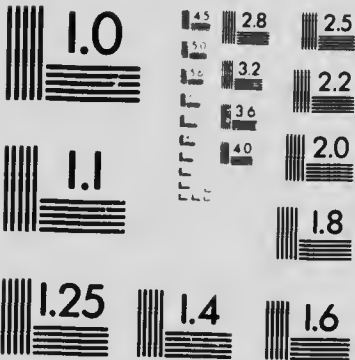

Miniature Railroad



One of the finest pieces of mechanism on the grounds is the tiny locomotive that pulls the miniature train around the grounds, and affords a great opportunity to get a good view of the park. The little engine is built after the style of the up-to-date locomotive that hauls the International Limited across the continent in four days, and is complete in every detail. The train runs on a small track that encircles the main part of the grounds, and if necessary six cars can be hauled at one time. The engine, though small, requires almost as much attention as the regular railroad engine, and the services of an expert engineer are necessary to run it. While the train runs at a fairly good clip, it does not run so fast but what the passengers have ample opportunity to see all the sights, and as the cars are open it makes a cool ride on a hot day or night.

The ride appeals especially to women and children, and a visit to Maple Leaf Park is not complete without having the conductor punch your ticket on the miniature limited.

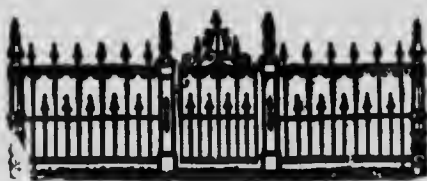

The Old Mill is a popular attraction in all the big pleasure parks in the United States, and no person should visit Maple Leaf Park without taking in the scenic ride.

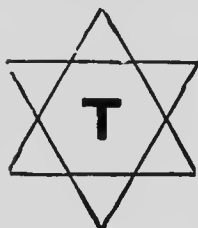

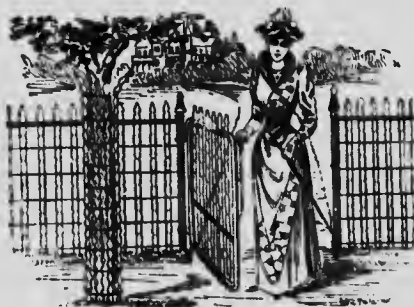

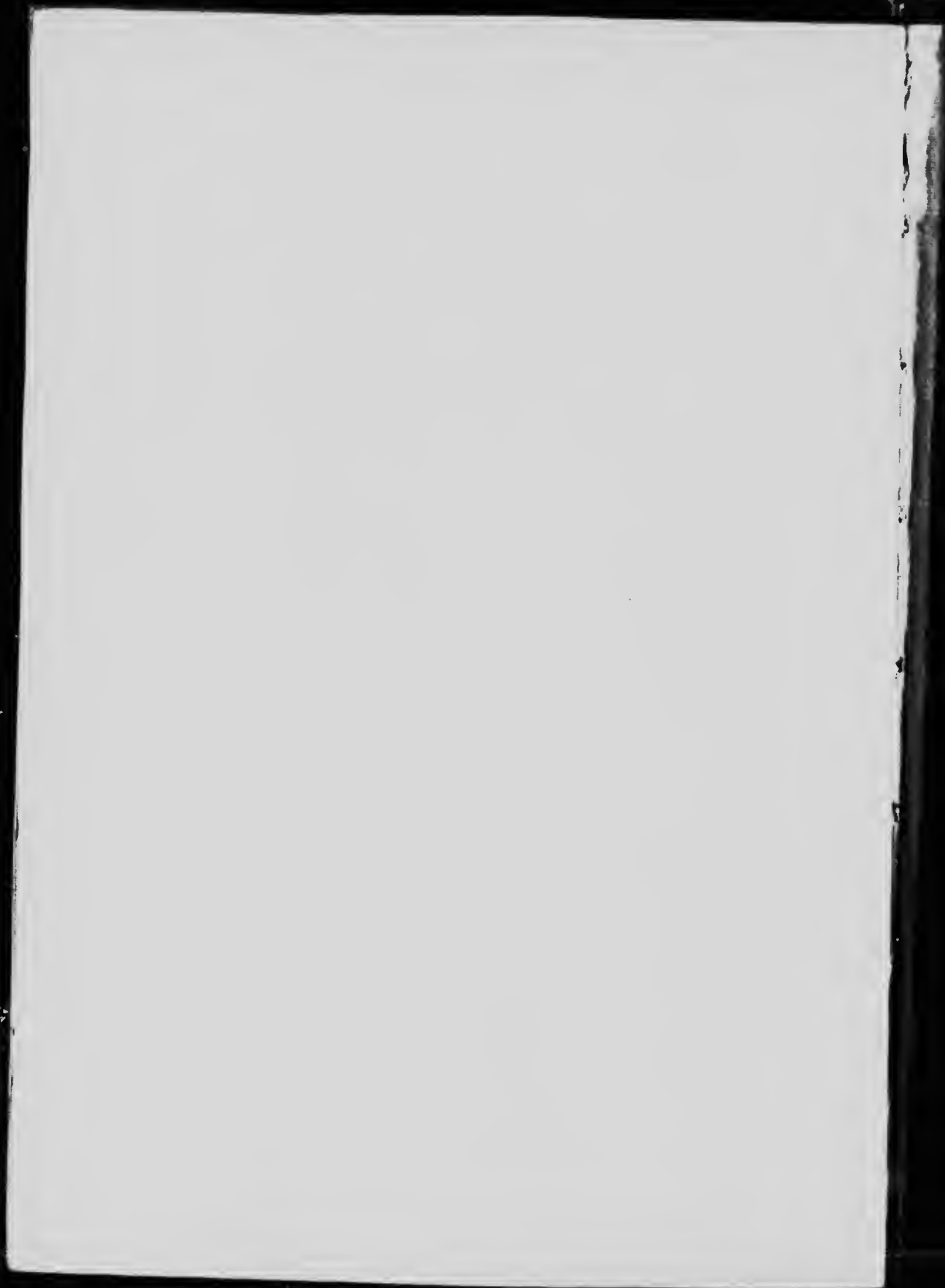
