

A very well attended meeting of the Farmers' Institute was held at the Hall, Pender Island, on the 1st ult.

His Lordship, the Bishop of Columbia, paid an informal, friendly visit to the Island the first week in September. On Saturday there was an afternoon reception at Mr. Wilson's house, and on Monday a picuic party at Fulford Harbour; and on Sunday the Bishop preached at both churches, and administered the Holy Communion at St. Mark's.

He was removing the scaffolding of his new barn, after shingling, when suddenly it gave way, and he was precipitated twenty feet to the ground. He was rendered insensible by the fall, but happity no bones were broken, and he is able now to be about again.

Some very fine fruit and vegetables adorned the church, which was afterwards collected and forwarded to the P: otestant Orphans' Home. The 1st class is expected to learn the whole of the Church Catheel ism; the 2nd class to the end of the Commandments; the 3rd class the Lord's Prayer and the Creed.
