TARTE'S POLITICAL CAREER

Imported from the Wilds of the Laurentides by Mr. Tarte

Montreal, Oct. 21.—Although Mr. J. Tarte's name has been prominently before the Ontario public for some years past, the political career of the Member for L'Isle is as a whole but little known to the people of the province.

As has been the case ever since, Mr. Tarte was a dear man to have in one's employ, and it is estimated that it cost Mr. McGreevy from \$35,000 to \$40,000 to keep and control Mr. Tarte about during the Mackenzie regime.

It is believed that Mr. McGreevy made a good deal of money out of the contract mentioned above, and was well able to pay for any services that he might require, and at this time Mr. Tarte was profitably employed in keeping his eye upon Messrs. Chagnon and Senecal, as it was then surmised that they would attempt to dissolve following Mr. Tarte's success in Bonaventure.

When a railway company wanted a grant in those days, the general manager went to Mr. Tarte for his warm friend Paquet, and his partner in so many jobs, had not contented himself before the public. It is alleged Mr. Tarte got \$30,000 from the River du Loup & Temiscouata Railway.

Most people have forgotten the water pipe scandal at Quebec when Mr. Beemer swore that he paid Benjamin Trudel \$31,000 to work the canal at the ancient capital.

Mr. Tarte's violent opposition to Premier Chagnon and Mr. Senecal because of their North Shore Railway deal is also an interesting political fact.

Time rolled on, and the Riel movement was about to become a factor in Quebec politics. Mr. Tarte was one of the first champions of race and revenge, and at the famous Champ de Mars meeting the Sunday following Riel's execution, the editor of Le Canadien delivered a most violent speech in his honor.

Those who know Mr. McGreevy and Mr. Tarte declare that when the latter declared bitter and warm upon his friend and benefactor he wanted to be bought off. Mr. McGreevy has stated himself that Tarte wanted \$50,000 and that he would have given him \$20,000 to save trouble.
