His withdrawal will not affect the firm name of Thompson, Blois & Kjellgren.

CURRENT TRADE CONDITIONS.

ONTARIO

No effort is being made to handle Jumber while storms and deep snow cover the entire province. The snow-fall on Monday last completely paralyzed traffic in Torento and vulnity, and in the logging districts operations have been conducted with so much difficulty that many firms have taken their men out of the woods. Building operations, which have been quet all winter, are yet at a standstill This is plainly shown by the falling off in the number of permits issued in Toronto during the months of January and February. There is corsi erable building in sight, but little progress will be made until the weather becomes more favorable. Retail dealers will not place orders for lumber so long as consumers cannot build. The present demand, therefore, is confined largely to factory lumber, for which there is a moderate inquiry. Prices generally exhibit firmness owing to the fact that there is sure to be a shortage in the log supply. Hemlock is slightly higher, as offers have been made to purchase entire cuts at \$11.50 at the mill. En the reasons above stated the movement of hardwoods is light, but it is expected that the increased activity consequent upon the opening up of spring will he accompanied by an appreciation in

QUEBEC AND NEW BRUNSWICK.

The extraordinary inclemency of the weather has made it almost impossible to move lumber and has reduced building operations almost to the minimum. Prices of spruce lumber are not as firm as at last report. Offers received from Boston show a decline of about one dollar per thousand feet. British trade is also quiet and somewhat depressed. So far this season there has been very little done on contract with Great Britain. A few French cargoes have been sold but at prices not as satisfactory to the seller as those obtained last year. Notwithstanding these facts, producers of spruce are holding their output very firmly, and if the log production should be lighter than is now anticipated, there may be some improvement in prices later in the season.

A reliable authority estimates the output of logs in the Miramichi district of New Brunswick this year to be about the same as last season. It is claimed by some operators that it will be at least to per cent, short of last year's output, but as the stock of sawn and round timber wintering on the Miramichi is 50 per cent, or at least 15,000,000 superficial feetigreater than that of the previous winter, this increase is likely to counteract any shortage in the log production.

The late snow storms with the cold weather has made the hauling of logs more difficult than usual. The increase of wages this year will amount to 20 per cent., which must be added to a similar increase in the years 1902 and 1903. It is thus plainly evident that the stock of logs taken out this winter will cost considerably more than ever before.

UNITED STATES.

Veritable winter conditions have prevailed over much of the United States and the pine business has been seriously hampered thereby. The prevailing duffness has resulted in a slight weakening of

prices, a few timid persons having offered stock at lower quotations and thus estabushed a precedent for others to follow. The Southern Lumber Manufacturers' Association, at a meeting on February 23rd, adopted a new price list which more nearly corresponds to current selling values. Ordinary dimensions are reduced \$1 a thousand, flat grain flooring \$1.50 to \$3. and fencing and ceiling 50 cents to \$1, while prices of heavy joists and timbers remain unchanged. In white pine, low grade lumber is sought after to some extent and is firm in price, the higher grades coing in less demand and slightly weaker. Box grades are almost out of the market. having been bought up by both dealers and box factories. The heavy call for the lower grades from manufacturers has taken all the scoots offered, they having been sold in North Tonawanda as high as \$13 during the past week Eastern dealers say that they are doing much less busine a than at the corresponding time last year, this being attributed solely to weather conditions. Two important purchases of white pine are reported from Duluth, White, Rider & Frost, of North Tonawanda, having last week bought 7,000,000 feet of log run, and Pendennis White about 12,000,000 feet of similar stock. Reports from the white pine logging districts state that the input from Ashland eastward is likly to be less than was expected, but in the Duluth and upper Mississippi river districts the intended amount will probably be secured, though that amount will be about 25 per cent. less than last winter.

Hardwoods have shown more strength than pine. No weakness is apparent anywhere, but on the other hand the outlook has improved. The lower grades are very scarce and will be almost unobtainable before the new cut is ready for the market. White ash, elm and oak continue to lead in point of activity, but all kinds are meeting with a very satisfactory inquiry considering the conditions. Maple is perhaps in greater supply than any other hardwood, and there is some demoralization in the maple flooring trade.

GREAT BRITAIN.

British buyers of lumber are still pursuing a very cautious policy in respect to new business. Usually a large proportion of the season's requirements has been contracted for by the end of February, but this year very little stock has been arranged for and there does not seem to be much disposition to place contracts even now. The trade of the country is moderately good, although as in Canada unfavorable weather has rendered building operations difficult and the comparative tightness of money and the caution of investor, combine to make the arrangement of finance a task by no means easy for the speculative contractor. There has been a heavy decline in the deliveries of lumber from the London docks. Taking the first seven weeks of this year the falling off is 8,000,000 feet. The volume of business in the near future will depend upon, whether either shippers or importers are willing to make any concessions. It is argued that the prices asked by shippers are too high to encourage buying, but on the other hand the cost of production has been so great that asking prices cannot be materially resuced without wiping out the nar net profit.

Some business in pine deals has been done, chiefly for the better qualities, the lower grades being difficult to place. Contracts have also been made for a few cargoes of New Brunswick spruce on the basis of £6 5s. to £6 7s. 6d. per standard. The most favorable report comes from Cardiff, where it is said apruce deals are going rapidly into consumption, the stock held at that port being exceedingly light. At the last auction sale at London, spruce deals and battens were weaker, 3x9 second quality bringing £10 ton, and £10 per standard; third quality 3x9, £9 108; 3x7 second quality battens, £7 158, and third quality £7 50.

STOCKS AND PRICES.

Ritchie Bros., of Aylmer, Que., are reported to have purchased 340 square miles of timber limits near Mattawa, Ont.

D. R. Fraser & Company are asking for tenders for the rafting of about 2,000,000 ft. of logs from the bank of the river up about 50 miles to the mills at Edmonton, N.W.T.

The Rathbun Company's four camps in Haliburton County closed down last week owing to the excessive depth of snow and cold weather, which greatly regarded the work of cutting and hauling the logs. Two of the camps were located in Gooderham vicinity and two north of Wilberforce. As a result of the suspension of operations nearly a month earlier than usual, the cut will be much smaller than last year.

We quote as follows from the market report of Messrs. Clairmonte, Man & Co., of Barbadoes: "There has been no arrival with lumber during the fortnight. Our market is well stocked with white pine and spruce, but prices have been fairly maintained. The last sale of white pine for a cargo on the spot was at \$25 per thousand for merchantable and \$20 for second quality; spruce, \$21.17 for merchantable and \$17.17 for second quality. Last sales of Gaspe Long Cedsr shingles were at \$6.01; Cedar Laying, \$2.05 to \$2.07½."

Co. zerning white cedar products at Buffalo the American Lumberman says: There is a good demand for all cuts of white cedar, unless it be for shingles, which are rather undersold by Pacific coast products. The supply is not large. Sales of shingles at low prices are noted, but a jobber gives the following figures: Extra *A*, \$2.90; *A*, \$2.65; cedar butts, \$2.30, sound butts, \$1.40; culls, \$1.10. Ties, 55 cents for No. 1, 32 to 33 cents for No. 2; posts, 8-foot, 15 cents for 3 to 41/6inch tops; 18 cents for 41/2 to 6-inch tops; 20 cents for 6-inch; 22 cents for 7-inch. Ten-foot lengths, 20 cents for 3-inch tops; 22 cents for 4-inch; 25 cents for 5-inch; 30 cents for 6-inch. Twelve-foot lengths, 35 cents for 5-inch tops; 38 cents for 6-inch. It now looks as though the stock of cedar will be pretty well sold out by the opening of the lakes.

CANADIAN FORESTRY ASSOCIATION CONVENTION.

The fifth annual meeting of the Canadian Forestry Association will be neld in Toronto on the 10th and 11th of March next, commencing at 10 a.m. The fullowing papers have been promised "Systems of Administration of Timber Lands in Canada," by Aubrey White, Assistant Commissioner of Crown Lands, Toronto, Ont.; "Forest Management, by John Bertram, Toronto; "The Laurentides National Park," by W. C. J. Hall, Department of Lands, Forests and Fisher. ies, Quebec, P.Q.; "Forester, in Relation to Irrigation," by J. S. Dennis, Superintendent of Irrigation of the Canadian Pacific Railway Company, Calgary, Alberta, "Fores' Reproduction in Germany," by Or. A Harold Unwin (graduate of the Royal Saxonian Forest Academy, Tharandt, Germany), of the Dominion Forestry Branch, Ottawa; "Our Native Forest Tree 1 and Their Use in Ornamental Planting," by F. G. Tedd, Landscape Archi...ct, Montreal; "Farm Forestry," by Professor Hutt, of the Agricultural College, Guelph. There will also be an address on "Forestry Education" by President Loudon, of Toronto University. A banquet will be held at the King Edward Hotel on Thursday evening, at which speeches will be delivered by prominent public men.

The programme for the meeting is sufficiently attractive to warrant the attendance of all persons interested in the subject of forestry, and it is expected that there will be a full discussion of the many valuable papers to be presented. Any lumberman who can make it convenient to be present will no doubt find the proceedings very interesting and instructive.

The business sessions will be held in the Parliament Buildings, Queen's Park.

BRITISH COLUMBIA LETTER. (Correspondence of the Canada Lumbumman.)

VANCOUVER, B.C., February 24th, 1904. British Columbia conditions are little changed from last report. Logging is slightly more active, but in some localities is still conducted with difficulty owing to the heavy snow-falls. On the other hand, the snow has facilitated operations in East Kootenay and along the Kootenay River south of the lake, where many logs were left in the woods awaiting good sleighing. The Bonner's Ferry Lumber Company will have a total of 12,000,000 feet available for their mill at Bonner's Ferry. Mc-Arthur Bros., of Detroit, have located a camp at Curley Creek, East Kootenay, where they will take out 1,600,000 feet of square timber for shipment to Liverpool, England. It will be loamed at Katka or Bonner's Ferry. All the camps along the Crow's Nest line of railway are working full forces of men, and at many of the mills operations are kept up with double shifts. Places where a year ago there was nothing but unbroken forests are now busy centers of activity, with stores, hotels and dwellings. This is especially the case near Cranbrook, many large camps having been established in all directions from the town.

Two eplendid saw-mills will soon be in operation at Arrowhead, the owners being the Arrowhead Lumber Company and the Big Bend Lumber Company. It is estimated that there are 10,240,000,000 feet of lumber tributary to the Big Bend, almost all of which will be floated down the Columbia river to Revelstoke and Arrow Lake. Of course, it must be remembered that some of the timber lands in British Columbia contain as much as 50,000 feet to the acre.

The Empire Lumber Company, Limited, has been formed to take over the business of the Harbor Lumber Company, which recently bought out the Fred Robinson Lumber Company at Revelstoke, B. C. The Company is capitalized at \$3,000,000 and will operate some of the Adams Lake timber limits.

The Okanagan Lumber Company is putting in a plant capable of turning out 60,000 feet per day. It has an unlimited supply of logs on the Spallumcheen river, and in the Mabel lake country, and is becoming one of the large enterprises of the province. The mill is located at Enderby.

A. S. Farguharson and H. A. McGuire, who are engaged in the saw mill business at Frank, Alberta, have secured large timber limits on Boundary Creek, East Kootenay, where they will build a saw mill with a capacity of 35,000 feet per

W. H. Remington and J. G. Bullen, who have lumber interests on Prince of Wales Island up the coast, returned from Japan recently, whither they went to investigate the timber industry.

--A correspondent of the West Coest and Puget Sound Lumberman .nakes the following interesting calculations: A comparison of the figures paid in Winnipeg for British Columbia timber and that imported from the mills in Washington State to Manitoba and the Northwest reveals a striking difference between the cost of the American and Canadian products. In all the leading items the lumber imported is laid down at a much less con than that which comes from British Columbia, and a duty in some cases of over \$5 per thousand feet was paid. In fir dimensions and boards which come in free of duty, the American mills ship in this product at \$3 per thousand feet cheaper than that charged by the Canadian lumbermen. A difference really of \$5.87 guists between the cost of American and Canadian No. 1 and 2 edge grain for flooring. While the foreign product is actually only \$1.50 per thousand cheaper than that from British Columbia, the Americans have a duty of \$5.37 to meet on every 1,000 feet of this particular kind of lumber. And so it is with the other leading items. In regard to freight rates the Washington mills and the British Columbia mills have practically the same rates to meet in placing lumber in Winnipeg. The average freight per thousand on lumber is \$9.48, which to Winnipeg gives the C.P.R. 64-100 of a cent per thousand per mile in haulage. The average rate per ton per mile to Winnipeg is 54-100 of a cent. The Washington mills in shipping to Winnipeg have the same rate as the British Columbia mills over the Northern Pacific and Canadian Northern railways. When the American milts, however, ship to any point on the C.P.R. other than Winnipeg, they have to pay the local freight from the mills to the junction of the C.P.R. at

NEW BRUMSWICK LETTER.

(Correspondence of the CANALA LUMBERMAN)

At present writing the Lumber trade in this vicinity is very dull. Little shipping is being done to Great Britian and, owing to the inclemency or the weather during the last two months, shipping to American ports is practically at a standstill.

There seems to be a feeling of uncertainty in regard to the English market for deals during the coming season. Just now it is almost impossible to make any conjecture, with a probability of ultimately being borne out, as to what will develop in regard to demand and prices. Buyers do not seem anxious to make contracts at

the high prices which characterized last vear's purchases

Compared with this particular season of other years the stocks of English deals at this port are small; from 8 to 10 millions at the outside constituting the whole.

Owing to the general hang up or logs in the upper St. John districts in the spring of 1903, the mills in this vicinity and in most of the up river sections will be compelled to wait until the spring freshet has brought out the logs now stranded in the river (mostly above Grand Falls, a few million below) before they can begin to saw, as the stocks of logs of the local manufacturers(with one exception) are too small to warrant starting the mills. It will therefore mean the 15th or 20th of May before the first of the logs reach here and not before mid-June will there be any large amount of deals of 1904 manufacture

ready for shipment.

Reports from the Miramichi and Restigouche districts indicate larger cuts of logs, both cedar and spruce, than usual. The cut for the entire province, however, is estimated to be not above the average, for although an effort has been made the part of some operators to bring out more than usual, yet there has been a scarcity of men, and in addition to this the continually increasing distance over which logs have to be hauled makes it more and more difficult to get the work

In spite of the unusually heavy fall of snow and intense cold of the winter in some parts of the province, there is really no more snow in the woods than there was at this time last year, and prospects for a good season's driving are not any better or worse than in other seasons. If spring comes rapidly, successful driving may be

looked for, is the lumbermen are now almost ready for it and will be quite prepared when the time comes. The browing of logs is not yet completed, but another ten days will see this work finished in most



COOPERAGE CONDITIONS

Messrs. Sutherland, Innes & Company, of Chatham, Ont., report as follows:

"With regard to prices, the prices of timber are very high; in fact, they are nigher than they have ever been known to be before. It is a little doubtful yet if we will get enough for our product to pay for the time, money and hard work we are putting in. This depends greatly, how ever, on the demand. At present, prices are not in line for the future, with the cost of production. Consumers seem to have the idea that as soon as the new stock comes in the bottom is going to drop out of the market, but as the cu going to be so much lighter than was expected, we believe prices are going to keep somewhere near where they are at present.

"There is another thing consumers will have to take into consideration, and that is, that there are no stocks on hand, and it will take a long time to satisfy the demand.

" At some of our mills we are getting in fairly good stocks, but at the bulk of them stocks are light, very much lighter, indeed, than we had anticipated. It looks at present as if the supply would not be over 25 per cent. over that of last year, and we must be into consideration that at the beginning of last year there was a lot of stock carried over, while this year there is none.

"The outlook for business, we think, is much brighter than it was a year ago, and certainly much better than six months ago, as the output certainly will be 25 per cent. higher than that of last year, and the demand should certainly be equal to last year , as there are no stocks at all in the consumers' hauds and practically no stocks of manufactured material at any of the rills, so that material of all kinds should bring good prices this year."

ELM BOXES WANTED.

The Department of Trade and Commerce. Ottawa, is in receipt of the following communication from a large fi. m in Swansea, England. The name and address of the firm may be obtained from the publishers of the CANADA LUMBERMAN:

We are engaged in the tin plate trade here and buy good quantities of elm boxes for packing tin plates and block plates for export.

It has occurred to us that elm boards in the standard sizes might be imported from Canada, ready cut (to be nailed together on this side), at a figure which would admit of a large business being done.

The total output of the Welsh tin plate works is about 12,000,000 boxes per annum, and of this quantity a fair proportion would consist of standard sizes.


