancouver district consists of one officer and ten men, whose headquarters are on Seaton Street, Vancouver.

Lieut. C. Tweedale is in command of the local detachment and holds a record of nine years' service in the Civil Service Rifles, Saskatchewan Light Horse, and Corps of Guides. He holds certificates of Cavalry Captain, Infantry Lieutenant, and Equitation and Special Course in Military Map Drawing and Topography.

Seven of the ten Guides have gone forward and the detachment has again been recruited up to full strength.

6th Duke of Connaught's Own Rifles

This regiment was organized in July, 1809, but actually dates back much further, since it can in reality claim direct descent from the first local militia corps established in British Columbia in Crown Colony days.

The first corps of militia raised on the Mainland of B. C. was the Seymour Artillery, about the year 1859. In 1878 the Seymour Artillery became No. 1 Battery of the B. C. Brigade of Garrison Artillery, No. 2 Battery being in Victoria. In July, 1899, the change occurred from artillery to infantry, and the 2nd Battalian of the Artillery changed their uniforms and training and became the 6th Battalion Rifles. In May, 1900, H. R. H. the Duke of Connaught accepted the Hon. Coloneky of the regiment, which accordingly became the Duke of Connaught's Own Rifles.

The regiment contributed a considerable number of men when the call came, in 1899, for volunteers for service in South Africa, several of whom were killed and wounded in the action at Paardeburg. To the memory of those who fell in the South African field, a brass memorial tablet was placed on the wall of the drill hall on Cambie Street.

The Overseas Contingent which the D. C. O. R. has contributed to the Empire, in answer to call to arms in 1914, will maintain the record of the regiment and live up to the motto on its coat-of-arms, "Celer et Fortis."







Army Service Corps

This necessary branch of the Service is represented in the Vancouver district by the 19th Company, Canadian Army Service Corps, which was

The Establishment consists of 106 officers and men and 86 horses. Headquarters situate on Seaton St., Vancouver.

The function of the Army Service Corps is to secure and distribute supplies to the troops, and this includes the purchase and killing of cattle and sheep for meat; the purchase and judging of hay, flour and all supplies; the transportation of supplies and of troops and horses. In the time of war the advance of an army must depend upon the efficiency and resourcefulness of its Service Corps, upon whom falls the work of providing means of transportation, supplies and stores.

The 19th Company have contributed a full company strength to the Overseas Contingent, having sent 100 men and three officers to Valcartier, and have recruited up to full strength a full company, now at headquarters, consisting of about 30 men and two officers left from the original company, and 70 recruits enlisted during the present month.
